Subject: Approval to Negotiate a Professional Services Contract for Independent Audit

Services

<u>Background</u>: Request for Proposal (RFP) No. A-13 for Independent Audit Services for the District Annual Financial Audit and Proposition 39 (Measure B) Bond Fund Audit was issued on March 14, 2013 to sixteen (16) companies. The Bond Fund Audit includes both the financial and the performance audit. A public notice was published and seven (7) companies responded. Following established procurement procedures detailed in RFP A-13, the top-ranked firms were interviewed by staff. In addition, the firms invited to interview were required to submit a fee proposal based on a scope of work supplied by the District.

The three firms for the interviews are as follows:

1.	Crowe Horwath LLP, Sacramento, California	\$215,400
2.	Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP, Pleasanton, California	\$233,150
3.	Gilbert Associates, Inc., Sacramento, California	\$235,500

A proposal to conduct both the Annual District Financial Audit and the Proposition 39 (Measure B) Bond Fund Audit was received. Selection of Crowe Horwath was based on the strength of the proposal, input from the references, price competitiveness, and interviews. With Board approval, the District will negotiate a Professional Services Contract with "not to exceed" budget of \$215,400 for a period of three (3) years with an option of one-year extensions for two additional years.

The Audit Subcommittee of the Board of Trustees met with Crowe Horwath LLP prior to the Board Meeting on April 16, 2013.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the negotiation of a Professional Services Contract for Independent Audit Services with Crowe Horwath LLP of Sacramento, CA in an amount not to exceed \$215,400. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute a contract on behalf of the District.

81365 Declaring the Intention to Lease Real Property Commonly known as 5020

Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, California

<u>Background</u> The District owns the property at 5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, California, consisting of twenty-five thousand (25,000) square feet of improved interior administrative/office space. The District has determined that there are no educational or administrative needs for the Property in the foreseeable future. Therefore, the District intends to make the Property available for lease to private lessees as set forth in Education Code §81365 on the terms set forth in this Resolution.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees adopts Resolution No. 13-1213 - Pursuant to Education Code Section 81365 Declaring the Intention to Lease Real Property Commonly known as 5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, California. The lease is "AS-IS, WHERE-AS" at the rate of one dollar and twenty cents (\$1.05) per square foot per month for a minimum term of five (5) years. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute a lease agreement on behalf of the District.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-1213

A RESOLUTION OF THE CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES PURSUANT TO EDUCATION CODE SECTION 81365 DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEASE REAL PROPERTY COMMONLY KNOWN AS 5020 FRANKLIN DRIVE, PLEASANTON, CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District ("District") is the owner of certain real property commonly known as 5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, CA, consisting of approximately 25,000 square feet of improved interior administrative/office space ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Property is currently not being used by the District, and the District has determined that there are no District educational or administrative needs for the Property in the foreseeable future; and

WHEREAS, the District intends to make the Property available for lease to private lessees as set forth in Education Code § 81365 on the terms set forth in this Resolution in an expedited manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board as follows:

- 1. The Board hereby declares its intention to lease, but not sell, the Property, in whole or in part, in accordance with applicable law governing the lease of property by a community college district.
- 2. The minimum terms and conditions upon which the Board proposes to lease the Property, in whole or in part, is \$1.05 per square foot per month, triple net at no expense to the District (the "Base Rent"). The lease term shall be a minimum of five (5) years. The Base Rent payment shall be increased each year by the United States Department of Labor Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, CA (1982-84 = 100), plus one percent (1%). In no event shall the Base Rent decrease. Base Rent shall be payable monthly on the first day of the month. The rent for any option term of five years or less shall increase at the same rate as the Base Rent. The rent for any option term in excess five years shall be at fair market value determined as of the commencement date of the option term by appraisal.
- 3. The lease is "AS-IS, WHERE-AS", without representations or warranties of any kind other than the District is the owner of the Property and this Resolution was adopted at a duly noticed meeting. Questions about current and future zoning of the Property, the suitability of the Property for any intended use and its development should be directed to the City of Pleasanton and other governmental agencies.

- 4. The Board will pay a real estate commission to any real estate broker instrumental in obtaining any proposal to lease accepted by the Board. Further to Education Code Section 81367, such commissions shall only be payable from the rent received by the District and shall be payable at the rate set forth in Exhibit A, attached to and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 5. If the District enters into a lease with a lessee for at least the minimum lease term specified in this Resolution, the successful lessee may utilize the existing structures on the Property, or make modifications at the lessee's sole cost and expense, if required for lessee's use of the Property. District shall have the right in its sole discretion to review and approve the plans for any remodeling of existing facilities or any replacement facilities. At the end of the lease period, any facilities on the Property shall become the property of the District at no cost to the District.
- 6. The Board hereby directs the Vice Chancellor of Business Services to post and publish the public notice of the availability of the Property in accordance with Education Code Section 81368.
- 7. Pursuant to Education Code Section 81372, the Board adopts a rule that the Vice Chancellor is delegated responsibility to open and review all sealed bids. All sealed bids must be received by the Vice Chancellor no later than 4:00 p.m. on May 10, 2013, in the office of the Vice Chancellor of Business Services located at 7600 Dublin Blvd., Dublin, CA, Third Floor. All sealed bids must be addressed to the attention of the Vice Chancellor and clearly identify the Property address.
- 8. The Board hereby establishes May 21, 2013 at 6:30 p.m. in the Board Room located at 7600 Dublin Blvd., Dublin, CA, Third Floor, as the date and time the bid or bids will be awarded, subject to the Board's right to reject all bids. The Board reserves the right to do its due diligence to ensure that any bidder is a responsible person or entity, able to fulfill the requirements of the lease. The award of any bid is expressly contingent on the District and the proposed lessee entering into a lease which is satisfactory to the District and approved by the Board.
- 9. Pursuant to Education Code Section 81375, the Board reserves the right to reject all bids if it deems this action to be in the best public interest.
- 10. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs 1-9 above, if the Board deems such action to be for the public interest, the Board may at any time withdraw the proposal to lease the Property.

- 11. A mandatory site inspection of the Property and meeting of interested bidders will be held on April 30, 2013, at 10:00 a.m., at the Property (5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, CA). Any proposer who fails to attend the site inspection and meeting of interested bidders shall not be qualified to submit a proposal.
- 12. Adoption of this resolution requires approval by a two-thirds vote of all members of the Board.

Drive, Pleasanton, California

<u>Background</u>: The Board concurrently adopted a resolution authorizing the District to lease the real property commonly known as 5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, CA, pursuant to the public bidding procedures in California Education Code §§ 81360. The Board directed the Vice Chancellor of Business Services to post and publish the public notice of the availability of the Property in accordance with Education Code Section 81368.

In the event the Board does not receive acceptable proposals meeting the minimum lease requirements specified in the Lease Resolution for the lease of all or a portion of the Property, the Board believes it is in the best interest of the District to retain the services of a real estate brokerage firm to market the Property directly to potential lessees without public bidding and minimum lease requirements.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees adopts Resolution No. 14-1213 - Authorizing the Filing of a Request to Waive Certain Provisions of the California Education Code Governing the Public Bidding Procedures for Lease of Property Located at 5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, California. It is further recommended that the Board direct the Vice Chancellor of Business Services to submit the waiver request with the Board of Governors in accordance with Education Code Sections 81250 *et seq*.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-1213

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CHABOT-LAS POSITAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A REQUEST TO WAIVE CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE CALIFORNIA EDUCATION CODE GOVERNING THE PUBLIC BIDDING PROCEDURES FOR LEASE OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5020 FRANKLIN DRIVE, PLEASANTON, CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, the District is the owner of certain real property commonly known as 5020 Franklin Drive, Pleasanton, California consisting of approximately 25,000 square feet of improved interior space ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, by resolution of the Board of Trustees ("Board") adopted concurrently herewith, the Board authorized the lease of the Property (the "Lease Resolution") pursuant to the public bidding procedures in California Education Code §§ 81360 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, in the event the Board does not receive acceptable proposals meeting the minimum lease requirements specified in the Lease Resolution for the lease of all or a portion of the Property, the Board believes it is in the best interest of the District to retain the services of a real estate brokerage firm to market the Property directly to potential lessees without public bidding and minimum lease requirements; and

WHEREAS, after considering public comments at the public hearing at which this resolution was adopted, the Board further believes that leasing the Property, in whole or in part, through the efforts of a real estate broker firm without the requirement of public bidding and minimum lease terms is in the best interest of the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board as follows:

- 1. The Board authorizes the filing of a request with the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges to waive certain provisions of the Education Code substantially in the form of Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The specific purpose and reason for waiver of each of the applicable Education Code sections are also set forth in Exhibit A.
- 2. The Board hereby directs the Vice Chancellor of Business Services to submit the waiver request with the Board of Governors in accordance with Education Code Sections 81250 *et seq*.

EXHIBIT A

(Education Code Provisions to be Waived and Statement of Purpose)

Education Code Section 81365. Before ordering the sale or lease of any property the governing board, in a regular open meeting, by two-thirds vote of all its members, shall adopt a resolution, declaring its intention to sell or lease the property, as the case may be. The resolution shall describe the property proposed to be sold or leased in such manner as to identify it. and shall specify the minimum price or rental and the terms upon which it will be sold or leased and the commission or rate thereof, if any, which the board will pay to a licensed real estate broker out of the minimum price or rental. The resolution shall fix a time not less than three weeks thereafter for a public meeting of the governing board to be held at its regular place of meeting, at which sealed proposals to purchase or lease will be received and considered.

If the Board is unsuccessful in leasing the Property under the Lease Resolution, which requires public bidding and minimum lease terms, waiver of this portion of Section 81365 would allow the Board to avoid specifying a minimum bid at a public meeting and would allow the Board to set their own terms and conditions and remove references to minimum bids and actions to be taken with "sealed" bids. The Board may instead work with a real estate broker to develop a strategic plan for advertising and marketing of the Property in order to solicit proposals from potential buyers interested in the Property.

Education Code Section 81370.

- (a) At the time and place fixed in the resolution for the meeting of the governing body, all sealed proposals that have been received shall, in public session, be opened, examined, and declared by the board. Except as provided in subdivision (b), of the proposals submitted that conform to all terms and conditions specified in the resolution of intention to sell or to lease and that are made by responsible bidders, the sealed proposal that is the highest, after deducting therefrom the commission, if any, to be paid a licensed real estate broker in connection therewith, shall be finally accepted, unless the board rejects all of these bid [ADD: The governing body may accept the proposal that the governing body determines is in the best interest of the District.]
- (b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), the governing board of any community college district may apply to the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges for a waiver of the requirement that the governing board accept the highest responsible bid for the sale or lease of real property. The board of governors may grant a waiver pursuant to this subdivision if it determines that the waiver is in the best interests of the community college district.

This waiver will allow the Board the greatest flexibility in evaluating proposals. The Board at some point in the future may decide to take possession of the Property for educational or administrative purposes. In the event proposed tenant's contemplate alterations or improvements to the Property, the Board will have flexibility to consider such alterations and improvements in evaluating and awarding proposals.

<u>Education Code Section 81374</u>. The final acceptance by the governing body may be made either at the same session or at any adjourned session of the same meeting held within the 10 days 30 days next-following.

The Board sets its meeting calendar at the start of each calendar year. This modification would allow the Board to adjourn to the next regularly scheduled meeting rather than a special meeting. Public participation is likely to increase if the adjourned meeting is held at a regularly scheduled meeting.

Adoption of Resolution No. 16-1213—Authorizing the Election to Increase

Retention for Parking Lots F/G/H/J Improvements at Chabot College, in

accordance with Public Contract Code Section 7201

<u>Background:</u> On October 9, 2011, Senate Bill ("SB") 293 was signed into law restricting retention amounts in public construction contracts from exceeding five percent (5%) of the total contract price. This new law is found in Public Contract Code section 7201 and applies to all contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2012 and shall remain in effect until January 1, 2016.

Unless the awarding authority makes a finding in accordance with PCC 7201(b)(4) that retention proceeds on a project may exceed 5% on specific projects where, before putting a project out to bid, (1) the Board of Trustees approves a finding that the proposed project is "substantially complex" and requires a retention amount greater than 5%; and (2) the district includes both the finding and the designated retention amount set by the Board of Trustees in the bid documents put out by the district.

It is requested that the Board of Trustees makes a finding that the project known as Parking Lots F/G/H/J at Chabot College is substantially complex and requires a retention in the amount of 10% of the total contract price.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees adopts the proposed Resolution No. 16-1213 Authorizing the Election to Increase Retention for Parking Lots F/G/H/J Improvements at Chabot College, in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 7201.

Approval to Renew - County of Solano Standard Contract No. 00591-14,

District-Economic Development

<u>Background:</u> Solano County's Health and Social Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide training to people who work with the out of home children and youth of Solano County since 2003-04. The County has requested that we continue to provide training services for the 2013-14 fiscal year.

As with the prior contracts, we will be working closely with our partners, A Better Way, Alternative Family Services, and Seneca Center, to deliver training to their own staff as well as to other Solano County community-based foster- and adoptive-care children caretakers. Additionally, the County's Child Welfare Services incorporates training for their staff as part of this contract. The contract is funded through Title IV-E federal funds, and is in the amount of \$752,055.00.

The contract states that Solano County will pay the District up to \$752,055 for training services provided. This contract has a term of twelve months (July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014). The contract requires an in-kind match, which is the District's responsibility, which consists of the value of staffing, overhead, and facilities costs.
