Subject: Student Health Fee Increase

BACKGROUND:

2016, over 600 students responded that there's a big need to continue implementing programs that impact their academic performances. While the governing board of community college district has recently increased the student health fee to \$20 (Fall and Spring) and \$17 (Summer), there hasn't been an increase of the Student Health Center fees in more than 7 years, since 2009

The student health center conducted the National College Health Assessment Survey last Fall

(\$17 fall and spring semester, and \$15 for summer). The increased fee will help prevent the

elimination or reduction of services at the health center while continuing to add to its offerings in

the areas of mental health services, wellness/health promotion and outreach events.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Approval to increase the student health fee from \$17 to \$20 for Fall and Spring Semester, from \$15 for Summer semester for School year 2017-2018.

The proposed increase in the student health fee:

- Is necessary to maintain current level of services

- Without a fee increase, we will have to reduce or eliminate some services. Wait time for

appointments will increase

- To continue providing mental health services from a preventive and educational approach.
- On-campus health services provide the best opportunity for timely intervention with contagious illness and other public health concerns.

BACKGROUND:

Legislative Director Collier has drafted resolutions for both SSCC parking access in staff lots as well as a statement of unity between all three campus Senates. The SSCC may amend the resolutions prior to adoption.

Joint Unity Statement

Whereas, the Student Senate's mission is to pursue policies that will improve student access, promote student success, engage and empower local student leaders, and enrich the collegiate experience for all California community college students, it also stands as an advocate for just political engagement for all constituents (student's, faculty and or staff) who reside on said campus,

Whereas, faculty, staff, administration and the student body have come to a common consensus that the college varies in different beliefs, political stances and philosophies – yet each of those individuals or groups must be recognized without hindering their natural rights ordained to them by our amendments and policies. BP 3900 states that students, employees and members of the public shall be free to exercise their rights of free expression, subject to the requirements of this policy,

Whereas, in Article 23 of Academic Freedom states that the District and Faculty are dedicated to maintaining a climate of freedom of expression and academic freedom, which encourages the sharing and cultivation of a wide variety of viewpoints. Thus, providing a safe environment for all to exercise their rights without other persons bias' infringing upon them must be one of the colleges main priorities,

Whereas, the acts of hate violence, obscene language or any push for advocacy that directs towards lawless action is not supported and thus also prohibited in all accounts, perpetrators will be disciplined accordingly unless their speech is constitutionally protected.

Resolved, the college as a whole will advocate for the freedoms of speech/freedoms of expression, provide a safe environments(s) and show support in others beliefs without bias.
