Demonstration Project

<u>Background</u>: Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority (LAVTA) provides public transit service within the cities of Dublin, Livermore, Pleasanton, and the immediately adjacent unincorporated areas of Alameda County within its jurisdiction, by offering local, intercity, and interregional express bus services, including 15 minute service to Las Positas College with quick, convenient connections to Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) and Altamont Corridor Express (ACE) trains. The goal of the demonstration project is to ascertain the potential usage of a Transit Pass Demonstration Project, and to provide information necessary to plan for a long-term Transit Pass Program.

LAVTA and Las Positas College desire to enter into this MOU for the second year to coordinate the Las Positas College Transit Pass Demonstration Project, which will allow all Las Positas College students and employees the privilege of riding the Wheels and Rapid fixed route system free of charge from August 16, 2017 through the last day of the summer term of 2018. The goal of the demonstration project is to ascertain the potential usage of a Transit Pass Demonstration Project, and to provide the information necessary to plan for a long-term Transit Pass Program.

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College has received notification from the Alameda County Social Services Agency of its intent to renew a grant for the continuation of services for the Community Action to Reach Out to Infants (CARI) Program.

Under the CARI Program, the College provides specialized, pre-designed training for potential Resource Families (previously Foster Parents, Kinship Caregivers) and Respite Providers to care for children that enter Alameda County's Child Protective Services through drug exposure, HIV, neglect or abuse. This will be the fifteenth year the Alameda County Board of Supervisors has chosen to reconfirm its dedication to the ideals of service to the community through the maintenance of this partnership with the College.

The Alameda County Social Service Agency will recommend for approval, to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors, the grant renewal amount of \$38,986.00. The contract is effective for services rendered from September 20, 2017-June 30, 2018. The Board of Trustees initially approved this grant in 2003, as item 4.2 of the August 19, 2003 meeting agenda. The most recent renewal was in 2016, under item 4.11 of the October 18, 2016 meeting agenda.

Approval of Contract with the California Department of Education for the

California Early Childhood Mentor Program, and associated subcontracts with

Community Colleges, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The California Early Childhood Mentor Program, has been contracted under the California Department of Education for 22 years. The Mentor Program was developed at Chabot in 1988 with the support of private foundations. It relocated to City College of San Francisco (CCSF) in 2001 but moved back to Chabot on August 1, 2013. The program offers a unique strategy to improve the quality of early care and education through building a mechanism to train and retain qualified staff.

The program selects and provides advanced training to experienced ECE teachers and Directors who become Mentors. Mentor teachers then earn stipends for using their classroom as an environment to train student teachers. Director mentors work with current or aspiring Early Childhood Directors to enhance the leadership and program quality in the field. The student teachers earn community college, university or high school credit for a practicum completed under the guidance of the Mentor. Both the availability of compensation and ongoing training contribute to improving the quality of early care and education in the Mentor's and the student teacher's classrooms.

The program makes it possible for early childhood students to complete their Practicum course (included in the Curriculum Alignment Project's (CAP) Lower Division Eight). The Practicum course is part of the Degrees offered by all 104 partner community colleges. The Board of Trustees has previously approved this contract and its accompanying subcontracts beginning April 16, 2013 and subsequently each year since the contract came back to Chabot College in 2013 with the Chabot College, Chabot –Las Positas Community College District acting as the lead fiscal agent. The contract authorizes CLPCCD-Chabot College, to subcontract with 104 California Community Colleges. The subcontracts are in accordance with the program details and budget outlined in the award. A template of the subcontract has been attached for review and approval.

This agreement is being executed as of September 20, 2017 for the contract term of August 1, 2017-July 31, 2018. The contracted amount is not to exceed \$2,921,295.00 and authorizes CLPCCD-Chabot College to subcontract with 104 California Community Colleges to satisfy the terms of the contract.

Approval of Grant Contract — Alameda County Social Services Agency, Children and Family Services for the Resource Family Approval (RFA) Program, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot and Las

Positas Colleges

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been contracting with Alameda County Social Services Agency, Children and Family Services providing services for the Parent Resources, Information, Development and Education (PRIDE) pre-service training program for many years. The State developed a uniform name and requirements for all State pre-service training programs beginning January 2017. The services requested for the 2017-18 school year at Chabot-Las Positas Colleges essentially remain the same as the past 10 years.

The Colleges will continue to offer childcare, food, and related supplies/miscellaneous items to the participants of the pre-service RFA training classes while they are attending these classes. The Colleges will offer more RFA classes and also offer train-the-trainer workshops to develop new RFA trainers.

The RFA classes inform and prepare potential foster and adoptive parents in making successful, permanent connections with foster youth. These classes are now required for resource families who were formally known adoptive parents, foster parents, kinship families and guardians. Classes are also available to respite providers and the general public who are interested in understanding the needs of children in out-of-home care, and are under the protection of the Department's Foster Care System.

The Alameda County Social Service Agency will recommend for approval to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors, the preliminary grant renewal amount of \$193,746.00 for the period of September 20, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

Las Positas College

Background: Las Positas College (LPC) is offering an Adaptive Horticulture training program during the 2017-2018 academic year. The Adaptive Horticulture training program requires that instructional aides and/or special education instructors be provided at a ratio between 1:2 to 1:4 aide/instructor to student based on anticipated student needs determined jointly by Pleasanton Unified School District (PUSD) and LPC. Based on the ratios, PUSD will provide employment for the instructional aides and/or special education instructors. The instructional aides and/or special education instructors will be required to comply with LPC's background screening and proof of negative tuberculosis test. Further, the instructional aides and/or special education instructors will submit the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Volunteer Clearance paperwork. The MOU will be valid through August 3, 2020.

Background: The Inter-Industry Conference on Auto Collision Repair (I-CAR) is a well-known international non-profit organization that offers education and training for the automotive collision repair industry. <u>Background</u>: Las Positas College entered into an agreement with the San Jose Evergreen Community College District, lead agent for the California Department of Education CCPT grant that the San Jose Evergreen Community College District received on July 1, 2015, and will end on June 30, 2019. The Board approved the original agreement at their October 20, 2015 meeting.

The CCPT grant focus is to build robust partnerships between employers, schools, and community colleges, in order to better prepare students for the 21st century workplace and improve student transition into postsecondary education, training, and employment. It is part of a larger regional project for contextualized classroom and student experience with linkages to industry and employers, through a continuum of work-based learning opportunities.

Las Positas College initially received \$400,000. The College is investing its share of the Career Pathways Trust funds in the following program areas: Computer Information Technology, Computer Network Technology, STEM Core, and Engineering Technology.

Subsequently, the San Jose Evergreen Community College District notified Las Positas College that additional funds are available to partnering community college. The additional allocation is in the amount of \$150,000 yielding a total of \$550,000 for Las Positas College. These funds must be fully spent by June 30, 2019.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the proposed Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – California Career Pathway Trust (CCPT) Partnership Agreement with the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College; and the San Jose Evergreen Community College District. It is further recommended that the Board authorizes the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Adoption of Resolution No. 05-1718 - Authorizing Use of Design/Build Delivery

Method for the Athletic Field Improvements, Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> The Design/Build Delivery method offers many advantages to the District, particularly in terms of the project schedule by allowing a phased approach to the project. Phased submittal of design documents to the Division of State Architect (DSA) allows the Design/Build Team to begin construction activities on the site work while the detailed design is undergoing DSA review. Additional advantages of the Design/Build Delivery method include:

- It establishes a single point of contact for both design and construction because the architect and engineering consultants work for the design/build entity.
- It shifts risk to the design/build entity for errors and omissions in drawings and for associated construction costs.
- It allows early involvement during the design phase by the builder, i.e., it "adds construction practicality to design imagination."
- It produces a compressed time schedule as a result of phased permitting approvals, as referenced above
- The design/build entity negotiates subcontracts and, because it has a continuing relationship with the subcontractors, the subcontractors are often more reliable.
- It allows the District to negotiate a guaranteed maximum price for the finished project early in the process, and produces lower project costs for the District.

Education Code §81700 (AB 1000) requires that the Board of Trustees adopt a resolution authorizing use of the design-build project delivery method prior to completing the State-sanctioned prequalification process and issuing Requests for Proposals to prequalified design-build entities for projects delivered via the Design/Build Delivery Method.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees Adopt Resolution No. 05-1718 — Authorizing Use of Design/Build Delivery Method for the Athletic Field Improvements, Chabot College.

Award—Alameda County Workforce Development Board (ACWDB) to the Tri-

Valley One Stop Career Center, District - Economic Development

Background: To continue its work serving unemployed and under-employed persons in our area, the Tri-Valley One Stop Career Center (TVOS) has been awarded a Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) grant in the amount of \$374,197 for program year 2017-2018, for the Adult and Dislocated Workers' Programs. The TVOS's job training system is designed to increase the employment, retention and earnings of participants, and to increase occupational skill attainment of participants. The goals of these efforts are to improve the quality of the workforce, reduce welfare dependency, and enhance the productivity and competitiveness of the nation. TVOS will continue to provide a streamlined service system, which includes empowering individuals through information and access to training resources, providing universal access to core services, providing locally defined programs to meet the needs of employers and improving services to youth.

The Board of Trustees accepted similar Alameda County Workforce Development Board grants for \$327,269 on 6/26/07, item 5.3; \$385,000 on 6/24/08, item 5.4; \$545,000 on 10/20/09, item 5.10; \$408,890 on 7/20/10, item 5.7; \$393,633 on 7/19/11, item 5.4; \$447,199 on 7/17/12, item 5.5; \$394,033 on 6/25/13, item 5.4; \$391,499 on 6/17/14, item 4.5; \$348,402 on 8/15/15, item 7.2; and \$328,402 on 8/16/16, item 7.1.

The contract package was received at Chabot-Las Positas Community College District on August 18, 2017, delaying the request for Board approval until the September 19, 2017 meeting. We are requesting that the Board approve the contract for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees accepts the proposed Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Grant Award from the Alameda County Workforce Development Board (ACWDB) to the Tri-Valley One Stop Career Center, District-Economic Development, in the amount of \$374,197 for the fiscal year 2017-2018.
