Acceptance of Grant Sub-Award—East Bay Teacher Pathway 2012 STEM Summer

Science Institute with Growth Sector, Chabot College

Background: Chabot College is making a commitment with Growth Sector to administer the East Bay Teacher Pathway - STEM Summer Science Institute for a total of \$10,450. The agreement is part of a Bechtel Grant received by Growth Sector and is in partnership with Chabot College, Exploratorium, and Cal State University East Bay. The STEM Summer Science Institute aims to expose the new East Bay Teacher Pathway cohort to inquiry-based science and math instructional methods, as well as enhance the learning in science and math for the cohort of future k-12 teachers. The sub-award funds the cost of the instruction of Chemistry 10, for the cohort students only.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the proposed grant sub-award for the East Bay Teacher Pathway 2012 STEM Summer Science Institute with Growth Sector, Chabot College, in the amount of \$10,450, for the period June 1, 2012 through August 31, 2012. Acceptance of Subcontract—The Youth Employment Partnership, Inc. (YEP),

Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College was approached by The Youth Employment Partnership, Inc. (YEP), a California non-profit corporation, to provide the following in the Tri-City area:

- Place up to 30 youth ages 15-18 who are in the county Foster Care and Probation systems into summer jobs
- 75% of participants will complete 80% of available hours for summer jobs, for a total of 150 hours
- 75% of participants will complete 10 soft skill employability competency workshops through the afterschool program

The program will accomplish the following outcome objectives:

- 70% of participants will add a positive reference to their resume
- 70% of participants will receive a positive evaluation from their supervisor

YEP will pay subcontractors through a performance based invoicing structure. Payments will be made incrementally for enrolled trainees obtaining the required program components. Chabot College will receive a 25% advance for up-front program costs, including staff wages, goods and services that are direct expenses for the summer youth employment program. The advance will be offset against payments for performance on this agreement at a rate of 25% per invoice submitted, or until the advance is recouped.

The sub-contract is for the period of May 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the proposed subcontract with The Youth Employment Partnership, Inc. (YEP), Chabot College, for the period May 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the subcontract on behalf of the District.

Approval to Amend Agreement – Child Development Training Consortium

2011-2012 Instructional Agreement No. 11-12-2620 with Yosemite

Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College currently has in effect a renewal agreement for the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) 2011-2012 Instructional Agreement No. 11-12-2620 with the Yosemite Community College District (YCCD), which was approved by the Board on October 18, 2011.

Approval of Amendment No. 1 will allow additional funding for enrolling students in courses required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to obtain a new or renew a current Child Development Permit. The amendment provides the College with \$25 per enrolled unit of coursework for courses that do not generate state apportionment. The amendment increases the "not to exceed" limit to \$15,000 from the original limit of \$14,375 (a \$625 total increase in the limit).

The amendment impacts the existing agreement currently in place for the period of September 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

Past Board of Trustees actions include renewal agreement approvals on October 18, 2011 under item 4.5; November 16, 2010 under item 4.5; October 20, 2009 under item 4.2; October 21, 2008 under item 4.3; October 16, 2007 under item 4.4; November 16, 2006 under item 4.4; January 17, 2006 under item 4.1; and October 19, 2004 under item 4.1.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Amendment No. 1 for the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) 2011-2012 Instructional Agreement No. 11-12-2620 with the Yosemite Community College District (YCCD), Las Positas College, in the amount not to exceed \$15,000.00 for the period of September 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the amended agreement on behalf of the District.

Approval of Independent Audit Engagement Agreement - Matson & Isom

Background: A Request for Proposal for Independent Audit Services for the District Annual Financial Audit and Proposition 39 (Measure B) Bond Funds Audit was issued on February 3, 2009. The Bond Funds Audit includes both the financial as well as the performance audit.

Nystrom and Company, LLP was selected based on the strength of the proposal, input from the references and price competitiveness. The Board approved the initial three-year engagement with Nystrom and Company at its March 17, 2009 meeting. On October 1, 2011 Nystrom and Company merged with Matson & Isom. The combined firms were founded in 1948 and 1955 respectively. The two firms have 115 employees, 62 CPAs, and 120 years of combined experience. The District is served out of the Redding, California office. Matson & Isom is currently engaged as independent auditors for eleven California community college districts.

This proposed board action extends the engagement for an additional three years, through the 2013-14 fiscal year. The not-to-exceed fee for the audits for the year ending June 30, 2012 will be \$82,300. For the years ending June 30, 2013 and June 30, 2014, this fee will be adjusted by the COLA (unfunded) used in the apportionment calculations.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Independent Audit Engagement Agreements with Matson & Isom of Redding, California to audit all funds for the District, including Proposition 39 Funds, for the years ending June 30 2012, June 30, 2013, and June 30, 2014. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreements on behalf of the District.

Approval to Award College Sponsorship Agreement—The Bottling Group, LLC

d/b/a The Pepsi Bottling Group, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: At the July 21, 2009 Board Meeting, a College Sponsorship Agreement was issued to The Bottling Group, LLC d/b/a The Pepsi Bottling Group, a Delaware limited liability corporation for beverage pouring rights at Las Positas College. The approval for "pouring rights" provide that the District will only allow beverages distributed by one (1) manufacturer to be sold on the Las Positas College campus.

Previously, the Chabot College Foundation had held the agreement with The Pepsi Bottling Group for Chabot College. Upon the dissolving of the Chabot College Foundation, College and District staff reviewed the proposal and recommend that the beverage pouring rights for Chabot College be awarded to The Bottling Group, LLC d/b/a The Pepsi Bottling Group. In return, the District and Chabot College receives commission and other payments that otherwise would not be available.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed award of a College Sponsorship Agreement to The Bottling Group, LLC d/b/a The Pepsi Bottling Group, Chabot College. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Approval of Standard Services Agreement—County of Alameda, Las Positas

College

<u>Background</u>: The County of Alameda has secured funds from Measure A and will allocate \$16,000 to Las Positas College to provide mental health services to its students in the Student Health and Wellness Center located on campus.

The scope of work included in this agreement includes a mental health services program which provides 20-28 hours of counseling services with a Marriage and Family Therapist Intern. Additionally, the grant provides support for MFT Internship supervision. Students in emotional crisis are able to receive support through this program during the fall and spring semesters. The term of this agreement is May 1, 2012 through April 30, 2013.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the standard services agreement with the County of Alameda, Las Positas College, for the term commencing May 1, 2012 through April 30, 2013. Approval of Software Agreement Renewal—Sungard Higher Education Banner

Document Management System and Argos Reporting, District

Background: The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District operates the Sungard Higher Education Banner System to provide district-wide enterprise services to support students, faculty, and staff through the use of the comprehensive Banner modules for Student Services, Financial Aid, Business Services, Human Resources and Payroll. A district-wide document imaging solution was identified as a key project in the current Measure B planned initiatives within the technology budget. The requirement was to select and implement a document imaging system to migrate to a paperless environment replacing manual files with electronic media where appropriate and reducing facility space for file storage and archives for the colleges and district. The Banner Document Management System (BDMS) was selected based on its functionality and features to replace the antiquated transcript scanning system as well as provide additional capabilities for all departments to achieve improved productivity with online document access and to reduce paper costs. The Banner Document Management System was purchased over a year ago using Measure B funds and the software purchase included software maintenance.

As the District continues to find new alternatives for cost savings in light of the current State budget situation, all software and hardware maintenance contracts that are funded by the District were evaluated and vendors were contacted to determine what multi-year options were available. Hardware and software products that meet the Bond criteria are purchased with Measure B funds and maintenance is included with the initial hardware and software purchases for a specified period, which varies depending on the vendor. With the current economic situation, vendors are more open to extending longer term maintenance agreements to their customers, which lock in the maintenance costs at pricing that provides significant savings to the customer by avoiding the yearly increases which can vary year to year.

As part of the cumulative IT cost savings made as a result of the State budget reductions, the District negotiated an amendment to the multi-year software maintenance agreement with Sungard Higher Education for the Banner Document Management System and the Argo Reporting product. The new multi-year agreements for the Sungard Higher Education products are executed at the time of expiration of the existing maintenance agreements, which vary throughout the year dependent on the product purchase. The multi-year agreement establishes a guaranteed discount based on the current year pricing with a minimum 4% rate of increase per year that has a compounded effect. This is in contrast to the standard contracts, which were in effect previously and had no limit and varied from 10% or greater dependent on the year. Therefore, the multi-year agreement provides substantial reduction in annual percentage

increases, thus significantly reducing overall maintenance costs for the District over the 5-year period. The costs for a 5-year agreement to support the software products that include the Banner Document Management System and the Argos Reporting product totals \$266,817. This new software agreement covers the 5-year period from the current renewal date through March 31, 2017 and averages \$53,364 per year.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed software agreement renewal for the Sungard Higher Education Banner Document Management System and Argos Reporting, District, at a cost of \$266,817 for a period of five years. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: The District will dispose of personal property that is surplus to the instructional or administrative needs of the District. <u>Background</u>: District Staff is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of furniture for Chabot College, Building 1800. To make the purchase of most of the required furniture items, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The CollegeBuys Purchasing Program is a cooperative purchasing program made available by the Foundation for California Community Colleges. The CollegeBuys contract planned for this use is the furniture contract with Krueger International, Inc. This piggyback contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award of the San Mateo Community College District.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed award of a piggyback contract for furniture and equipment for Chabot College, Building 1800 using the CollegeBuys Purchasing Program to Krueger International, in the respective amounts including taxes, not to exceed \$128,688.55. Development

<u>Background:</u> Solano County's Health and Social Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide training to people who work with the out-of-home children and youth of Solano County since 2003-04. The County has requested that we increase our contract amount from previous years and provide expanded training services for the 2012-13 fiscal year.

As with the prior contracts, we will be working closely with our partners, A Better Way, Alternative Family Services, and Seneca Center, to deliver the training to their own organizations as well as to other Solano County community-based foster- and adoptive-care children caretakers. Additionally, the County's Child Welfare Services incorporates training for their staff as part of this contract. The contract is funded through Title IV-E federal funds, and is in the amount of \$752,055.

The contract states that Solano County will pay the District up to \$752,055 for training services provided. This contract has a term of twelve months, July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed contract renewal with the County of Solano, Health and Social Services Department, Standard Contract No. 00591-13, District-Economic Development, for the period July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, in the amount of \$752,055. WHEREAS, employees that separate from service and are the age of 55 or older in the year of separation, may later withdraw these funds from the Special Pay Plan without incurring IRS excise tax penalties; and

WHEREAS, the Special Pay Plan will become effective upon unit concurrence, Chancellor or Designee approval, and Envoy Plan acceptance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District hereby approves the delegation of authority to the Chancellor or Designee, to work with the affected employee groups to implement and establish the 403(b) Special Pay Plan through Envoy Plan Services, Inc.; with plan administration provided by MidAmerica Administrative and Retirement Plan Solutions, Inc. for employer/employee savings.
