Adoption of Resolution No. 07-1718 Certifying the Mitigated Negative

Declaration was Prepared Pursuant to and in Accordance with the California Environmental Act (CEQA) for the Chabot College 2012 Facilities Master Plan

<u>Background</u>: The 2012 Chabot College Facilities Master Plan (Project) builds upon the facilities and infrastructure completed under the 2005 Facilities Master Plan, identifying a range of new facilities and improvements to complete the campus. Eight new buildings would be constructed, three existing buildings would be renovated, and the baseball field would be rebuilt and various athletic facilities would be renovated. Project construction would occur over the next ten years.

An Initial Study for the Project was prepared by PLACEMAKERS, a Land Use and Environmental Planning Consultant and dated September 2017. The Initial Study concluded that although the proposed Project could have a significant effect on the environment, there will not be a significant effect in this case because the mitigation measures identified in the Initial Study that would reduce all potentially significant impacts to a less-than-significant level have been agreed to by the District. Thus, it was determined that a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) would be prepared. A Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project was circulated, along with the MND, on September 25, 2017 to the State Clearinghouse, responsible public agencies and posted with the Alameda County Clerk. The Notice of Intent and MND was made available on the Chabot College website. The 30-day public review period commenced on September 25, 2017 and concluded on October 24, 2017. One letter was received from the Department of Transportation (Caltrans).

<u>Recommended Action:</u> That the Board of Trustees adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration/Initial Study for the Chabot College 2012 Facilities Master Plan, adopt the CEQA Findings of Fact for the Project, adopt the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program for the Project and approve the Project.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 07-1718

ADOPTION OF THE MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION/INITIAL STUDY FOR THE CHABOT COLLEGE 2012 FACILITIES MASTER PLAN PROJECT, ADOPTING FINDINGS PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT, ADOPTING THE MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM, AND APPROVING THE CHABOT COLLEGE 2012 FACILITIES MASTER PLAN PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Chabot Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees ("Board") proposes to replace and upgrade existing obsolete facilities, improve on-campus pedestrian and vehicular circulation, enhance daily student activity and open up vistas from and to the campus and the community at the Chabot College campus located at 25555 Hesperian Boulevard, Hayward, California; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Chabot College 2012 Facilities Master Plan Project ("Project") would increase facilities capacity at the school over the next ten years; and

WHEREAS, Chabot Las Positas Community College District is the lead agency for the Project, and has caused to be prepared the Mitigated Negative Declaration/Initial Study ("MND/IS", SCH No. 2005092081) for the Project, which was available for review from September 25, 2017 through October 24, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the MND/IS for the Project was prepared pursuant to and in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code, § 21000 et seq., "CEQA") and the Guidelines for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (Title 14, Cal. Code of Regs., § 15000 et seq., the CEQA "Guidelines"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Public Resources Section 21082.1 the Board has independently reviewed and analyzed the information contained in: (1) the MND/IS and (2) Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program ("MMRP"), (collectively the "MND/IS") and the conclusions of the MND/IS reflect the independent judgment of the Board; and

WHEREAS, Chabot Las Positas Community College District posted the Notice of Intent to adopt the MND/IS and the MND/IS on their website and made a copy of the MND/IS available for public review at their administrative office located at 7600 Dublin Boulevard, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Dublin, CA 94545; and

WHEREAS, one comment letter on the MND/IS was received from the Department of Transportation during the 30-day public review period from September 25, 2017 through October 24, 2017 and staff has addressed these comments; and

WHEREAS, all actions required to be taken by applicable law relating to the preparation, circulation, and review of the MND/IS have been taken; and

WHEREAS, the CEQA Findings of Fact included as Exhibit "1," attached hereto and incorporated herein, identify the following impacts: the Project will not result in any significant impacts for the topical areas of Agricultural and Forestry Resources, Cultural Resources, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, Hydrology and Water Quality, Land Use and Planning, Mineral Resources, Population and Housing,

Public Services, Recreation, Transportation and Circulation, and Utilities and Service Systems, therefore, no mitigation is required for these areas; and significant impacts will be reduced to a less-than-significant level with incorporation of the recommended mitigation measures for all of the identified significant effects for the topical areas of Aesthetics, Air Quality, Biological Resources, Geology and Soils, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, and Noise.

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed and considered the Final MND/IS and MMRP with respect to the Project; and

WHEREAS, approval of the Project and construction of the improvements described in the Project, will advance the public health, safety and welfare and further Chabot Las Positas Community College District's statutory public education purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Chabot Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees meeting held on November 14, 2017, the following:

#### **SECTION 1:**

That the above recitals are true and correct.

#### **SECTION 2**

The MND/IS for the Project is an adequate and complete document completed in accordance with CEQA and the CEQA Guidelines.

#### **SECTION 3**

The Board hereby certifies that Chabot Las Positas Community College District is the lead agency for the Project, that the Board, as the governing board of the lead agency, has reviewed and considered the MND/IS and the information contained therein prior to deciding whether to approve the proposed Project, including all comments received thereon and responses thereto; and the Board finds that the MND/IS reflects the independent judgment and analysis of the Board.

#### **SECTION 4:**

The Board hereby makes and adopts the CEQA Findings of Fact and mitigation measures set forth in Exhibit "1."

#### **SECTION 5:**

A Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) has been prepared to meet the requirements of Public Resources Code Section 21081.6. This program is designed to ensure compliance with Project changes and mitigation measures imposed to avoid or reduce to a less-than-significant level the significant effects identified in the MND/IS. The Board hereby adopts the MMRP, as set forth in Exhibit "2."

#### SECTION 6:

These actions having been taken and findings having been made, the Board hereby approves, certifies, and adopts the MND/IS for the Project.

#### **SECTION 7**

The Chabot Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees hereby approves the Project, consisting of program facilities, which are further described in the MND/IS and authorizes and directs staff to implement the Project in a manner consistent with the terms hereof.

Acceptance of Grant Agreement No. 17-034-006 - California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) Grant Award, Chabot-Las Positas Community College

District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College has been awarded a \$74,515 grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Funds support continuing a MESA (Math, Engineering, Science Achievement) Program at Chabot College. The MESA program academically prepares its program students for transfer to four-year institutions to assure their ability to attain baccalaureate degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) fields.

The MESA program model is comprised of 13 Core Components that include: Academic Excellence Workshops that teach collaborative learning techniques, a special orientation course for MESA students, a dedicated study center, career advising and exploration of STEM options, transfer assistance, scholarships and partnerships with student and professional organizations. The Chabot MESA Program will provide all 13 Core MESA Components which includes frequent, sustained and prolonged academic and student support services, including case management by the MESA Counselor.

The Chabot MESA Program will benefit all Chabot students, but will target underrepresented minorities in STEM, in particular Latino, African-American, and Pacific-Islander students. Taking into account the student population at Chabot, we will also be targeting low-income, first-generation students majoring in STEM fields. The program will serve a total of 125 students from these targeted populations.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$74,515 for the funding year 2017-2018 for the period beginning November 15, 2017 through June 30, 2018, and can be renewed each of the succeeding two years, to a maximum of three years.

with the Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE) and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot Area Counselor Collaborative

(CACC) for the Career Ladders Project

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College has received an amendment of \$26,750 for the 2017-2018 program year from the Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE). Funds support the Chabot Area Counselor Collaborative (CACC) and led by Chabot College. The CACC meets monthly at Chabot and works to help all high school and Chabot Counseling staff to become familiar with career requirements, options, and opportunities.

The funds support contracting with Career Ladders Project to provide 175 hours of both technical and strategic planning support for the 65 members of the Chabot Area Counseling Collaborative members serving thousands of local partner high school district students. The working goals of the CACC are aimed to improve counseling services and increase equity and student success through seamless transitions for students to Chabot pathways, continued counselor professional development about the needs and services to resilient youth, and increased career readiness.

The Board approved the original MOU as Item 4.14 at the October 20, 2015 Board meeting. The amendment is in the amount of \$26,750 with the effective date of November 15, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Amendment to the Career Pathway Trust Partnership Agreement with the Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE) and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot Area Counselor Collaborative (CACC) for the Career Ladders Project in the amount of \$ 26,750 for the performance period of November 15, 2017 through June 30, 2018. Background: The Board of Trustees accepted the CCCCO IDRC Grant at the June 21, 2016 meeting as Item 4.9. At the November 15, 2016, the CCCLPD Board of Trustees accepted subaward agreements for 10 community college district partners as part of the implementation of IDRC grant activities as detailed in the grant proposal as Item 4.3. The grant supports the work of the IDRC Automotive Technology Urban Area Consortium which includes 10 large urban colleges - 6 in the San Francisco Bay region and 4 in the Los Angeles-Orange County area. At this time, eight of the college agreements require revisions to either reduce or increase the funding.

The goal of the IDRC Automotive Technology Urban Area Consortium is to enhance curriculum through employer input and engagement so that automotive technology students master the skills necessary for becoming successful employees. To achieve this goal, three major objectives have been identified: expand instruction of appropriate content knowledge, improve student "soft skill" performance, and refine these abilities through improved work experience (internship) opportunities. Specific deliverables include revisions (piloting or modification) to Hybrid, EV and Fuel Cell curriculum; identification of needed soft skills followed by the use of skill assessment tools and appropriate training; and the expansion of work experience opportunities using the internship practices found to be most effective.

Acceptance of Grant Agreement No. 17-057-001 - California Community

College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), Guided Pathways Grant Award, District

Economic Development

Background: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) was awarded a grant by the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) to serve as the fiscal agent and project manager for the California Guided Pathways Project, which entails a systemic approach to community college reform, intended to increase the number of students who successfully achieve their education goals. Implementing Guided Pathways requires an institution-wide transformation process that will require a multi-year vision and implementation by each college. CLPCCD's Department of Economic Development will create and administer contracts along with providing fiscal oversight, serving as project manager, hiring vendors and creating subcontractors as required.

The award amount of the CCCCO Agreement No. 17-057-001 is \$15,000,000, which includes funding for required staffing as well as administrative overhead costs. The term of this grant is November 15, 2017 to December 31, 2021.
