Quebec, Canada, November 6 – 9, 2019

<u>Background</u>: The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College would like to sponsor Dr. Sheena Turner-August to attend the 2019 conference to be hosted by the Solution Focused Brief Therapy Association scheduled for November 6 – 9, 2019 in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. The conference will provide mental health practitioners, advocates, and therapists with best practices, emerging theory, and resources to help college-aged students in the ever-growing need of mental health counseling. Colleges and universities nationwide have reported higher rates of mental health need by students who experience high rates of anxiety, depression, isolation, and suicidal thoughts. This professional development opportunity would be financed by the California Community College Mental Health Services grant that was awarded jointly to Chabot College and Las Positas College by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office.

It is anticipated that information received at the conference will enable Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College to adopt and explore ways to be more responsive and provide appropriate mental health services on an individual basis, group basis, and in collaboration with off-campus practitioners and partners. Additionally, information gained at the conference will help improve outreach to vulnerable, marginalized, and historically underrepresented groups of students to help address and increase retention, persistence, graduation, and transfer rates.

<u>Background:</u> The Chancellor's Office employed a new method to select Deputy Sector Navigators (DSNs) and DSN host colleges for the 2018/19 competitive grant awards, whereby DSN applicants and host colleges applied separately and were matched. This process resulted in two rounds of application and selection: the first round of awardees had a grant start date of October 1, 2018, and the second round of awardees had a start date of January 1, 2019. Awards to host colleges for DSN positions that remained vacant after the first and second rounds had completed were made as they were finalized throughout spring 2019.

The strength of Chabot College's academic Business & Entrepreneurship discipline makes Chabot College an ideal host for the regional DSN. While the position is charged with serving the region, Chabot College will benefit substantially from the market intelligence gathered by the talent named as DSN.

Background: In an ongoing effort to replace outdated computer equipment that no longer meets the instructional need, a quote has been obtained from HP for 150 Configurable HP EliteDesk 800, G4 Series Small Form Factor PC's to update the computer equipment in buildings 507 and 1600 at Chabot College. To make the purchase of the computer equipment, the piggyback contracting method will be used per Public Contract Code, Section 20652. The Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) with the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO) has formed a purchasing program approved by the State Chief Procurement Official which makes contracts available to authorized government entities. This piggyback contract with HP utilizes a previously conducted bidding and contract award process to WSCA-NASPO members.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the award of the piggyback HP contract 7-15-70-34-001 using the WSCA-NASPO process for the replacement of outdated computer equipment in buildings 507 and 1600. The respective amounts including taxes are not to exceed \$215,346. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Acting Vice Chancellor, Business Services to execute the purchase order on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: The District issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) B-18 on September 5, 2017, seeking qualified Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Services firms for Measure A Projects. Following established procurement procedures the top ranked firms were interviewed by the District and Chabot College Staff.

The district recommends the selection of LPAS Architecture + Design for a proposal for the Temporary Faculty Village at Las Positas College. This project will provide approximately thirteen (13) modular buildings to accommodate 75 faculty offices, conference rooms, and supports spaces. In addition one (1) modular restroom unit will be provided to support faculty members.

WHEREAS, the Trump Administration's decision on September 5, 2017, to rescind the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program, placed the safety, security, and educational future of thousands of undocumented students in doubt; and

WHEREAS, California Community Colleges have advocated to Congress and the Administration to preserve DACA and respect the contributions of undocumented immigrants, and on January 26, 2017, the Board of Governors passed a resolution expressing its support for DACA and firm commitment to serving all students who can benefit from a postsecondary education; and

WHEREAS, California Community Colleges stand united as a system where all students can learn, grow, feel supported and safe; and

WHEREAS, on September 18, 2017, the California Community Colleges Chancellor issued a Statement of Values and Commitment to Undocumented Students confirming that the Chancellor's Office will not release any personally identifiable student information without a judicial warrant, including data related to immigration status, will not cooperate with any federal effort to create a registry of individuals based on protected characteristics such as religion, race, immigration status, or sexual orientation, and will urge local governing bodies to do the same; and

WHEREAS, numerous community colleges reflecting the diversity of California have adopted policies and procedures consistent with protecting immigrant students, and created partnerships with community organizations to help our undocumented students access legal assistance and other services in local communities; and

WHEREAS, in 2018 the Chancellor's Office expanded the existing partnership to include, Immigrants Rising and other organizations, and sponsored Undocumented Student Week of Action, October 15–19, to inform undocumented students about all available services on campus and in local communities and empower them to access those services, and support students and allies in advocating to Congress to act quickly and establish a permanent solution for undocumented young people; and

WHEREAS, the Chabot- Las Positas Community Colleges participated in the 2018 Undocumented Student Week of Action by engaging in activities in support of undocumented students, and on October 15, 2019, the Chabot- Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees passed a resolution reaffirming its commitment to support all students throughout our district, including undocumented students; and

WHEREAS, despite advocacy efforts by the California Community Colleges and many other individuals and organizations in California and across the nation, the preservation of DACA and the adoption of an effective solution for undocumented students remains elusive, which places continued economic and emotional weight on students, their families, communities, and the state; therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Chabot- Las Positas Community College District declare October 14-18, 2019 and every third week of October thereafter, as "Undocumented Student Action Week" to work in partnership with other organizations and encourage the California Community Colleges to engage in activities supporting undocumented students; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Chabot- Las Positas Community College District supports efforts by our college(s) to identify and share best practices for assisting undocumented students, disseminate information to the students about how to access funding for immigration defense proceedings and referral to legal service providers, and reinforce state policies that protect student rights and privacy; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Chabot- Las Positas Community College District urge Congressional members to uphold California values and create a pathway to citizenship for undocumented students, which will permit them to complete their education goals and achieve their highest potential.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Trustees of the Chabot- Las Positas Community College District does hereby resolve, order and determine as follows:
