### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The negotiated agreement with Service Employees International Union (SEIU), Local 1021 provides:

Effective July 1, 2022, an eleven percent (11%) across the board salary increase will be provided to all bargaining unit members.

Effective July 1, 2023, a three percent (3%) across the board salary increase will be provided to all bargaining unit members. Effective July 1, 2023 each salary range in the Classified Salary Schedule A will include a new salary Step 6

which provides a three percent (3%) upward adjustment from Step 5 for unit members. Members that have served their one-year anniversary at step 5 shall advance to step 6 effective July 1, 2023.

Effective July 1, 2024, a two percent (2%) across the board salary increase will be provided to all bargaining unit members. If the statutory COLA is two and a half percent (2.5%) or greater in the fiscal year 2024-25, the parties agree to meet and confer on potential enhancements to the two percent (2%) increase.

Regular classified employees must be employed by the District at the time that pay increases are actually paid in order to be eligible for the increase.

For Temporary On-Call employees, the initial salary increase is effective beginning in January 2023, and said employees must be employed by the District at the time that pay increases are actually paid in order to be eligible for the increase.

Effective 2023, Cesar Chavez Day will be added and observed as a floating holiday for eligible and regular Classified, Confidential and Supervisory employees.

Fiscal Implications: These actions will result in salary schedule adjustments of employees as noted above. This action will also add one additional floating holiday for eligible employees.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the following salary schedule adjustments for Classified (Regular, Temporary On-Call, Supervisory, and Confidential) employees:

- Eleven (11) percent, retroactive to July 1, 2022 for Regular employees (SEIU, Supervisory, and Confidential)
- Eleven (11) percent, effective January 1, 2023 for Temporary On-Call employees
- Three (3) percent and for Regular employees, implementation of new salary Step 6, effective July 1, 2023
- Two (2) percent, effective July 1, 2024. If the statutory COLA is two and a half percent (2.5%) or greater in the fiscal year 2024-25, the parties agree to meet and confer (union), or discuss (non union) potential enhancements to the two percent (2%) increase.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The purpose of the MOU between East Bay Community Law Center (EBCLC) and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District is to continue providing immigration services free of cost for Chabot College students. The previous MOU was approved in early 2020; the updated MOU is being submitted as the legal services have since expanded from the California Community College Chancellor's Office to offer immigration services to all California Community Colleges. Thus, some of the MOU language has changed. The services will continue to be at no cost to Chabot-Las Positas Community College District.

Since our partnership, many Chabot College students have been able to access free immigration consultations, renew DACA applications, become permanent residents of the US, granted Visas and granted advanced parole. It is pivotal that our students are able to continue receiving services that have already positively impacted our students.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Chabot College was awarded the U.S. Department of Education, TRIO Talent Search Program grant, approved as item 4.2 during the September 14, 2021 Board meeting.

The Chabot College TRIO Educational Talent Search programs aims to support students in middle and high schools, particularly students from low-income and first-generation college-bound backgrounds to become college-ready and attend postsecondary institutions.

This MOU specifies the expectations between Chabot College and San Lorenzo Unified School District – on behalf of Edendale Middle School and San Lorenzo High School – to carry out services through the Chabot College TRIO Educational Talent Search Program.

The agreement is for the period of June 1, 2022 through August 31, 2027.

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Chabot College was awarded the Math, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. This amendment increases the overall funding amount and extends the duration of the original MESA grant approved as board item 4.8 on January 18, 2022.

The MESA program model provides academic and support services for economically and educationally disadvantaged students majoring in calculus-based science, technology, engineering, and/or mathematics (STEM) fields who seek to transfer to a four-year institution to complete a baccalaureate degree. The Chabot MESA Program includes frequent, sustained, and prolonged academic and student support services, including case management by the MESA Counselor. The Chabot MESA Program will benefit all Chabot students, but will target underrepresented minorities in STEM, in particular Latinx, African-American/Black, and Pacific Islander students. Considering the student population at Chabot, the program will also focus on serving low-income, first-generation students majoring in STEM fields.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$1,752,397 with the effective dates of October 1, 2021 through July 31, 2027. Funding amounts for the grant by year are as follows. The amounts are subject to annual renewal based upon performance.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The purpose of this MOU is to update the partnership between Chabot College, Alameda County Sheriff’s Office (ACSO), and Five Keys Schools and Programs (Five Keys). This collaboration aims to meet the educational needs of inmates at Santa Rita Jail by making college-level courses accessible, including CSU/US transferable, general education courses, and degree/certificate courses.

This MOU further establishes the operational framework for Chabot College to offer college courses to the inmates housed in Santa Rita Jail, run by the ACSO. Five Keys currently operates all educational programming in the jail and will provide logistical support to ensure the smooth operations of Chabot College classes.

The purpose of this trip is to engage our students at the highest caliber of forensics competition across the globe. We believe the educational and cultural benefits that come from participation in international competition far outweigh the educational opportunities provided by similar tournaments held in the Bay Area. Over the years, numerous LPC competitors have changed their majors and career plans because of their participation at this tournament. Typically, the best Forensics Programs from the United States attend this event so it is also an opportunity for Las Positas College to compete with the top speech and debate institutions in the world. Because of this tournament, we have had students recruited to some of the best four-year forensics institutions in the country. The LPC Forensics Team has a tremendous history of success at this event. Over the years, LPC has produced nine International Champions. In 2007 and 2016, LPC finished as the top-ranked two-year institution at the tournament, and we have finished in the top-six overall at the competition on nine different occasions.

Board Policies 4300 (Field Trips) and 4027 (Travel Abroad Program), administrative rules and procedures, and materials from our insurance broker have been reviewed. The District is in compliance with each of these and has secured all necessary and required waivers.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been awarded a grant by the State of California's Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) through its Health Professions Pathways Program (HPPP). CLPCCD will be the lead agency in the development of a pipeline of Behavioral Health workers. CLPCCD's Economic Development and Contract Education (EDCE) department will serve as the grant manager and the Local Education Agency (LEA) of the two behavioral health apprenticeship programs.

In an effort to expand the number of apprentices in California, state funding has been provided to encourage and support the creation of apprenticeship programs in industries outside the traditional construction trades. One funding stream is the California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI): New and Innovative Grant - Apprenticeship Programs. Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Department of Economic Development and Contract Education (EDCE) was awarded a CAI grant for the Robert Half Cybersecurity Workforce and Innovation Collaborative Program for a new Informational Security Analyst Apprenticeship Program.
