Approval of Subcontract – California State University East Bay Foundation

for Phase II of the Community Transfer Program for Future Mathematics and

Science Teachers, Subcontract No. 30000128-119, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Since Fall 2010, Chabot College's Science and Math Division has been working in collaboration with CSUEB to create an East Bay Teacher Pathways program. Our pilot cohort was completed at the end of the spring 2012 term and we are now moving into the evaluation phase of the program and will work to refine the program structure and curriculum.

This grant will provide the Science and Math Division with an opportunity to complete the development phase and begin implementation on a more direct math path for students interested in becoming future k-5 teachers or k-8 science and math teachers.

The grant will provide professional development opportunities for Chabot faculty (both adjunct and full-time) to be trained on the new curriculum and to do classroom observations. In addition, faculty inquiry groups will be formed to develop new lessons within the framework of the new curriculum. The funding provided by CSUEB's grant for this professional development model is essential in implementing the new math curriculum.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed subcontract, No. 30000128-119, with California State University East Bay Foundation, Chabot College in the amount of \$20,000 for the period beginning July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2013. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the subcontract on behalf of the District.

Approval of Contract Renewal - Chancellor's Office, California Community

Colleges, Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP)

Background: Legislation passed in 1982 permitting community colleges to contract with the Chancellor's Office for the collection of outstanding student financial aid obligations owed to the colleges. The Chancellor's Office, acting on behalf of the colleges, may contract with the State Franchise Tax Board for the collection of outstanding or defaulted loans and overpayment of grants from any refund of taxes by the state or from state lottery winnings. Also, legislation (AB 3929, Jones) was passed in 1991 which authorized the collection of proper non-financial aid obligations owed to the District. Annually, community colleges may enter into a contract with the Chancellor's Office and submit the names of students with outstanding obligations. The Chancellor's Office retains 25% of all collections to cover administrative costs of operating the collection program.

The contract will permit the District to continue to submit the names of students with outstanding obligations in order to permit collection of said obligations by the State Franchise Tax Board. This is a renewal of an annual contract with the Chancellor's Office, covering the period from October 1, 2012 through December 20, 2013.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the renewal of contract with the Chancellor's Office, California Community Colleges, for implementation of the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program for the period October 1, 2012 through December 20, 2013. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Chancellor to execute the contract on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College conducts an athletic program for its students, and wishes to retain Tri-Valley Orthopedic Specialists, Inc., to provide the college with services in the areas of prevention and care of sports-related injuries during the 2012-13 athletic season.

This agreement will provide a certified athletic trainer for all men's and women's major sports (practice, games and meets), according to a mutually agreed-upon schedule. Tri-Valley Orthopedic Specialists, Inc. will assist the College in training and sports clinic programs and will provide specialized health and injury prevention seminars for College athletes and coaches and pre-participation health screenings prior to athletes' participation in sports programs. Background: In 2009 nursing programs throughout Northern California worked with Health Stream to create a hospital standard review for regulatory compliance standard for all hospitals in Northern California. These online modules would teach and test for compliance in HIPAA; Ethics, Sexual Harassment, Patient Rights, Informed Consent, Advanced Directive, Grievance, Appropriate Care, Culture Competence, Restraints and Seclusion, Patient Abuse/Assault/Neglect as well as standard safety requirements; hand hygiene, Standard Precautions and Bloodborne Pathogens, lifting/transporting, slips/trips/falls, etc. Students completing these modules would meet the initial hospital requirements in Northern California for clearance to enter and treat patients as "student nurses." The process would eliminate individual hospital requirements for each rotation. The Chabot Nursing Program currently utilizes eight local hospitals for clinical rotations. We are working with the Chabot Medical Assistance Program and EMT program to help standardize the requirements for all health-related studies at Chabot and Las Positas Colleges. These are the same modules currently used at Oakland Children's Hospital and Eden Medical Center for their health-related personnel.

Funding for these online classes in school year 2012-2013 will be through California Chancellor Retention Grant 10-107-004 Amendment #2. The funding covers \$10.50 per student for the three modules. One hundred students will be served

RESOLUTION NO. 05-1213

SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 30—SCHOOLS AND LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY PROTECTION ACT

WHEREAS, community colleges have taken extensive cuts to funding over recent years, while trying to educate the largest high school graduating classes in California history and need funding to provide the programs and services necessary to increase the number of successful degree and certificate holders;

WHEREAS, community colleges have been forced to turn away as many as 130,000 potential students in a single year due to the need to reduce course sections, generally from 5 to 15 percent annually per district;

WHEREAS, community colleges have carried an estimated 252,000 students over the last five years (2007-08 to 2011-12) for whom they have not received any apportionment, categorical, or student support funding;

WHEREAS, community colleges operated with \$809 million (12%) less in unrestricted apportionment funding 2011-12 than in 2008-09, including cuts to both apportionment and categorical funding;

WHEREAS, per-student funding in community colleges has been reduced from \$5,659 in 2007-08 to \$5,115 in 2011-12, a loss of 9.6% over this five-year period, while the unfunded cost-of-living (2008-09 to 2012-13) has increased by a compounded 16.3%;

WHEREAS, the Legislature has increased fees from \$600 annually in 2008-09 to \$1,380 for the 2012-13 school year, while the majority of community college students have incomes so low that they are eligible for the Board of Governors' (BOG) Fee Waiver;

WHEREAS, California community colleges are essential for providing higher education opportunity for over two million Californians annually;

WHEREAS, California community colleges are essential for providing students with the skills to be economically success in the California economy;

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 would temporarily increase the state sales tax by 0.25% and the marginal personal income tax rate for individuals earning over \$250,000 and households earning over \$500,000 and dedicate the funds to K-12 schools and community colleges;

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 will avoid the elimination of funding for an additional 85,000 students by providing \$548.5 million in 2012-13;
