Rancho Santiago Community College District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The Rancho Santiago Community College District has a grant funded through State funds (Entrepreneurship Career Pathways Project 10-172-055) that authorizes them to award grants through sub-agreements with different colleges throughout the State for "Faculty Entrepreneurship Projects."

This grant supports Chabot College's Entrepreneurship Program, allowing it to improve entrepreneurship learning and to stimulate and support self-employment and successful business management. No matching funds are required.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$15,000 for the period July 25, 2011 through June 15, 2012.

Management Services with the Tri-Valley Community Foundation, Las

Positas College

Background: The Tri-Valley Community Foundation (TVCF) has offered Las Positas College a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to provide educational and case management services to 18 at-risk youths between 18 and 21 years of age. This grant was previously used to support the College Foundations Semester. The grant is now being redirected to provide an introduction to Career and Technical Education Pathways and support for at-risk youth. The program will include bi-monthly meetings to help students explore CTE options and provide support services such as learning assessments, counseling support, learning cohorts, books/supplies support, career testing and case management to support student success.

TVCF will provide funding amounting to \$57,000 for Las Positas College "to provide Career and Technical Education opportunities in a learning cohort model" for the service period of of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Tri-Valley Community Foundation (TVCF) Memorandum of Agreement to fund \$57,000 to Las Positas College to provide educational and case management services for at-risk youths aged 18-21 years of age for the service period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the Memorandum of Agreement documents on behalf of the District.

Group for California Community Colleges to Conduct the Cost Effective

Student Support Study, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College would like to work with The Research and Planning Group for California Community Colleges (RP Group) to investigate how student support, both inside and outside the classroom, can be delivered in a cost-effective manner so that community colleges can narrow the achievement gap for Latino and African-American students and enable more students to achieve transfer, a degree and/or certificate. The study will begin October 1, 2011 and conclude on August 31, 2013. This study will be at no cost to Las Positas College. The RP Group will provide \$1,000 to Las Positas College for the staff time it takes to provide student data.

Las Positas College's responsibilities include providing the RP Group with data that will be used to contact students in order to request their participation in an online or telephone survey and allowing access to faculty, staff and administrators in order to discuss the results from the student survey.
