<u>Background</u>: Community Education at Las Positas College has over the years offered a variety of local and international travel opportunities for community members.

Most recently, in October 2011, the Board approved a relationship between Community Education and Collette Travel for international programs of travel abroad. This trip is organized in conjunction with Peru Hands On, and will be led by Dr. Barry Russell, who has extensive travel experience in that country and with that particular agency. This trip, while providing personal enrichment and the kind of learning that all travel exposure brings, is being offered through Community Education for personal enrichment for anyone in the Tri-Valley community.

The Voluntary Activity Waiver, Release and Indemnity Agreement will be signed by all attendees, which states that the intention of the participant is to exempt and relieve Chabot-Las Positas Community College District from liability for personal injury, property damage and wrongful death caused by negligence. Community Education will obtain a Ground Handler's Compliance form from Hands On Peru, and will recommend that travelers buy their own individual trip insurance policy.

Approval of Cooperative Agreement No.14-Puente-CC-04 Between The

Regents of the University of California Puente Project and Chabot-Las Positas

Community College District, Chabot College

Background: The mission of the Puente Project is to increase the number of educationally underrepresented students who enroll in four-year colleges and universities, earn degrees, and return to the community as leaders and mentors to future generations. The first Puente Project was initiated at Chabot College in 1981. Since that time, the model has been replicated at 61 colleges and 34 high schools throughout the State of California, with the oversight of the Puente Project centralized through the Regents of the University of California.

The Puente Project at Chabot College will provide English and Psychology-Counseling instruction and services including counseling, mentoring, and follow-up to meet the mission of the program. The agreement outlines the continuation of staffing and office and administrative support currently offered by Chabot College. The Regents' Puente Office will provide staff development programs at no cost for instructors and counselors participating in the project. Additionally, Chabot College will provide the student and college data necessary to conduct ongoing program assessment including student outcome data analysis to determine the impact of the Puente Project at Chabot College.

This cooperative agreement shall be in effect for fiscal years 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17. The Board of Trustees approved Cooperative Agreement on November 17, 2009 under item 4.1, March 15, 2011 under item 4.4, October 16, 2012 under item 4.2, and October 15, 2013 under item 4.1.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Cooperative Agreement No. 14-Puente-CC-04 between the Regents of the University of California Puente Project and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College, for fiscal years 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17. Approval for Establishing Non-Resident (Out-of-State and International)

Tuition Rates for 2015-2016

<u>Background:</u> In accordance with Education Code Section 76140, the Board of Trustees must set the non-resident tuition rate for the succeeding fiscal year. In establishing this amount, the District may select from one of the following seven options:

- 1. Statewide average cost.
- 2. District average cost.
- 3. District average cost with 10% or more noncredit FTES.
- 4. Contiguous district.
- 5. No more than district average cost; no less than statewide average cost.
- 6. Statewide average fee, from 2013-14 (\$200 per semester unit; \$133 per quarter unit).
- 7. No more than average tuition of 12 states with cost of living comparable to California.

The District served 381 full-time equivalent non-resident students in 2012-2013 and 380 (Chabot College 186, Las Positas College 194) in 2013-2014. The non-resident tuition rate of \$243.00 per semester unit was charged for the 2014-2015 academic year. The administration recommends the rate of \$243.00 per semester unit for the 2015-2016 academic year, which includes a \$17.00 per unit capital outlay fee.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the proposed non-resident tuition rate of \$243.00 per semester unit for the 2015-2016 academic year for non-resident students, international students, and non-immigrant aliens attending on F-1 or other visa types.

Approval of Amendment - Child Development State Preschool Contract No.

CSPP-4007 Project No. 01-6131-004, Chabot College

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed amendment to Child Development State Preschool Contract No. CSPP-4007, Project No. 01-6131-00-4, for the Chabot College for an increase of \$28,400 bringing the Maximum Reimbursable amount (MRA) from \$433,854 to \$462,254.
