Scope of Work: East Bay College Agile Network Implementation at Chabot-Las Positas Community College District

CLPCCD's Activities include but are not limited to participation in and follow-up regarding the monthly Steering Committee meetings and four intersegmental working groups. Working group team member representatives (counselors, librarians and instructional faculty, managers, classified professionals) from each campus are to engage based on their expertise and specialization. The purpose of these teams is to work through the complexities of implementing the East Bay College Agile Network initiative on the three campuses.

- Pathways Working Group: This team is charged with mapping CLPCCD-CSUEB degree pathways, further articulations of ADTs to Baccalaureate degrees, and developing vertical and reverse transfer roadmaps (guided pathways) through curriculum connections between campuses.
- Systems and Support Working Group: This team is focused on designing a seamless transfer system including cross enrollment, co-curricular linkages, pro-active outreach to students with intent to transfer.
- Technology and Data Working Group: This team is charged with the design and implementation of the analytics instruction and data sharing among the CLPCCD campuses in conjunction w/ CSUEB.
- Communications and PR Working Group: This team is charged with developing a messaging campaign to educate CLPCCD students and the CLPCCD workforce of the innovations coming out of the EBCAN.

Deliverables from CLPCCD:

- **Pathways**: CLPCCD ADT pathways aligned to CSUEB intersegmental faculty meetings across top ADTs, information on classes to take, support available in planning, and ways to connect with for help with various processes, questions, or assistance.
- **Systems and support**: Create and implement a student-centered transfer pathway design for EBCAN bound transfer students at CLPCCD in partnership with CSUEB.
- **Technology**: Identify data and infrastructure solutions that improve the student experience and reduce manual processes, so that current CLPCCD students as prospective CSUEB students benefit from knowing time to transfer and early records are shareable between CLPCCD and CSUEB.
- **Communications/PR**: Collaboration using a communications consultant and CSUEB to gather qualitative (primary and secondary) market research that informs short and long term strategies for developing and implementing communications and marketing programs in support of EBCAN.
