Acceptance of Amendment #2 to the Basic Skills Student Outcomes and Transformation (BSSOT) Grant Agreement from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), Division of Academic Affairs, to Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College (#16-068-046)

Background: The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, Basic Skills Student Outcomes and Transformation grant was awarded to Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College in July 2016. The Community Colleges Basic Skills and Student Outcomes Transformation Program seeks to improve the progression rate of basic skills students from remedial education to college level instruction. The purpose of these grants is to enable colleges receiving an award to implement or expand innovations and redesign in the areas of assessment, student services, and instruction.

The original grant agreement was approved as Item 4.1 at the August 16, 2016 Board meeting with Amendment #1 approved as Item 4.8 at the July 18, 2017 Board meeting. Amendment #2 is a no-cost extension that maintains the same terms as the original agreement but extends the end date for six more months. This amendment maintains the original award amount of \$1,067,773 and extends the grant period of performance to December 31, 2018 for a new funding period of July 19, 2016 - June 30, 2018.

with California State University, East Bay (PR# U215N170023) and Chabot-Las

Positas Community College District, Chabot College

Background: Chabot Las-Positas Community College District, Chabot College is entering into a sub-award agreement with California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) for a total of \$261,646. The agreement is part of a U.S. Department of Education Promise Neighborhoods implementation grant that CSUEB received in January 2018. Grant funds pay for implementing activities with CSUEB and multiple partners as part of the South Hayward Promise Neighborhood to build a cradle-to-career continuum of solutions that targets residents in the Tennyson Corridor. Partners include the City of Hayward, 4C's of Alameda County, Eden Area ROP, Hayward Unified School District, La Familia Counseling, Tiburcio Vazquez Health Center, Alameda County Public Health Department, and the Eden Youth & Family Center.

Chabot agrees to implement the strategies and solutions it has committed to as outlined in the agreement. The CSUEB grant covers a five-year project period from 1/1/2018 - 12/31/2022. This sub-award will take effect upon approval by the Board of Trustees. Award amounts over the project period are detailed below.

Year One: \$261,646 Year Two: \$401,406 Year Three: \$415,164 Year Four: \$416,951 Year Five: \$433,099

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College Children's Center has been in partnership with Child, Family and Community Services, Inc. (CFCS) providing comprehensive Head Start services. These services include developmentally based education programs for children, comprehensive family support services, parent education activities, quarterly center/parent meetings, a minimum of two home visits per year per child and two parent/teacher conferences.

The Board of Trustees has previously approved Head Start Program Partnership Agreements for the College in 1999. Most recently the agreement was extended on August 15, 2017 under item 4.7. By its terms the agreement continues year-to-year, contingent on federal funding and subject to cancellation upon 21 days' notice. Periodically, as now, we are asked by CFCS to reaffirm the contract. At this time, we are reaffirming the contract for the period beginning March 1, 2018 and continuing forward to February 28, 2019.

Background: Chabot College and Hayward Unified School District, Student Parent Support Programs (HUSD-SPSP) wish to continue an agreement allowing HUSD-SPSP to reimburse Chabot College to provide college-level courses in the instructional areas of Anthropology, Business, Ethnic Studies, Health, Humanities, Music, Philosophy, Protective Services, Psychology, Sign Language, Sociology, Arts, and Theater for degree-level credit courses to be offered to middle school, high school, and adult school students during the Summer 2018, Fall 2018, and Spring 2019 term. HUSD-SPSP has received a 21st Century ASSET's, 21st Century Community Learning Centers, and Parent University Grants to reimburse Chabot College for these courses. This agreement will improve HUSD-SPSP student's connection with higher education and increase opportunities for high school students within Hayward Unified School District to attend college, including joining pathway cohorts that are currently in place or being developed at Chabot College.

The Board of Trustees has previously approved the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Hayward Unified School District, Student Support Programs for the College under item 4.2, May 18, 2015, item 4.2, September 15, 2015, item 4.7, June 21, 2016 and item 4.6, June 20, 2017.

K-14 Pathways Regional Joint Venture Project Partner - Chabot-Las Positas

Community College District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: This Regional Joint Venture asks for co-investments from BACCC and interested colleges within the Bay Region for coordination of regional assets. Coordinated assets will be used to host professional development opportunities for regional partners and jointly invest in technical assistance resources, including around Career Pathway mapping & development, Work-based Learning, Dual Enrollment, Get Focused...Stay Focused, Career Pathway marketing and Career Pathway data. This Regional Joint Venture allows the region to build capacity around connections to K12 partners, increase enrollment pipelines from K12, and support student preparation and persistence once arriving in college.

The K-14 Pathways Regional Joint Venture specifically addresses the following, which is an excerpt from the Strong Workforce Application, and approved as a Certified Project Proposal:

- 1) Developing & Mapping Career Pathways, which includes: a) Regional/sub-regional professional development sessions (career pathways mapping, others); and, b) Documenting career pathways development processes and promising practices.
- 2) Increasing Early College Credit, which includes: a) Facilitating a dual-enrollment community of practice; and, b) Regional/sub-regional professional development sessions (CATEMA, dual enrollment, others).
- 3) Expanding Early Interventions & Awareness of Pathways, which includes: a) Facilitating sub-regional counselor collaborations between K12 and College counselors; b) Providing Technical Assistance on exploration and implementation of college and career readiness curriculum & tools; and, c) Hosting a GTE Counselor Summit.
- 4) Documenting and Systematizing Work-Based Learning, which includes: a) Documenting employer engagement and work-based learning activities and identifying unmet needs, by campus; b) Professional development for college staff engaged in WBL/industry engagement; c) Facilitating alignment of college standards for WBL; and, d) Developing plans for coordinated "asks" across colleges.

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The period of performance noted in the MOU coincides with the relevant state funding period from the state Strong Workforce Program, which is from July 1, 2016 through December 31, 2018. However, this MOU and activities associated with it will take effect and begin upon approval by the Board of Trustees.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – Strong Workforce Program K-14 Pathways Regional Joint Venture Project Partner - Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College. Contract Renewal - College and Career Access Pathways Partnership Agreement for

Dual Enrollment between San Lorenzo Unified School District and Chabot Las-

Positas Community College District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership Agreement is to provide high school students in San Lorenzo Unified School District an opportunity to earn early college credit at Chabot College while enrolled in high school. The intent is to offer and expand dual enrollment opportunities. These course offerings are consistent with the provisions of AB 288 (Education Code § 76004), for high school students who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education.

The goals are to develop seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improve high school graduation rates, assist high school pupils to achieve college and career readiness and to serve "underachieving students", those from groups underrepresented in postsecondary education, those who are seeking advanced studies while in high school, and those seeking a career technical education credential or certificate.

These students who earn early college credit are more likely to earn high school diplomas, to enroll in community colleges and four-year colleges, to attend post-secondary education on a full-time basis, and to complete degrees in those institutions than students without these experiences.

The informational reading of the 2017-2018 College and Career Access Pathways Partnership Agreement for Dual Enrollment between San Lorenzo Unified School District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District took place at the December 5, 2017 meeting, Agenda Item 8.2. The second reading and approval of the this College and Career Access Pathway Partnership Agreement for Dual Enrollment between San Lorenzo Unified School District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District took place at the January 17, 2018 meeting, Agenda Item 4.13.
