<u>Background</u>: The Chabot College Nursing Program applied for and was awarded a Nursing Education Program Grant from California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO). The College was officially notified that it has been awarded funding under Grant Agreement No. 10-107-004 for Enrollment Growth and Retention – Assessment, Retention Allocation for Associate Degree (ADN)/ Registered Nurse (RN) Programs on August 24, 2011.

Grant funding shall be used exclusively to expand the ADN Program by providing assessment, remediation and retention activities to assist students to succeed in the nursing program and to prepare those students to successfully complete the National Council Licensure Examination to become eligible for licensure as a registered nurse.

The grant is in the amount of \$203,687 for the period June 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

Approval for Travel Study Program-"Faces of Cuba" and Agreement with Global

Exchange Reality Tours, Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> In accordance with Board Policy 6217, Travel Study Programs, a course has been designed that involves travel and studies abroad. "Faces of Cuba" travel study has been immensely popular. This course will be offered during Spring Break, April 5 through April 5, 2012 as a one (1) unit course. The History discipline supports and affirms the importance of travel studies in Program Reviews.

The cost per participant for the Cuban travel studies program is approximately \$2,750.00, based on a minimum of 20-25 participants, excluding airfare. The program includes accommodations, guides, ground transportation, activities and meals. A deposit of \$1,000 is required with application and final payment due 45 days in advance of travel.

Course studies examining Cuba are relative to the disciplines of history, anthropology and archaeology. Participants will gather information through direct and participatory observation. Moreover, the contemporary issues facing the United States today surrounding immigration and international relations are extremely relevant for our students and the communities we serve.

The Board of Trustees previously approved travel agreements with Global Exchange Reality Tours to Cuba on May 17, 2011 under item 4.4, Mexico on February 19, 2008 under item 4.3 and 4.4, February 24, 2004 under item 4.5 and 4.6, August 19, 2003 under item 4.1, October 15, 2002 under item 4.7, September 18, 2001 under item 4.3, March 20, 2001 under item 4.4 and August 15, 2000 under item 4.2.

<u>Background:</u> Chabot College has received a program renewal for the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) 2011-2012 Instructional Agreement No. 11-12-4024 with the Yosemite Community College District. The program allows the College to generate up to 700 units of college credit by enrolling students in courses required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to obtain a new or renew a currently held Child Development Permit. As these courses do not generate state apportionment, the agreement provides the College with \$25 per enrolled unit of coursework, not to exceed a total of \$17,500.

The agreement renewal is for the period September 1, 2011, through June 30, 2012.

The College has been continuously involved with the CDTC and has received an annual renewal since 1993.

Approval of Cooperative Agreement Renewal—The Regents of the University

of California, Puente Project No. 11-CCC Puente-04, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The mission of the Puente Project is to increase the number of educationally underrepresented students who enroll in four-year colleges and universities, earn degrees, and return to the community as leaders and mentors to future generations. The first Puente Project was initiated at Chabot College in 1981. Since that time, the model has been replicated at 59 colleges and 34 high schools throughout the State of California, with the oversight of the Puente Project centralized through the Regents of the University of California.

The Puente Project at Chabot College will provide instruction and services including counseling, mentoring, and follow-up to meet the mission of the program. The agreement outlines the continuation of staffing and office and administrative support currently offered by Chabot College. The Regents' Puente Office will provide staff development programs at no cost for instructors and counselors participating in the project. Additionally, the college will provide the student and college data necessary to conduct ongoing program assessment including student outcome data analysis to determine the impact of Puente Project.

This cooperative agreement shall be in effect for the period July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012.

The Board of Trustees approved MOU renewals on August 16, 2005 under item 4.1, August 22, 2006 under item 4.3, October 16, 2007 under item 4.5, June 24, 2008 under item 4.5. The 2009 document changed from a MOU to a cooperative agreement. On November 17, 2009 under item 4.1, March 15, 2011 under item 4.4 cooperative agreements were renewed.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Cooperative Agreement Renewal with the Regents of the University of California, Puente Project No. 11-CCC Puente-04, Chabot College, for the period July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012. Approval to Increase the Student Activity Fee, Chabot and Las Positas Colleges

<u>Background</u>: Currently, the optional Student Activity Fee within the District is set at \$5 per semester at both Chabot and Las Positas Colleges. The revenue generated from this fee is used by the Associated Students at both colleges for a variety of student life activities including, but not limited to, student clubs, scholarships, events, and the Textbook Loaner Program. In recent years the demand for and volume of these activities has increased significantly.

Since Fall 2009, the Associated Students at both colleges have been engaged in efforts to raise the Student Activity Fee. On April 27, 2011, at a Special Meeting of the Associated Students of Chabot College (ASCC), the Senate unanimously passed a resolution to increase the Student Activities Fee from \$5 to \$10 per semester. On September 12, 2011, the Associated Students of Las Positas College (ASLPC) passed a resolution in support of increasing the Student Activity Fee to \$10 per semester. The resolution has also been endorsed by Las Positas's College Council.

The ASCC and ASLPC are proposing to simultaneously take steps to recommend the same fee increase effective Spring 2012, maintaining consistency of the Student Activity Fee across the District.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed increase of the Student Activity Fee at Chabot and Las Positas Colleges to \$10 per semester, effective Spring Semester 2012.

<u>Background</u>: The Tri-Valley One Stop (TVOS) Program and Las Positas College have been offered the opportunity to receive funding from the City of Dublin's University Grant Program. Approval to Renew Agreement – California Early Childhood Mentor Program, Agreement No. CN110123 with the San Francisco Community

College District, Las Positas College

Background: The California Early Childhood Mentor Program started at Chabot College in the late 1980's. Las Positas College joined the program in 2001. Since its inception, it has been a highly successful program in promoting both the retention and quality of teachers of young children.

An integral component of this mentor program is the Alameda Regional Early Childhood Mentor Program which includes Chabot, Las Positas, Merritt and Ohlone Colleges. The regional program requires individual agreements between the participating colleges and the San Francisco Community College District, the fiscal agent for the Statewide Mentoring Program.

The agreement is for the period of August 1, 2011 through July 31, 2012.

Background: A bookstore subcommittee of the Chabot Budget Committee was formed comprised of students, faculty, classified staff, and management to evaluate the Chabot Bookstore outsourcing and alternative options for the management/operation of the Chabot Bookstore. The various alternatives were reviewed and discussed by the committee prior to the release on March 3, 2011 of the solicitation for the Request of Proposals (RFP) F-11, Bookstore Services, Chabot College with responses due April 5, 2011. A total of three (3) proposals were submitted to the District, reviewed and interviewed resulting in the short listing of two (2) firms. On September 1, 2011 the solicitation for the re-bid RFP F-11 was issued with responses due September 29, 2011.

Both firms responded and responses were evaluated by the bookstore committee. The recommended committee results determined that while both presented favorable proposals, Follett Corporation's proposal provided the greater advantage to the College in the coming years.

Follett Higher Education Group, Inc. currently operates the Las Positas College Bookstore. The new agreement will guarantee a higher level of annual commission and includes other compensation and planned improvements over and above current levels.

Subject: Approval to Participate in the State Capital Outlay Grant Financing Program for

Building 1800, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: In recent years the State's cash flow problems have led to delays in reimbursing districts for claims submitted for State-funded capital outlay projects. A new pilot grant financing program established by the State Chancellor's Office provides funding to the district of 90% of the estimated first year cost of construction.

These funds are placed in a separate interest bearing account. The remaining 10% is retained by the State until the project has reached an agreed completion point. At that time the District will submit a letter requesting release of the remaining 10% funding. The 10% would then be remitted to the District. The District will retain all interest earnings and the State Chancellor's Office will reduce the retention payment by the amount of the interest earnings based on the terms of the grant. If interest earnings exceed all retention amounts, the District will then remit the difference as unused funds that will be returned to the program. Participation in the Capital Outlay Grant Financing Program will assist the District with the project cash flow.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approves the District to Participate in the State Capital Outlay Grant Financing Program for Building 1800 at Chabot College.
