Approval of Continuation of Funding for the Cooperative Agreement—The

Regents of the University of California, Puente Project No. 13-CCC Puente-

04, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The mission of the Puente Project is to increase the number of educationally underrepresented students who enroll in four-year colleges and universities, earn degrees, and return to the community as leaders and mentors to future generations. The first Puente Project was initiated at Chabot College in 1981. Since that time, the model has been replicated at 59 colleges and 34 high schools throughout the State of California, with the oversight of the Puente Project centralized through the Regents of the University of California.

The Puente Project at Chabot College will provide instruction and services including counseling, mentoring, and follow-up to meet the mission of the program. The agreement outlines the continuation of staffing and office and administrative support currently offered by Chabot College. The Regents' Puente Office will provide staff development programs at no cost for instructors and counselors participating in the project. Additionally, the college will provide the student and college data necessary to conduct ongoing program assessment including student outcome data analysis to determine the impact of Puente Project.

The Board of Trustees approved Cooperative Agreement on November 17, 2009 under item 4.1, March 15, 2011 under item 4.4, and October 16, 2012 under item 4.2.

Therefore, this cooperative agreement shall be in effect for the period July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the continuation of funding for the Cooperative Agreement with the Regents of the University of California, Puente Project No. 13-CCC Puente-04, Chabot College, for the period July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014. The approved materials for the PRIDE and Youth & Safety programs will ensure compliance with the most up-to-date training curriculum.

The Board of Trustees previously approved Collaboration Agreement – Casey Family Programs for the Foster and Kinship Care Education Program, Las Positas College on January 15, 2013 under item 4.5.

Therefore, this non-monetary Collaboration Agreement is for the period October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014.

Acceptance of Renewal of Grant Award - California Community Colleges

Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) for Mathematics, Engineering, Science

Achievement (MESA), Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College is renewing the annual \$50,500 grant award from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Funds support the MESA Program at Chabot College. The MESA program academically prepares its program students for transfer to four-year institutions, to assure their ability to attain baccalaureate degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) fields.

The MESA program is comprised of 13 Core Components that include: Academic Excellence Workshops that teach collaborative learning techniques, a special orientation course for MESA students, a dedicated study center, career advising and exploration of STEM options, transfer assistance, scholarships and partnerships with student and professional organizations. The Chabot MESA Program will provide all 13 Core MESA Components which includes frequent, sustained and prolonged academic and student support services, including case management.

The Chabot MESA Program will benefit all Chabot students, but will target underrepresented minorities in STEM, in particular Latino, African-American, and Pacific-Islander students. Taking into account the student population at Chabot, low-income, first-generation students majoring in STEM fields will also be targeted. As a result of the first-year success and renewal funds, the program is expanding to serve 120 students, 20 additional students.

The District and College have also developed a plan for institutionalizing the Chabot MESA Program and its Project Director. MESA is a key element of the multiple student success initiatives at the college and is a part of its Strategic Plan to increase student success and transfer while supporting Chabot's commitment to being a Hispanic-serving institution.

The Board of Trustees was presented the original agreement on July 17, 2012 under item 4.1.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$50,500 for the period beginning July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, with the possibility of three additional annual renewals.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the renewal of the grant award for Chabot College in the amount of \$50,500 for the period beginning July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the grant award on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: The Paramedic Training Program at Las Positas College is required to offer the Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) classes to its students.

<u>Background</u>: Sutter Delta Medical Center provides medical care of acute care patients and severs as a primary teaching hospital, playing a key role in the training of medical professionals. Sutter Delta Medical Center would like to begin providing opportunities for surgical technology students of Chabot College and Las Positas College through an affiliation agreement.

The term of this agreement is November 1, 2013 through October 31, 2016. This agreement may be renewed upon mutual written agreement of the parties. Approval by Chabot-Las Positas Community College District will require formal approval by the Board of Trustees.

The Board approved similar agreements to provide clinical training for the Surgical Technology Program with Eden Medical Center, Castro Valley under item 5.4 on February 16, 2010, with Washington Township Health Care District under item 5.5 on February 16, 2010, with Children's Hospital and Research Center, Oakland on January 19, 2010 under item 5.6, and with Stanford Hospital and Clinics on December 8, 2009 under item 5.4.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed affiliation agreement with Sutter Delta Medical Center with its principal place of business located at 3901 Lone Tree Way, Antioch, CA, Chabot College and Las Positas College from November 1, 2013 through October 31, 2016. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the proposed agreement on behalf of the District.

Adoption of Resolution No. 02-1314 — Authorization to Use the Construction Manager at Risk (CM at Risk) Project Delivery Method in Accordance with Government Code Section 4526 for Building 2000, Library Renovation, Las

Positas College

<u>Background:</u> Las Positas College is proceeding with the remodel of the Library located in Building 2000. The Library renovation project will involve four distinct sub-projects that must be coordinated. The sub-projects will start at different times and involve differing trade contractor combinations. The Construction Manager at Risk (CM at Risk) delivery method provides a process to bid and assemble multiple guaranteed pricing for the sub-projects and integrate the work over the project's nine month schedule.

Government Code Section 4526 provides for an alternative project delivery system called Construction Manager at Risk (CM at Risk). In this system a Construction Manager is chosen based upon qualifications, experience and an overhead and fee price proposal. A contract is created with the successful CM to solicit competitive bidding for each of the individual subtrades on the project. These sub-contractor bids are then gathered and opened with college representatives to determine the final construction team and final price.

Some of the advantages of utilizing this delivery method in lieu of the traditional design bid build method are:

- 1. The project schedule and cost can be improved by inviting contractors to compete for the project who are already mobilized on site, thereby reducing the construction complexity created by the current site conditions.
- 2. The subcontracted construction cost continues to be competitive by requiring the CM at Risk to competitively price the subcontracted work to a minimum of three subcontractors for each trade.
- 3. The CM at Risk firms provides competitively priced overhead and fee during the selection phase to ensure good value to the District.
- 4. Reduced coordinating, scheduling and change order issues, corresponding to overall risk and cost reduction for the project.
- 5. Once competitive pricing is finalized, the CM at Risk converts to a lump sum price.

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<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees adopts Resolution No. 02-1314 authorizing Use of the Construction Manager at Risk (CM at Risk) Project Delivery Method in accordance with Government Code Section 4526 for Building 2000, Library Renovation, Las Positas College.

Leadership and Governance Program

Background: An educated and well-informed Governing Board (Board of Trustees) is the foundation of a successful community college. As the policy-making body of the community college, the Board is responsible for the overall success of the institution and the students served. The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) Accreditation Standard IV.B.1 states that "the Governing Board is responsible for establishing policies to assure the quality, integrity, and effectiveness of the student learning programs and services, and the financial stability of the institution." Furthermore, Standard IV.B.a.f(a) states that "the Governing Board has a program for Board development and new member orientation." "Excellence in Trusteeship" is a program offered through the Community College League of California (CCLC). It is designed to facilitate the ongoing education of all Trustees in California community colleges by providing a solid foundation for effective Board governance. Trustees can obtain the training through attending League events, participating in local Board training/workshops, and attending national association conferences and webinars.

The program covers seven (7) areas of competencies with subtopics to complete the knowledge and skills learning to support strong leadership. Participants attend sessions in each of the seven (7) competencies which define the roles and responsibilities of Governance Boards and provide tools that keep efforts focused on student learning. A certificate of participation in governance leadership from the League can be earned with completion of the program. Participants must complete the program within 24 months of the start date. The seven competencies are:

- Accreditation This module covers accreditation as a regional peer-review process
 that looks at the entire campus/district, and provides an opportunity for continuous
 self-improvement, grounded with data-driven evidence.
- Student Success This module covers topics from the Student Success Act of 2012,
 Senate Bill 1456, including utilizing student services in individual education planning,
 monitoring student progress, and improving completion and transfer rates.
- Governance This module covers the Governing Board's policy-making function, and its role in the participatory governance process.

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- Fiscal Responsibilities This module will cover the skills and knowledge needed to
 make fiscal policy decisions and set guidelines for fiscal and asset management
 practices that support college goals and student success.
- Board Evaluation This module will cover the role of the Board and its limits; how to run effective meetings; and how to develop and maintain a strong Board/CEO relationship; the Board self-evaluation and its evaluation of the CEO.
- Ethics Training Covers how to perform in both ethical and legal ways as you govern.
- Brown Act Training Covers how to set agendas, provide for public comment, run Board meetings and when to hold closed sessions.

Through the Community College League of California (CCLC), Board members can sign up for this training for a \$75 application fee and a \$75 file review fee per Board member. This item is presented for consideration by the Board of Trustees in order to secure their commitment and support in the spirit of effective Trusteeship.
