Approval of Agreement for College and Career Access Pathways Partnership Agreement for Dual Enrollment between New Haven Unified School District and Chabot Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College

Background: The purpose of this College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership Agreement is to provide high school students in the New Haven Unified School District an opportunity to earn early college credit at Chabot College while enrolled in high school. The intent is to offer provisions of AB 288 and AB 30 (Ed Code 76004) for high school students "who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education". The goals are: a.) to develop seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer b.) improve high school graduation rates c.) assist high school pupils to achieve college and career readiness d.)to serve "underachieving students", those from groups underrepresented in postsecondary education, those who are seeking advanced studies while in high school, and those seeking a career technical education credential or certificate.

These students who earn college credit are more likely to earn high school diplomas, to enroll in community college and four-year colleges, to attend post-secondary education on a full-time basis, and to complete degrees in those institutions than students without these experiences.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed College and Career Access Pathway Partnership Agreement for Dual Enrollment between New Haven Unified School District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College, effective December 1, 2021. It is further recommended that the Board Authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the Agreement on behalf of the District.

Background: The Foundation for California Community Colleges is the official foundation to the California Community College Board of Governors and Chancellor's Office. The Foundation's mission is to benefit, support, and enhance the missions of the California Community College system. The Foundation is a statewide nonprofit with over 15 years of experience in developing, implementing, and administering large-scale programs, campaigns, and award-winning websites.

Las Positas College is one of 20 California Community Colleges selected to participate this year in the California Guided Pathways Demonstration Project, Cohort 2.0. The mission of Guided Pathways at LPC is to ensure equity and enhance the college experience and career preparation for all students. The Foundation for California Community Colleges shall provide to Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College, coaching, support, and consultation services to engage the college in California Guided Pathways 2.0 efforts that complement the Vision for Success as set forth in the Scope of Work and Deliverables attached as Exhibit "A". The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College agrees to work closely with the Foundation for California Community Colleges staff and its partners in the performance of services and shall be available to the Foundation's staff and its partners at all reasonable times.

The period of this agreement is from October 1, 2021 to October 1, 2024 or until all funds due to the Foundation under this agreement have been paid and all terms and conditions have been satisfied. The total fee to be paid to the Foundation for the services shall not exceed \$30,000.00.

Subject: Approval of Subrecipient Commitment for Joint Project with California State University, East Bay and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Entitled the East Bay, College Agile Network Funded by the ECMC Foundation

<u>Background:</u> For the past three years, the leadership at California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) has been in conversation with the leadership of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) to develop stronger connections and programs. The objective has been to seek ways that CSUEB and CLPCCD can leverage and strengthen existing relationships and initiatives across systems in order to identify and remove barriers that impede student success. A proposal was developed, and submitted to the ECMC Foundation, to link our campuses in a support network that is adaptive to student educational needs and creates seamless pathways designed to meet their educational goals. This model regional partnership would include cross enrollment, reverse transfers, shared support systems, and articulated pathways so that students can complete degrees and certificates more efficiently.

The ECMC Foundation grant was made to CSUEB, with CLPCCD as a recipient of funds beginning November 1, 2021 through March 31, 2023, for a total of \$305,000 for East Bay College Agile Network (East Bay CAN) activities.

<u>Subject:</u> Acceptance of Grant Award – United Way Bay Area SparkPoint Grant for the purpose of operating and leading a SparkPoint Center at Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College officially launched the SparkPoint program in February 2021 with support of a start-up grant from United Way Bay Area. This additional grant of \$30,000 will provide operational funds to continue support the development of the Chabot College SparkPoint Center as outlined below.

SparkPoint Centers agree to the following FY22 model, principles, and priorities:

- Support families with resources and financial coaching during the COVID-19 crisis and post-crisis to create a path towards long-term financial prosperity.
- Provide services or referrals to services that meet basic needs including food security, childcare, housing, rental assistance, mental health support, and other needs as requested.
- Provide integrated services to increase income, build/repair credit, manage debt, and build savings, plus additional services to meet clients where they are.
- Provide financial coaching, career coaching, and family-centered coaching on-site and/or virtually. Take a family-centered approach, operating with the cornerstone of the coaching model, that clients are creative, resourceful, and whole.
- Measure client outcomes toward financial wellness.
- Commit to working with clients during a crisis period and over 2-3 years, or as long as necessary to achieve their goals.
- Create a welcoming and respectful environment for clients, promoting equity and maintaining a culture of trust, respect, caring, and openness.
- Provide access to quality workforce training programs that result in skills, certificates, or degrees that lead to a career that pays a living wage.
- Hold a regularly scheduled steering or advisory committee meeting, made up of leaders of partner agencies.
- Maintain client confidentiality by following all regulations regarding client access, staff access, consent to release information, storage, and disposal of files.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approve the proposed United Way Bay Area grant of \$30,000 the period of July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement, and any amendments, on behalf of the District.
