Background: The Las Positas College Child Development Center has been awarded funding from the California Department of Education (CDE), Early Education and Support Division (EESD) under their California State Preschool Program (CSPP) Expansion for Fiscal Year 2016-17. The funding will be used to open a new State Preschool classroom that will provide access to quality early care and education for underrepresented and income eligible preschool age children and their families.

The proposed award for FY 2015-16 in the amount of \$37,594 will not be used since this is the first award for Las Positas College, and CSPP children were not served in the current school (2015-2016).

The proposed award of \$75,188 will be annualized during the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. This amount will be added to the existing CSPP contract for Chabot College, and is contingent upon the availability of funds in the FY 2016-17 Budget Act.

<u>Background</u>: The Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC), in an effort to support the Career Catalyst program, provides life-shaping career opportunities for individuals and recruitment solutions for employers by pairing qualified individuals with organizations for work and job training. Career Catalyst is an "employer-of-record" service which enters into an agreement with the Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC), who in turn provides colleges with student interns while the FCCC takes care of onboarding, payroll, HR, and workers compensation.

Acceptance of Amendment to the Grant Sub-Award Agreement - National Institutes of Health (NIH) Bridges Baccalaureate Program with the University

of California, Berkeley (UCB), Chabot College

Background: Chabot College received a grant sub-award from UC Berkeley in 2011 and the Board approved the agreement April 19, 2011. The agreement was part of a NIH Bridges to the Baccalaureate Program that the UCB Transfer Alliance Project is leading in partnership with Chabot and Merritt Colleges. The program aims to substantially increase the transfer of students from underrepresented minority populations to biomedical and behavioral science degree programs at four-year institutions. Chabot will target new and continuing Chabot students in key majors, specifically students in pre-nursing/allied health students and those in specific introductory major-specific courses. Grant funds pay for faculty and staff time to conduct program activities and achieve project outcomes.

This amendment renews their annual commitment and incorporates the No-Cost Extension that was recently obtained for UCB's Prime Award. A request was submitted on March 10, 2016 before the original performance end date of March 31, 2016 to extend the Grant Sub-Award (Agreement 00007618) period of performance through August 31, 2016. The amount funded for this grant sub-award is increased by \$34,439 and increases the total awarded from \$93,418.82 to a total of \$127,857.82

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$127,857.82 for the period of April 1, 2011 through August 31, 2016.

<u>Background</u>: The 2014-15 budget signed by Governor Brown provided funding on a one-time basis to "create greater incentive for California Community Colleges to develop, enhance, retool, and expand quality career technical education offerings that build upon existing community college regional capacity to respond to regional labor market needs." The legislation provided for the funds to be distributed through the regional consortia to their member colleges, and the 28-college Bay region is to receive a total of \$11,316,648.

This proposed Amendment is for an approval of an additional \$5,000 for a total award of \$367,761 for Chabot College.

The College will continue to use its share of the Enhancement Funds in the following program areas by the Contract end date June 30, 2016:

<u>Background:</u> Solano County's Health and Social Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide training to people who work with the out of home children and youth of Solano County since 2003-04. The County has requested that we continue to provide training services for the 2016-17 fiscal year.

As with the prior contracts, we will be working closely with our partners, A Better Way, Aldea, Alternative Family Services and Seneca Center, to deliver training to their own staff as well as to other Solano County community-based agencies serving foster children. Additionally, the County's Child Welfare Services incorporates training for their staff as part of this contract. The contract is funded through Title IV-E federal funds, and the reimbursement is in the amount of \$752,055.
