<u>Background</u>: Chabot College will provide community college and high school faculty with scholarships to attend the 3-day Community College Entrepreneurship Pathway (CCEP) conference to be held at Chabot College on March 2-4, 2017.

Chabot College will host the Community College Entrepreneur Pathway (CCEP) conference which provides community colleges with a program fostering entrepreneurial education and development. Through CCEP, community college faculty members receive curricula, classroom tools and community support to aid in the delivery of entrepreneurial knowledge and skills to their students. <u>Background</u>: The purpose of this MOU between City of Hayward and Chabot College is to define a working relationship in preparation for and responding to certain disaster situations by permitting American Red Cross to use campus facilities on a temporary basis as an emergency public shelter. Within the Terms and Conditions, this MOU provides the framework for cooperation and support between the City of Hayward and Chabot College in assisting citizens of the community who have been impacted by disaster, as well as other services for which cooperation may be mutually beneficial.

Upon activation of Chabot College as a Shelter Facility, the City of Hayward will have the facility added to its list of insured assets as soon as practicable.

The City of Hayward agrees to reimburse reasonable costs associated with damage to the facility or other property, actual out-of-pocket operational expenditures, and reasonable costs associated with food and custodial services that Chabot College will provide if available.

The term of this agreement begins on the date of signature and terminates 30 days after written notice by either party.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves this Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Hayward for use of campus facility as temporary emergency shelter, Chabot College. The term of the MOU begins from the date of signature until 30 days after written notice of termination by either party. Cross for use of Campus Facility as Temporary Emergency Shelter, Chabot

College

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this MOU between American Red Cross and Chabot College is to define a working relationship in preparation for and responding to certain disaster situations by permitting American Red Cross to use campus facilities on a temporary basis as an emergency public shelter. Within the Terms and Conditions, this MOU provides the framework for cooperation and support between the American Red Cross and Chabot College in assisting citizens of the community who have been impacted by disaster, as well as other services for which cooperation may be mutually beneficial.

The American Red Cross will carry insurance coverage in the amounts of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence for Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability. The American Red Cross will also carry Workers' Compensation coverage with statutory limits for the jurisdiction within which facility is located and \$1,000,000 in Employers' Liability.

The American Red Cross agrees to reimburse reasonable costs associated with damage to the facility or other property, actual out-of-pocket operational expenditures, and reasonable costs associated with food and custodial services that Chabot College will provide if available.

The term of this agreement begins on the date of signature and terminates 30 days after written notice by either party.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves this Memorandum of Understanding with American Red Cross for use of campus facility as temporary emergency shelter, Chabot College. The term of the MOU is from the date of signature until 30 days after written notice of termination by either party. Approval of Award of a Piggyback Contract for Furniture and Equipment for

Chabot College, Building 2300-Health Resource Center using the

CollegeBuys Purchasing Program

<u>Background</u>: District Staff is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of furniture for Chabot College, Building 2300-Health Resource Center for the sole use of the Chabot College's Health Resource Center facility. To make the purchase of the required furniture items, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The CollegeBuys Purchasing Program is a cooperative purchasing program made available by the Foundation for California Community Colleges. The CollegeBuys contract planned for this use is the furniture contract with Krueger International, Inc. This piggybackable contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award of the San Mateo Community College District.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed award of a piggyback contract for furniture & equipment for Chabot College, Building 2300-Health Resource Center using the CollegeBuys Purchasing Program, to Krueger International, Inc. of Green Bay, Wisconsin in the respective amounts including taxes, not to exceed \$151,349.62. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the purchase order on behalf of the District.

Adoption of Resolution No. 06-1617— Authorizing the Election to Increase

Retention for the Arcade Voluntary Seismic Upgrade Project at Chabot

College, in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 7201

Background: On October 9, 2011, Senate Bill ("SB") 293 was signed into law restricting retention amounts in public construction contracts from exceeding five percent (5%) of the total contract price. This new law is found in Public Contract Code section 7201 and applies to all contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2012 and shall remain in effect until January 1, 2016. On September 27, 2014, Assembly Bill ("AB") 1705 amends sections 7201 and 10261 of the Public Contract Code to extend existing law until January 1, 2018.

Unless the awarding authority makes a finding in accordance with PCC 7201(b)(4) that retention proceeds on a project may exceed 5% on specific projects where, before putting a project out to bid, (1) the Board of Trustees approves a finding that the proposed project is "substantially complex" and requires a retention amount greater than 5%; and (2) the district includes the finding, the designated retention amount set by the Board of Trustees, and the description of the uniqueness of the project in the bid documents put out by the district.

It is requested that the Board of Trustees makes a finding that the project known as Arcade Voluntary Seismic Upgrade, Building 100 at Chabot College is substantially complex and requires retention in the amount of 10% of the total contract price due to the substantial complexity of constructing a multi-phase seismic strengthening project on an occupied campus.

WHEREAS, AB 1705 amends Public Contract Code Section 7201 and 10261 allows Districts to withhold up to ten (10) percent of the Project retention in cases where the Governing Board has found that the Project is substantially complex and that the unique project is not regularly, customarily, or routinely performed by the agency or licensed contractors; and

WHEREAS, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has decided it is in the best interest of the District's students, faculty, staff and the facilities modernization program to bid out the Arcade Voluntary Seismic Upgrade, Building 100, Chabot College ("Project") under the election to increase retention;

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District finds the election to increase retention for the Project which involves the substantially complex seismic strengthening in multiple phases of a reinforced cast-in-place concrete arcade on an occupied campus;

<u>Background</u>: Safety Center, Inc. is an organization founded in 1934 whose mission is to reduce injuries and save lives by providing safety education and training. They accomplish this mission by promoting lifelong safety and health through a variety of community and professional programs.

Safety Center, Inc. and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's OSHA Training Center created a Memorandum of Understanding in June 2010, to serve the training needs of those who are located in the Sacramento Valley and adjacent communities, and have been working together since then. This MOU continues the relationship with an updated agreement for the current fiscal year; renewing annually subject to termination by either party.
