



A comprehensive approach to improving the educational outcomes and overall life prospects of low income children and their families




To create a comprehensive pipeline of educational and community supports to make certain that all students graduate college, enter a career and are prepared to live to their full potential

#### **Chabot HPN Goals**

- Develop seamless transitions from High School to College and other entry points
- Implement strategies and support efforts to ensure that students enter Chabot academically-prepared and collegeready
- Strengthen collaborative relationships with community and educational partners
- Reduce duplication of services among partners
- Support systemic changes that continue building towards Chabot's vision of an educational leader

## Chabot HPN Strategies Implemented in Year 2

- Math and ELA Curriculum Alignment
  - Integration, use, and/or adoption of the CSUEB Early Assessment Program (EAP) scores
  - Collaboration with HUSD and high school teachers to review and align curriculum
- Summer Youth Sports Program and STEM
  - 5-week summer sports program that offers a STEM class for youth ages 10-16
  - Increased number of HPN students who participated from 30 (3 residents) to 60 (17 residents)
  - Hired HUSD teachers to teach courses and support students in transition

## Chabot HPN Strategies (cont)

- Expanded Early Decision and HPN First Year Experience
  - Additional hands-on workshops for test prep,
    college applications, financial aid support, and more
  - HPN Winter Retreat: January 15-17, 2014
  - Students currently enrolled in PSCN 20
- HPN Mentor Program
  - Collaboration w/Striving Black Brother's Coalition (SBBC)
  - Students meet weekly at Chabot College
  - Improved attendance, decreased number of behavioral incidents, and increased grades

#### Chabot HPN Strategies (cont)

- Pipeline to College Program (P2C)
  - Building a college-going culture at the HPN Target Middle and High Schools (AVID and TRIO)
  - Case-management Model with a wrap-around support system
    - Farin Ealy: Winton and Chavez Middle Schools
    - Alan David: Tennyson and Hayward High Schools
  - Increasing capacity and reaching more students
    - 12-13AY: 258 youth from the target schools were served (ETS)
    - P2C will serve an additional 300 students among the 4 target middle and high schools
  - Alignment with HUSD strategies
