Approval of Agreement Renewal – Child Development Training Consortium

2012-2013 Instructional Agreement No. 12-13-2620 with Yosemite Community

College District, Las Positas College

Background: Las Positas College has received a program renewal for the Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) 2012-2013 Instructional Agreement No. 12-13-2620 with the Yosemite Community College District (YCCD). The program allows the College to generate up to 500 units of college credit by enrolling students in courses required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to obtain a new or renew a currently held Child Development Permit. As these courses do not generate state apportionment, the agreement provides the College with \$25 per enrolled unit of coursework, not to exceed a total of \$12,500.

The College has been continuously involved with the YCCD/CDTC and has received an annual renewal since 1993.

The proposed agreement renewal is for the period September 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

Past Board of Trustees actions include agreement approvals on October 18, 2011, under item 4.5; November 16, 2010 under item 4.5; October 20, 2009 under item 4.2; October 21, 2008 under item 4.3; October 16, 2007 under item 4.4; November 16, 2006 under item 4.4; January 17, 2006 under item 4.1; and October 19, 2004 under item 4.1.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed renewal agreement for the Child Development Training Consortium 2012-2013 Agreement No. 12-13-2620 with Yosemite Community College District, Las Positas College, in the amount not to exceed \$12,500 for the period of September 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. Subject: Acceptance of Grant Renewal - Career Technical Community Collaborative

Programs, Grant Agreement No. 12-140-482, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College applied for and was awarded a renewal grant for the Career Technical Community Collaborative Programs Grant in the amount of \$387,023 to continue the work that began with initial SB70 grant funding, which was awarded to Chabot College in June 2008.

New funding will allow activities to extend another 24 months and continue the work of building a strong Career & Technical Education (CTE) Community Collaborative Partnership, which includes Chabot College, Las Positas College and K-12 schools, ROP's, Adult Schools Business & Industry, and Centers for Economic Development within the CLPCC service areas. Project activities will take place between November 1, 2012 and November 30, 2014. Activities include: Career exploration development for 7th & 8th graders; Establish and/or strengthen existing programs in the 15 industry sectors identified by the California Department of Education with specific focused attention on the Health, Engineering & Business Sectors; Grant activities will include: developing model programs, articulating course work, aligning curriculum, and developing advisory committees to link education with business, industry and labor; Offer Teacher and Faculty Externships with Business and Industry; and offer CTE professional development opportunities.

The Board of Trustees has previously approved the Career Technical Community Collaborative Project on February 21, 2012 under item 4.2 for \$411,350; April 19, 2011 under item 4.2 for \$400,000; and April 21, 2009 under item 4.2 for \$400,000.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Career Technical Community Collaborative Programs Grant Renewal Agreement No. 12-140-482, Chabot College in the amount of \$387,023 for the period November 1, 2012 through November 30, 2014. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Approval of Agreement Renewal – The Foundation for California Community

Colleges, State of California Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and

Student Training Program, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College has a successful auto technology program. The Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC) has operated the State of California's Bureau of Automotive Repair (BAR) Smog Referee and Lane Technician Training Program on the campus for more than five years. The program provides referees to hear consumer complaints and to negotiate reasonable results in those disputes and to train student technicians to perform necessary technical services in the State's Smog Check program.

This agreement would continue the BAR's Smog Referee and Student Technician Training Program, combining public service to the community and a training program for students enrolled at the College. In addition, the FCCC will pay \$1,000 per month as a licensing fee for the use of the facilities at the College.

The term of the proposed renewal is July 20, 2012 through June 30, 2015.

Past actions by the Board of Trustees include approval of the original agreement on April 15, 2003 under item 4.7.b and approval of renewals on January 18, 2005 under item 4.4; February 21, 2006 under item 4.2; November 14, 2006 under item 4.5; and October 16, 2007 under item 4.4.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed renewal agreement with The Foundation for California Community Colleges, State of California Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and Student Training Program at Las Positas College from July 20, 2012 through June 30, 2015. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the renewal agreement on behalf of the District.

<u>Background:</u> Mendocino County's Health and Human Services Agency wishes to contract with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development Department to provide training to group home providers, foster family agencies and Health and Human Services Agency staff located in Mendocino County.

This will be the third fiscal year in contract with Mendocino County for Title IV-E funded trainings. The District will continue to subcontract with First 5 Mendocino, which has been offering Title IV-E funded trainings since July 2010.

The contract is in the amount of \$325,000, for the period of July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. As with our other Title IV-E funded programs, this agreement requires an in-kind match from the District, which will be made up of Economic Development's direct expenses as well as a share of District-wide overhead costs.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Standard Services Agreement Renewal with the County of Mendocino, Health and Human Services Agency for Foster and Adoptive Care Training, District-Economic Development, for the period July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, in the amount of \$325,000. <u>Background:</u> Lake County's Department of Social Services wishes to contract with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development Department to provide training to group home providers, foster family agencies and Department of Social Services staff located in Lake County.

The District will subcontract with Redwood Children's Center, which has been offering Title IV-E funded trainings for the Lake County care givers.

Approval of Nonfinancial Cooperative Agreement—U.S. Department of Labor,

Occupational Safety and Health Administration for an OSHA Training Institute

Education Center, District-Economic Development

<u>Background:</u> On February 19, 2008 the Board of Trustees approved a Non-Financial Cooperative Agreement with the U.S. Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) for the purpose of technical training in occupational safety and health for the period of October 1, 2007 to September 30, 2012.

On June 12, 2012 a Board Resolution 05-1112 was adopted, which authorized Chabot-Las Positas Community College District to submit an application to the U.S. Department of Labor (OSHA) training institute education center to reapply for continued recognition, along with other U.S. OSHA training facilities as required.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been selected once again by the U.S. Department of Labor as an OSHA Educational Center for the period of October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2017. Authorization requires Non-Financial Cooperative Agreement between the District and the U.S. Department of Labor.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Nonfinancial Cooperative Agreement, U.S. Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration for an OSHA Training Institute Education Center, District-Economic Development, for the period October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2017.
