Approval of Master Sub-Recipient Sub-Award Agreement - Jewish Vocational

and Career Counseling Service (JVS), Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: In October, 2006 the Immigrant Nurse Reentry Program (INRP) and JVS began negotiations with Chabot College to provide education support for a population (foreign trained nurses) that needs help to re-enter the health care profession in the United States. With the new implementation of new nursing ratios for hospitals across the State, increasing pressure has come to bear on community colleges and other nursing education providers to increase their capacity to prepare Registered Nurses for employment in regional medical systems. The Chabot Nursing Program developed a 10 week course for RN Refresher nurses. In 2008 through 2013; 100+ students have completed this course. This project was funded through INRP and JVS.

Funding for Summer 2014 class of 18 students will be the sole responsibility of JVS. Chabot College provides the facilities and engages approved faculty to conduct the class. Alameda Health Services provides the clinical facilities at no cost to the school or JVS.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed renewal of sub-agreement with Jewish Vocation and Career Counseling Service for the Immigrant Nursing reentry Program and Chabot College for the receipt of the JVS grant monies to support the funding of this program in 2014. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Board (ACWIB), Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College and ACWIB have been in collaboration for many years on various contracts, memorandum of agreements, and grants. In July of 2014, the ACWIB notified Las Positas College that it is being awarded a WIA Grant Allocation in the amount of \$183,000 to develop and deliver an Engineering Technology Program.

The WIA defines the nation's job training system and provides guidance for local workforce investment systems designed to increase the employment, retention and earnings of participants, and to increase occupational skill attainment of participants. The goals of these efforts are to improve the quality of the workforce, reduce welfare dependency, and enhance the productivity and competitiveness of the nation. Las Positas College will develop curriculum, deliver instruction, and provide supportive services as outlined within Exhibit A of the agreement.

The term of the proposed amendment is from August 20, 2014 through June 30, 2015 2016.

Service Career Pathways Pilot Project Subcontract, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College is accepting a \$5,000 subcontract for providing services to students enrolled in the Career Pathways Pilot Project and pursuing a Bridge to STEM certificate. Academic support services include, but are not limited to, tutoring; mentoring; workshops; leadership activities; and field trips.

With student consent, Chabot College agrees to share Bridge to STEM student information/data with East Bay Community Services/La Familia Counseling Service. Student data includes, but are not limited to, transcripts; progress reports; financial aid award statements; and Student Educational Plans (SEPs).

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$5,000 for the period beginning July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

Community College District

<u>Background</u>: Doctors Hospital of Manteca provides advanced medical care and treatment at its 73-bed facility. The hospital is fully accredited by the Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, licensed by the State of California, and approved for the acceptance of Medicare patients. Doctors Hospital of Manteca would like to provide opportunities for surgical technology students through an Affiliation Agreement.

The term of this agreement is August 20, 2014 through August 19, 2016. At the end of the Term, this agreement shall be automatically extended for an additional term of one (1) year, unless either party provides the other with a written notice of termination.

The Board approved similar agreements to provide clinical training for the Surgical Technology Program with San Ramon Regional Medical Center under item 5.3 on November 19, 2013; Sutter Delta Medical Center, Antioch under item 5.10 on October 15, 2013; Eden Medical Center, Castro Valley under item 5.4 on February 16, 2010; Washington Township Health Care District under item 5.5 on February 16, 2010; Children's Hospital and Research Center, Oakland under item 5.6 on January 19, 2010; and Stanford Hospital and Clinics on December 8, 2009 under item 5.4.

Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Renewal-Alameda County

Office of Education for the Alameda County Transition to Teaching for

Paraeducators Program, Chabot College

Background: The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing conducted a Competitive Grant Process for local education agencies wishing to participate in the Paraprofessional Teaching Training Program. The Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE) along with California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) and Chabot College collaborated in the submission of a proposal. Funding was granted in the summer, 2007 to ACOE by the California Commission on Teaching Credentialing. The grant will allow for the formalization and jump-start of this collaboration. It will result in the establishment of necessary and manageable systems that judiciously utilize available resources and support expansion of the program. Las Positas College will have the opportunity to be included as the program expands.

The Proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) renewal outlines the grant objectives and activities specific to Chabot College's participation in the Transition to Teaching for Para-educators project, CCTC/T3. The College will provide the cohort of participants with assistance, counseling and instruction through the PACE Program, work with CSUEB on articulation between lower division coursework and assist in the recruitment and screening of cohort participants. It will maintain a high level of administrative participation for the CCTC/T3 Management Team. The proposed MOU renewal shall be in effect for the period July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015.

The Board of Trustees approved the initial MOU on September 18, 2007 under item 4.2 and renewals on December 9, 2008 under item 4.4, August 18, 2009 under item 4.3 and October 19, 2010 under item 4.6, July 19, 2011 under item 5.5, 2012 under item 5.4 and June 25, 2013 under item 5.16.

<u>Background</u>: District is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of personal computer equipment for Building 2000, Library Renovation, Las Positas College. To make the purchase of the required personal computer equipment, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) has formed a cooperative purchasing organization, the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO) to manage a cooperative purchasing program approved by the California's State Chief Procurement Official and make contracts available to authorized governmental entities such as public schools and institutions of higher education. The WSCA-NASPO contract planned for this use is the computer contract (B27164-CA) with Hewlett Packard Company. This piggybackable contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award to WSCA members.
