EDCE Focus Areas & Definitions

- OSHA Training Center: Provide federal- and stateapproved safety trainings to individuals, corporations a organizations

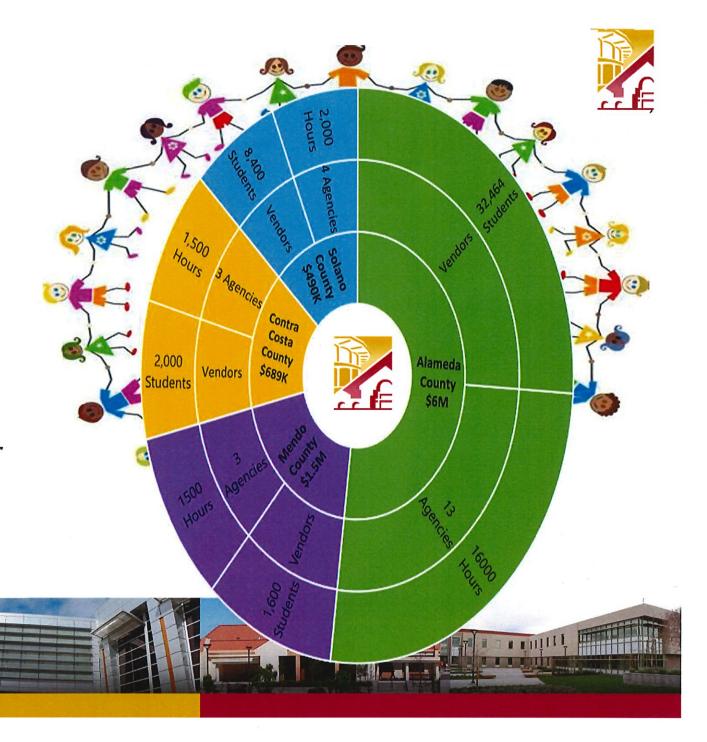

- Apprenticeship Programs: Assist apprenticeship programs start new programs and administer them in partnership with the colleges.
- Fiscal Agency Programs: Serve as the contractual and financial program manager of large, statewide grants for the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office.
- Intra-District Collaborations: Partner with colleges and district services to maximize benefits and serve our students and our communities.

- 2,480 students trained
- \$1.35 million revenue
- 15 industry/community education events
- 373 students Pacific Coast Safety Fest
- 7 featured articles in industry publications
