Education for the California Early Childhood Mentor Program, Chabot College

Background: Resolution No. 06-1516 was adopted by the Board of Trustees at its June 21, 2016 meeting, authorizing Chabot College to apply for a contract with the California Department of Education. Chabot College received the contract, in the amount of \$2,866,295, to continue operating the California Early Childhood Mentor Program with 104 participating colleges, including Chabot College, and to serve as fiscal agent from the period beginning August 1, 2016 through July 31, 2017. At its January 17, 2017 meeting, the Board of Trustees authorized Chabot College to seek enhancement of the initially requested funding in the amount of \$99,893.15, bringing the total contract to \$2,966,188.15.

Continuing a trend established over the past several years, Chabot College was awarded the contract renewal and contract amendment from the California Department of Education to serve as lead organization for this statewide program. The confirming documentation was received after the expected effective dates. The College now seeks Board approval.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the Agreement with the California Department of Education for the California Early Childhood Mentor Program, Chabot College, in the amount of \$2,866,295, and the Amendment of that contract in the amount of \$99,893.15. Acceptance of Award - California Department of Education (CDE), Early Education and Support Division (EESD), Alameda County Individualized Child Care Subsidy Pilot Plan, and Chabot-Las Positas Community College

District

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been awarded funding from the California Department of Education (CDE), Early Education and Support Division (EESD) under their California State Preschool Program (CSPP) and the Alameda County Individualized Child Care Subsidy Pilot Plan for Fiscal Year 2016-17.

The additional funding request was submitted by the Alameda County Child Care Planning Council due to the cost of quality child care and high cost of living in the Bay Area. The request was on behalf of all State preschool programs in Alameda County and was approved in October 2016. The approval increases the daily full time rate from \$38.53 to \$43.43. This increase provides additional funding to support quality early care and education for underrepresented and income eligible preschool children and their families.

Additional funding will be in the amount of \$67,467. This amount will be added to the existing 2016-17 CDE-CSPP contract for Chabot-Las Positas Community College and contingent upon the availability of funds in the FY 2016-17 Budget Act with the effective date of April 19, 2017.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the proposed Award from the California Department of Education (CDE), Early Education and Support Division (EESD), Alameda County Individualized Child Care Subsidy Pilot Plan, and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District in the amount of \$67,467 for the period of July1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. <u>Background</u>: The purpose of this agreement is to establish Chabot College as a partner in the Alameda County Community Food Bank (ACCFB) College Pantry Program with the purpose of allowing Chabot College to distribute food from ACCFB to students on the Chabot Campus.

In this agreement, ACCFB agrees to provide food, administrative oversight, leadership, and training to Chabot College. Produce and donated products will be provided to Chabot College free of charge and with access to additional items available through a Purchase Program. ACCFB shall also identify and procure staple food items and/or supplies necessary for the operation of the program. Chabot College agrees to distribute food free of charge, maintain food distribution and storage facilities according to ACCFB standards, ensure that all staff and volunteers receive proper training before engaging in distribution, and communicate regularly with ACCFB regarding needs, changes to the program, etc. In initiating the agreement, ACCFB has confirmed that the recently completed renovations to the Student Initiative Center in Building 2300 and pending purchase of a refrigerator are sufficient to satisfy the facility requirements for executing the agreement.

This agreement has been reviewed by the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Business Services, and was recommended for approval on March 15, 2017, with the effective date of April 19, 2017.

Background: Through the Memorandum of Understanding with Stanford ValleyCare Health System (Hospital) and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (School), first approved at the May 1, 2003 Board of Trustees meeting, the colleges and district of the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District have participated in a collaborative education working relationship.

We are combining the existing contracts with both schools under one contract provided by the Hospital. Exhibit A will cover required language and requirements for the Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) for the Chabot Nursing Program. Exhibit B will cover required language and requirements for the Las Positas Emergency Medical Technician and Paramedic Programs.

As a contribution to community health education, the Hospital would like to continue providing students at Chabot-Las Positas Community College District the opportunity to gain practical clinical experience at the facilities. The hospital will continue to be an active partner in supporting healthcare education through the provision of clinical placements for healthcare program students for a five-year period from April 1, 2017 through April 1, 2022, unless terminated within 90 days by either party.

A community college district has the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent provided that the Board of Trustees approves the spending determination in an open session of a public meeting. The district shall not use any of the funds from the Education Protection Account for salaries or benefits of administrators or any other administrative costs. In addition, the Act requires that a) the district publish on its Internet web site an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent, and b) the annual independent financial and compliance audit shall verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required.

It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to direct district administration to ensure that the other required actions by the district be fulfilled.
