<u>Background:</u> The TRIO Student Support Services grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. The grant continues funding for Chabot's successful ASPIRE program that has been operating since 2005. The ASPIRE Program seeks to narrow and/or close the achievement gap by providing comprehensive academic development, case management, financial aid education, and financial literacy services.

ASPIRE features structured first year experiences, individualized continuous follow-up in years 2-5, a strong academic, transfer and career emphasis, and group services to maximize student contact. This includes a Summer Readiness Program, close monitoring and follow-up on student progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and connected to ASPIRE staff. ASPIRE will provide a safety net for low-income, first-generation and disabled students and help make their dream of a postsecondary education a reality.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$231,103 per year for five years (total \$1,155,515) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020. This year's grant award augments the 2019-20 award amount by \$34,699 for a total of \$265,802. This award is being executed as of August 20, 2019 with an effective date of September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

Background: Chabot College has received an unsolicited augmentation in the amount of \$317,307 for the 2019 – 2020 program year from the U.S. Department of Education. The Board of Trustees approved the original grant award under Agenda Item 4.1 at the September 20, 2016 Board meeting and additional augmentations as Item 4.4 at the October 24, 2017 and Item 4.2 at the October 16, 2018 Board meetings.

Funds support the TRIO Educational Talent Search (ETS) Program at Chabot College. The TRIO ETS Program serves 7th through 12th grade students in the San Lorenzo and Hayward Unified School Districts who are both low-income and first-generation college-bound, to ensure students persist from grade to grade, graduate from high school, and ultimately attend and graduate college. The TRIO ETS Program offers a variety of activities designed to impact educational outcomes including: student advising and mentoring; homework and tutoring assistance; college and financial aid application assistance; trips to college campuses, cultural and career-related events; as well as summer programming. TRIO ETS is an essential component of the cradle to college to career pipeline and a vital strategy in ensuring student equity and access.

The grant augmentation in the amount of \$317,307 is being executed as of August 20, 2019 with the effective date of September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

Background: The TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. This SSS grant continues funding for Chabot's EXCEL Program that targets Chabot's large English as a second Language student population. Latino and Asian-American students comprise the majority of the ESL students.

The program seeks to narrow and/or close this gap by providing comprehensive English language development support in college courses, case management, financial aid and financial literary services. The program recruits from all areas of the college utilizing frequent and intrusive student contacts and strong academic supports, led by ESL faculty, to retain students. Services include a Summer Readiness Program, close monitoring and follow-up on progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and in contact with SSS ESL faculty and staff. This program is a collaborative effort of ESL and Counseling faculty and strives to increase college access and success for this historically underrepresented population.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$220,000 per year for five years (total \$1,100,000) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020. This year's grant award augments the 2019-20 award amount by \$33,032 for a total of \$253,032. This award is being executed as of August 20, 2019 with an effective date of September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

Background: The TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) grant targets disabled, low-income, and first-generation college students. This grant builds upon Chabot's successful Math, Engineering, and Science Achievement (MESA) Program and establishes a new TRIO SSS program that targets students interested in pursuing STEM disciplines, including Health Sciences. This includes students in the following areas as well as other related fields including: physical sciences, engineering, life sciences, math (e.g., number properties and operations, measurement, geometry, data analysis and probability, and algebra), and technology, including technology literacy, hands on workshops, technological innovations, scientific research, biotechnology, electronics, health sciences, communications and health research.

The Chabot College SSS STEM Program seeks to narrow and/or close this gap by providing academic support in STEM fields, enrichment and leadership opportunities, case management, financial aid and financial literacy services. The program recruits from all areas of the college utilizing frequent and intrusive student contacts and strong academic supports, led by science and math faculty, to retain students. Services include a Summer Bridge Program, close monitoring and follow-up on progress and continuous program activities that keep students engaged and in contact with STEM faculty and staff. This program is a collaborative effort of the math and science faculty and counseling faculty. Funding for the project is in the amount of \$220,000 per year for five years (\$1,100,000) for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2020.

Grant augments the 2019-20 award amount by \$33,032 for a total of \$253,032. This award is being executed as of August 20, 2019 with the effective date of September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

Las Positas Community College District, Chabot and Las Positas Colleges

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been contracting with Alameda County Social Services Agency, Children and Family Services providing services for the Parent Resources, Information, Development and Education (PRIDE) pre-service training program for many years. The State developed a uniform name and requirements for all State pre-service training programs beginning January 2017. The services requested for the 2019-20 school year at Chabot and Las Positas College essentially remain the same as the past 10 years.

Chabot and Las Positas College will continue to offer childcare, food, and related supplies/miscellaneous items to the participants of the pre-service RFA training classes while they are attending these classes.

The RFA classes inform and prepare potential foster and adoptive parents in making successful, permanent connections with foster youth. These classes are now required for resource families who were formally known adoptive parents, foster parents, kinship families and guardians. Classes are also available to respite providers and the general public who are interested in understanding the needs of children in out-of-home care, and are under the protection of the Department's Foster Care System.

The Alameda County Social Service Agency will recommend for approval to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors, the preliminary grant renewal amount of \$194,764.00 for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The most recent renewal was in 2018, under Agenda Item 4.7 of the September 18, 2018, meeting agenda.

Approval of Renew Agreement - State of California, Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and Student Training Program with the Foundation for California Community Colleges at Chabot-Las Positas Community College

District, Las Positas College

Background: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has a successful auto technology program. As a part of that program, the Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC) has operated the State of California's Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and Lane Technician Training Program on the campus since 2003. The program provides referees to hear consumer complaints and to negotiate reasonable results in those disputes and to train student technicians to perform necessary technical services in the State's Smog Check program. This agreement would continue the Bureau of Automotive Repair's Smog Referee and Student Technician Training Program, combining public service to the community and a training program for students enrolled at the College. In addition, the Foundation for California Community Colleges will pay \$1,100 per month as a licensing fee for the use of the facilities at the College. The term of the proposed renewal is August 21, 2019 through June 30, 2021. The Board of Trustees approved the original agreement for this program on April 15, 2003 under Agenda Item 4.7.b. The most recent prior approval was on July 18, 2017 under Agenda Item 4.5.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed renewal agreement for the State of California, Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and Student Training Program with the Foundation for California Community Colleges at Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College. <u>Background:</u> Chabot College has received notification from the Alameda County Social Services Agency of its intent to renew a grant for the continuation of services for the Community Action to Reach Out to Infants (CARI) Program.

Under the CARI Program, the College provides specialized, pre-designed training for potential Resource Families (previously Foster Parents, Kinship Caregivers) and Respite Providers to care for children that enter Alameda County's Child Protective Services through drug exposure, HIV, neglect or abuse. This will be the fifteenth year the Alameda County Board of Supervisors has chosen to reconfirm its dedication to the ideals of service to the community through the maintenance of this partnership with the College.

The Alameda County Social Service Agency will recommend for approval, to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors, the grant renewal amount of \$39,191. The contract is effective for services rendered from July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020 and was last approved by the Board of Trustees, as Agenda Item 4.4 at the September 19, 2017 Board meeting. The most recent renewal was approved by the Board of Trustees, as Agenda Item 4.3 of the September 18, 2018 Board meeting.

Renewal with Alameda County Social Services Agency, Children and Family Services for the Community Action to Reach Out to Infants (CARI) Program, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College, in the amount of \$39,191 for services rendered during fiscal year 2019-2020. 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Approval of College and Career Access Pathways Partnership Agreement for

Dual Enrollment between New Haven Unified School District and Chabot Las-

Positas Community College District, Chabot College

Background: The purpose of this College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership Agreement is to provide high school students in New Haven Unified School District an opportunity to earn early college credit at Chabot College while enrolled in high school. The intent is to offer and expand dual enrollment opportunities. These course offerings are consistent with the provisions of AB 288 (Education Code § 76004), for high school students "who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education." The goals are: a.) to develop seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer b.) improve high school graduation rates c.) assist high school pupils to achieve college and career readiness d.) to serve "underachieving students", those from groups underrepresented in postsecondary education, those who are seeking advanced studies while in high school, and those seeking a career technical education credential or certificate.

These students who earn early college credit are more likely to earn high school diplomas, to enroll in community colleges and four-year colleges, to attend post-secondary education on a full-time basis, and to complete degrees in those institutions than students without these experiences.

The Board of Trustees approved the form and language of the CLPCCD CCAP Agreement at the July 9, 2016 meeting, Agenda Item 4.3.

CCAP Agreements must be presented at two public (informational and adoption) meetings in the review and approval of the Agreement. This Board Agenda item serves as the first presentation and informational reading.

Background: The Kaiser Permanente Northern California Community Benefit Program has awarded Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College \$30,000 to support Chabot College's Restorative Integrated Self Education (RISE) Program, for the period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 with an effective date of August 21, 2019. The RISE Program serves formerly incarcerated individuals motivated to attend college. RISE provides comprehensive support, connecting students to educational programs, employment, and social/health services supporting their return to the community and completion of educational goals.

For formerly incarcerated individuals, basic financial stability reduces the likelihood of recidivism and the ability to succeed in higher education. This grant will support RISE activities, particularly Employment Coordination and Direct Client Support (i.e. backpacks, Clipper Card). Employment Coordination, available upon enrollment in RISE, will help students identify jobs/careers of interest, provide knowledge and skills to seek employment, and help students become employed.

Company ("National IPA") Office and Educational Supplies.

Background: Staples office supply has been the District's primary office supply vendor for a period of twenty-five (25) years, beginning in 1994 through July 2019. During that time, Staples quality of service, delivery and customer service had been impeccable. Over the past several years, however, District and College staff noticed, the once impeccable service provided by the Staples, began to drastically decline. Numerous complaints regarding inefficient service and delivery forced the District to begin negotiating with other potential suppliers. District staff met with Office Depot on numerous occasions, and were impressed by their dedicated customer service team, commitment to quality and overall service. Whereby, the District opted not to renew its agreement with Staples and enter into an agreement with Office Depot for a period of three years (3) with the option to renew two (2) additional years.

Under Public Contract Code Section 20652, the governing board of any community college district, without advertising for bids, and when that Board has determined that it is the best interests of the District, may authorize, by contract, to purchase materials and equipment utilizing piggyback-able contracts.

The initial contract term was effective on January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. However, the Contract was renewed by mutual agreement of the parties for eleven (11) additional one (1) year terms based on the current terms and conditions provided that the total Contract Term did not exceed twelve (12) years. Whereby, the contract extended through December 31, 2019 and with one four (4) year renewals through December 31, 2023.

Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), District-Economic

Development

<u>Background</u>: On January 16, 2018, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's (CLPCCD) Board of Trustees approved a grant award from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) to serve as the fiscal agent for the Umoja Programs. Umoja serves at-risk, educationally and economically disadvantaged students. The Umoja program actively promotes student success for all students, with an emphasis on African American student success, through culturally responsive curriculum and practices.

We have been awarded a grant as fiscal agent again for the current fiscal year. The grant is in the amount of \$2,500,000, for the period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 with an effective date of August 21, 2019.

Under the terms of the Grant Agreement, the role of fiscal agent requires that, as directed by the CCCCO staff assigned to oversee this program, we create and implement contracts with vendors for data collection and reporting; curriculum and program creation and distribution; event planning and facilitation; and technology purchases. We will also be awarding mini-grants to Umoja-affiliated colleges throughout the state as awarded through a request for proposal (RFP) offering. There is a standard contract format utilized with the vendor.
