Background: Chabot College and Hayward Unified School District, Student Parent Support Programs (HUSD-SPSP) wish to enter into an agreement allowing HUSD-SPSP to reimburse Chabot College to provide college-level courses in the instructional areas of Anthropology, Business, Health, History, Psychology, Sociology, Music and Engineering 10/11 for degree-level credit courses to be offered to high school students during the Summer 2015, Fall 2015 and Spring 2016 term. (COH) in Support of the East Bay Mathematics and Science Teacher

Initiative, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: California's economy depends upon having a good supply of mathematics and science graduates for the State's science and technology jobs. In order to increase future student interest and engagement in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) fields, it is critical that we as an educational institution help to prepare and foster future teachers in science and math to foster the pipeline. Chabot is a primary partner in the California State University, East Bay Mathematics and Science Teacher Initiative and is entering into this agreement with the COH to carry out the Initiative-related out-of-school time and student transitional support activities on behalf of Chabot.

COH will recruit and train students from Chabot's math, sciences, and engineering tutor/student population to act as tutors in the Hayward Public Library's After-School Homework Support Centers at local middle school and high school sites. Tutors will support students in their math and science subjects between January 2015 and July 2015.

The MOU is for the period of January 1, 2015 – June 30, 2015 for the grant amount of \$7,500.

Acceptance of a California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Grant #15-180-002 Assessment, Remediation & Retention for Nursing Enrollment Growth and Retention Program Grant, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The intent of these funds is to respond to the nursing shortage by increasing the capacity of community college nursing programs and, ultimately, increasing the number of licensed nurses. The funds allocated to colleges as a result of this program will provide the opportunity for Associate Degree Nursing Programs (ADN) to expand and/or maintain prior expansion of the number of students enrolled in their programs for a two-year period pending availability of funds for the second fiscal year, and to provide funds to assist students to succeed.

Chabot College will use these funds to increase the retention of nursing students through targeted case management of nursing students, additional skills lab support, simulation lab support and instruction, tutoring, faculty professional development, review courses, book and uniform scholarships, equipment and supplies to ensure that the nursing students are working with equipment that meets current industry standards.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$205,200 for the period July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

<u>Background</u>: This is a renewal of the amendment to the agreement with ValleyCare Health System (VCHS) to operate the Student Health Center at Las Positas College for an annual fee of \$237,348 for the period of June 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016.

Las Positas College has had a working relationship with ValleyCare Health System since 1998. The Student Health Center provides health care services including non-emergency medical care, health care guidance, medical referral services and preventive health care services. Basic expenditure costs for the Student Health Center cover the full-time nurse practitioner, part-time Office Assistant, and part-time Medical Assistant and medical supplies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if Fiscal Independence is approved in the category designated, the Governing Board assumes complete responsibility for the legality of, proper accounting of, and compliance with budgetary restrictions of warrants issued by the district; and that the Governing Board is to provide for the independence of the Disbursing Officer, to include access to legal counsel; and that the Board is still required to file timely and accurate reports with County Officers; and that charges may be required for services provided to the district by County Officers; and that the Board is required to pay all penalties and/or assessments resulting from late or inaccurate retirement reporting.
