Background: The CCCCO, California Community College Mental Health Services Grant was awarded to Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College and Las Positas College in May 2018. The California Community College Mental Health Services Grant seeks to encourage community colleges to collaborate with county behavioral health departments in order to improve student access to mental health services and early identification and intervention programs.

Chabot College and Las Positas College will establish and strengthen relationships with Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services and other county, city, community-based, and educational entities to expand and improve behavioral and mental health services and referrals for college students.

The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District was awarded \$350,000 in California Community College Mental Health Services Grant funding from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020.

<u>Background</u>: The City of Hayward and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) have in the past entered into a Community Media Center (CMC) Facility Use Agreement for the City to use the College's TV Studio and related facilities for Public, Educational and Government (PEG) access programming and production. Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) Grant Award for

Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College has been awarded a \$74,515 grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Funds support continuing a MESA (Math, Engineering, Science Achievement) Program at Chabot College. The MESA program academically prepares its program students for transfer to four-year institutions to assure their ability to attain baccalaureate degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) fields. The MESA funding support for Chabot College was initially approved as Item 4.1 at the November 14, 2017 board meeting.

The MESA program model is comprised of 13 Core Components that include: Academic Excellence Workshops that teach collaborative learning techniques, a special orientation course for MESA students, a dedicated study center, career advising and exploration of STEM options, transfer assistance, scholarships and partnerships with student and professional organizations. The Chabot MESA Program will provide all 13 Core MESA Components, including frequent, sustained and prolonged academic and student support services, and case management by the MESA Counselor.

The Chabot MESA Program will benefit all Chabot students, but will target underrepresented minorities in STEM, in particular Latino, African-American, and Pacific-Islander students. Taking into account the student population at Chabot, we will also be targeting low-income, first-generation students majoring in STEM fields. The program will serve a total of 125 students from these targeted populations.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$74,515 for the academic year of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, effective upon board approval on July 17, 2018, and can be renewed for a maximum of three years.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accept the grant award for Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College in the amount of \$74,515 for the academic year beginning July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, with an effective date of July 17, 2018, renewable for three years. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the grant award and any future augmentations or amendments to the grant or behalf of the District.

Approval of Award of a Piggyback Contract for Printer/Multi-Function Device

Equipment to replace the current multi-function fleet equipment, which is outdated

at Las Positas College through the CollegeBuys Purchasing Program

<u>Background</u>: District Staff is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of Printer/Multi-Function Device Equipment for Las Positas College. These devices will replace the current multi-function fleet equipment, which is outdated. Parts are becoming unavailable and these devices will improve reliability while utilizing newer technology. To make the purchase of the Printer/Multi-Function Device Equipment, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The CollegeBuys Purchasing Program is a cooperative purchasing program made available by the Foundation for California Community Colleges. The CollegeBuys contract planned for this use is the administrative services agreement awarded to Ricoh USA. This piggybackable contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award to the Foundation for California Community College Consortium Member Schools.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the award of a piggyback contract for Printer/Multi-Function Device Equipment to replace the current multi-function fleet equipment, which is outdated at Las Positas College using the CollegeBuys Purchasing Program, to Ricoh USA, in the respective amounts including taxes, not to exceed \$141,859.52. Subject: Approval of Memorandum of Understanding – City of Hayward – Chabot College

Background: In June 2016, after the passage of the CLPCCD Measure A Bond, the City of Hayward approached Chabot College to gauge interest in participating in a joint fire technology training facility. Chabot College presented this opportunity to CLPCCD Administration on February 8, 2017 and were directed to prepare an academic program review supporting such a venture. Chabot College presented the program review to the District on September 18, 2017. The presentation was modified, following constructive comments from the District staff, and the modified presentation was delivered to the Board of Trustees on October 24, 2017. Given the presentation by Chabot College, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees directed staff to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the City of Hayward (Hayward) regarding a shared use fire technology training facility to be located on City of Hayward property.

This MOU, although non-binding, sets forth the shared objectives of both parties and describes in general a proposed legal structure to construct, own, and operate a shared use facility for the purpose of fire technology training. The MOU proposes a 50-year ground lease arrangement where the District pays for the construction of educational facilities on ground leased from Hayward. The property and improvements revert back to Hayward after the 50 year term expires. The MOU anticipates two subsequent documents: the actual ground lease contract between the District and Hayward and an agreement for Chabot to lease use of facilities (those not controlled under the ground lease agreement) within the fire training complex.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Memorandum of Understanding – City of Hayward – Chabot Las Positas Community College District. It is further recommended that the Board authorizes the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Subject: Approval of Contract Renewal—Contra Costa County Employment and Human

Services, District-Economic Development

<u>Background:</u> Contra Costa County's Employment and Human Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development department to provide training to people serving dependent children, youth and their families throughout Contra Costa County since 2017.

As with the previous contract, the District will partner with community-based organizations that serve foster and adoptive care children to provide the required training. Subcontractors will include Alternative Family Services; Lilliput Children's Services; Seneca Family of Services; and outside vendors. Additionally, Contra Costa County's Employment and Human Services department will utilize this resource for their employees' training.

This contract is in the amount of \$688,925 for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. The contract was approved by Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors on June 26, 2018. The funds are 100% state revenue allocated through Contra Costa County for this contract.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the Contract Renewal for Contra Costa County Employment and Human Services, District – Economic Development in the amount of \$688,925 for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the contract on behalf of the District.

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
