Background: Chabot College and Hayward Unified School District, Student Parent Support Programs (HUSD-SPSP) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding allowing HUSD-SPSP to reimburse Chabot College to provide college-level courses in the instructional areas of Anthropology, Business, Health, History, Psychology, Sociology, Music and Engineering 10/11 for degree-level credit courses to be offered to high school students during the Summer 2015. Fall 2015 and Spring 2016 terms. This agreement was approved by the Board of Trustees on May 19, 2015.

This amendment removes the list of specific courses to be offered and adjusts the amount of reimbursement from \$8,400 per each 3 unit course delivered at site with enrollments equal to or less than 44 students, to \$7,200.

Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) - Bay Area Shared

Regional ICT Lab Between Cabrillo College and Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College and Cabrillo College wish to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding related to the implementation of a "Shared Information and Communications Technologies (ICT) Lab" project, which will create staff and provide a regional shared ICT lab facility used, initially, by 25 of the 28 Bay Region community colleges.

The Bay Area Shared Regional ICT Lab will initially use NETLAB+ a hardware and software system that allows students remote access to hands-on labs to develop essential skills needed by employers of the Information and Communications Technologies (ICT) workforce, from any Internet accessible location, 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

This project is funded through the Grant-Sub Agreement between Cabrillo Community College District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College; and funds related to this MOU are included in the amount of \$362,761 for the period January 1, 2015 through February 28, 2016. The project was approved by the Board of Trustees on August 18, 2015 under item 4.7. This MOU addresses the implementation plan between the Colleges and does not require additional funding.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Bay Area Shared Regional ICT Lab between Cabrillo College and Chabot College for the period September 16, 2015 through June 30, 2016. San Lorenzo Unified School District and Chabot-Las Positas Community

College District

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to facilitate the collection, analysis, and sharing of student data in order for San Lorenzo Unified students enrolling at Chabot-Las Positas Community College District to take advantage of the use of multiple measures (grades, GPA, etc.) when determining English and Math placement. Data to share may include personally identifiable information such as names, date of birth, gender, and ethnicity as well as admissions information, terms of enrollment, courses and grades.

In this MOU, San Lorenzo Unified agrees to designate Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (including its employees and agents) as an "other school official" under FERPA and/or the California Education Code, who has a "legitimate educational interest" in using and accessing such Educational Records. This MOU was approved by the San Lorenzo Unified School District Board on August 18, 2015.

Support Services ASPIRE Program, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The TRIO Student Support Services grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. The grant continues funding for Chabot's successful ASPIRE program that has been operating since 2005. The ASPIRE Program seeks to narrow and/or close the achievement gap by providing comprehensive academic development, case management, financial aid education, and financial literacy services.

ASPIRE features structured first year experiences, individualized continuous follow-up in Years 2-5, a strong academic, transfer and career emphasis, and group services to maximize student contact. This includes a Summer Readiness Program, close monitoring and follow-up on student progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and connected to ASPIRE staff. ASPIRE will provide a safety net for low-income, first-generation and disabled students and help make their dream of a postsecondary education a reality.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$231,103 per year for five years (total \$1,155,515) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020.

Support Services (SSS) EXCEL ESL Program, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The TRIO Student Support Services grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. This SSS grant continues funding for Chabot's EXCEL Program that targets Chabot's large English as a Second Language population. Latino and Asian-American students comprise the majority of the ESL students. Most of these students have ambitious educational goals. However, despite these ambitious goals, an analysis of the data shows a significant achievement gap between Chabot SSS-eligible ESL students and their more affluent peers.

The Chabot College SSS ESL Program seeks to narrow and/or close this gap by providing comprehensive English language development support in college courses, case management, financial aid and financial literacy services. The program recruits from all areas of the college utilizing frequent and intrusive student contacts and strong academic supports, led by ESL faculty, to retain students. Services include a Summer Readiness Program, close monitoring and follow-up on progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and in contact with SSS ESL faculty and staff. This program is a collaborative effort of ESL and Counseling faculty and strives to increase college access and success for this historically underrepresented population.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$220,000 per year for five years (total \$1,100,000) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020.

Support Services (SSS) Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM),

Chabot College

Background: The TRIO Student Support Services grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. This grant builds upon Chabot's successful Math, Engineering, and Science Achievement (MESA) Program and establishes a new TRIO SSS program that targets students interested in pursuing STEM disciplines, including Health Sciences. This includes students in the following areas as well as other related fields including: physical sciences, engineering, life sciences, math (e.g., number properties and operations, measurement, geometry, data analysis and probability, and algebra), and technology, including technology literacy, hands on workshops, technological innovations, scientific research, biotechnology, electronics, health sciences, communications and health research.

The Chabot College SSS STEM Program seeks to narrow and/or close this gap by providing academic support in STEM fields, enrichment and leadership opportunities, case management, financial aid and financial literacy services. The program recruits from all areas of the college utilizing frequent and intrusive student contacts and strong academic supports, led by science and math faculty, to retain students. Services include a Summer Bridge Program, close monitoring and follow-up on progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and in contact with STEM faculty and staff. This program is a collaborative effort of the math and science faculty and counseling faculty. Funding for the project is in the amount of \$220,000 per year for five years (\$1,100,000) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020.

Background: The Mid-Alameda County Consortium (MACC) was developed in response to AB 86, the planning legislation that requires community colleges, K-12 districts, and community partners to develop regional plans for improving adult education. MACC includes ten member organizations: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College, Las Positas College, Castro Valley Unified School District (Primary for Consortium's Application), Dublin Unified School District, Hayward Unified School District, Livermore Joint Unified School District, Pleasanton Unified School District, San Leandro Unified School District, and San Lorenzo Unified School District. Consortia are required to provide evidence of member participation and appointment of representatives by their respective governing boards in accordance with AB 104, the legislation guiding implementation of AB 86 funds. There is no cost to the district for participating in the consortia since all expenses are covered through AB 104.

Each is aware of the goals and interests of their college and the district in advancing adult education in our region. Adoption of Resolution No. 02-1516— Authorizing the Election to Increase

Retention in Accordance with Public Contract Code Section 7201 – Library

Modernization Project, Building 100, Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> On October 9, 2011, Senate Bill ("SB") 293 was signed into law restricting retention amounts in public construction contracts from exceeding five percent (5%) of the total contract price. This new law is found in Public Contract Code section 7201 and applies to all contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2012 and shall remain in effect until January 1, 2016.

Unless the awarding authority makes a finding in accordance with PCC 7201(b)(4) that retention proceeds on a project may exceed 5% on specific projects where, before putting a project out to bid, (1) the Board of Trustees approves a finding that the proposed project is "substantially complex" and requires a retention amount greater than 5%; and (2) the district includes both the finding and the designated retention amount set by the Board of Trustees in the bid documents put out by the district.

It is requested that the Board of Trustees makes a finding that the project known as Library Modernization; Building 100 at Chabot College is substantially complex and requires retention in the amount of 10% of the total contract price.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees adopts the proposed Resolution No. 02-1516—Authorizing the Election to Increase Retention in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 7201 for the Library Modernization Project, Building 100, Chabot College.
