

Chabot College NIH Bridges to the Baccalaureate April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2016

Statement of Work

Chabot NIH Bridges to the Baccalaureate will target two student populations: new and continuing Chabot students in key Bridges majors. Chabot will also target two specific continuing student populations, pre-nursing/allied health students and those in specific introductory major-specific courses and allied health pathways.

Proposed Activities:

Chabot, in collaboration with UC Berkeley Transfer Alliance Project (TAP), will conduct several events to recruit students and help students learn about and plan for pursuing research careers in the biomedical and behavioral sciences. New, incoming students and continuing students in targeted courses and areas will be targeted for participation.

Science and Research Career Workshops: The Chabot Site Coordinator and Chabot faculty will work with UCB TAP to develop career workshops that inform students of the multitude of career options in the biological and biomedical transfer/career pathway.

Subject-area Case Management: Faculty Instructors are matched with cohorts of Bridges students according to subject area. Faculty monitor their progress and, working with the Chabot Site Coordinator and UCB TAP, match students with research internship opportunities. Faculty will also work with graduate student instructors to design lab practicum experiences to support student development of research skills. These faculty will ensure that Bridges students are academically prepared for the rigors of research internships and transfer coursework.

Guided Lab Practicum: Chabot Learning Assistants will provide structured support in a lab/research setting to help students in their current courses and prepare for summer research internship experiences.

By expanding the knowledge students have about possible research careers and supporting students in their pursuit of these career goals, students will persist in their courses longer, improve their academic standing and transfer to a baccalaureate-granting institution

Budget Narrative: Chabot College

Project Director at Chabot College at the F-hour rate = \$11,589 (Benefits @ 8%)

Faculty Instructors: 2 faculty instructors at Chabot to conduct subject-specific case management to monitor student progress, and develop practicum and workshops in collaboration with the campus Project Coordinators to cover Biology and Chemistry. 2 instructors stipends @ \$5,600 = \$11,200

Learning Assistants: 2 undergraduate students at Chabot to provide structured support in lab/research settings to help students in their current courses and prepare for summer research internship experiences. 2 undergraduate students @ \$1,500 = \$3,000 (Benefits at 2%)

Institutional Research: Provides support to community college Institutional Research Office for data tracking and reporting on program participants. (\$1,750)

Indirect Costs: \$2,282
