# Subject: Acceptance of a US Department of Education Grant, Childcare Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) for the Chabot College Children's Center Expansion (GAN P335A190370)

<u>Background</u>: Chabot College has applied for and been awarded a \$110,649 grant per year from the US Department of Education from October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020, with the option for renewal for three additional years.

The Chabot College Children's Center helps provide students access to affordable childcare on campus. The Children's Center currently provides 96 families with a consistent childcare option for children, ages three-months to kindergarten, to learn and have fun. For student parents, the Children's Center is a key resource to academic success and being able to stay in school. Chabot student parents with children attending the Children's Center have higher persistence and success rates, compared to the average across campus.

Following budget cuts in 2010, the Center has slowly been rebuilding capacity to serve the 155 families on the waitlist. Funds from this grant will support staffing, professional development, and National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) Accreditation to open 12 additional subsidized childcare slots, which will prioritize families in greatest economic need on the waitlist.

Funding for this project is in the amount of \$110,649 for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 with an effective date of December 17, 2019

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees accepts the US Department of Education Grant, Childcare Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) for the Chabot College Children's Center Expansion in the amount of \$110,649 for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 with an effective date of December 17, 2019. <u>Background</u>: The Strong Workforce Program allocates \$248M per year for the purpose of expanding the availability of quality community college career technical education and workforce development courses, programs, pathways, credentials, certificates, and degrees. The legislation provided for 40% of the funds to be distributed through and allocated by the regional consortia to their member colleges for the purpose of funding regionally prioritized projects and programs that meet the needs of local and regional economies.

The 28-college Bay Area Community College Consortium (BACCC) will receive a total of \$19,407,594 from the first year's Regional Share allocation. As in the first year, 5% of the funds are set aside to support the consortium's operating costs. The BACCC member colleges voted to allocate 82.5% of the second year Regional funds directly to colleges and the remaining 12.5% to multi-college projects. Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College's share of the Strong Workforce Regional Share funding from both the 82.5% direct allocation and the 12.5% multi-college projects is as follows:

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College Regional Fire Academy is an Accredited Regional Training Program (ARTP) through the Office of the California State Fire Marshal. In order to maintain ARTP status and to provide necessary instruction, the Las Positas College Regional Fire Academy must have access to a suitable Fire Training Facility. The Las Positas College Regional Fire Academy used the Pleasanton Fire Training Facility for its first academy in the spring of 2019. The purpose of this agreement is to allow the Las Positas College Regional Fire Academy to continue its use of the Fire Training Facility of the City of Pleasanton to conduct hands on training. The Facility is owned by the City of Pleasanton and operated by the Livermore-Pleasanton Fire Department.

The agreement will commence on December 18, 2019 and end on June 30, 2020. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) day written notice.

#### Approval of Agreement - AB 109 Direct Services: Expanding Access and Subject: Supporting Success for Returning Citizens in Higher Education between County of Alameda and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College (Master Contract No. 901750)

Background: Chabot College has applied for and been awarded a two-year \$200,000 contract from the County of Alameda, Probation Department, in support of Chabot College's Restorative Integrated Self-Education (RISE) Program.

RISE provides a comprehensive, evidence-informed program that expands access to higher education for returning citizens and supports the success of formerly incarcerated students so that they have a greater chance of achieving their higher education goals. Chabot College, with partner Open Gate, recruits incarcerated men and women from Santa Rita Jail, as well as from post-release and 1170(h) populations, who are motivated to attend college. Often, formerly incarcerated students face an array of social, financial, and academic challenges as they seek to enter higher education and through their academic journey. RISE provides academic and nonacademic supports - such as peer mentoring, counseling, referrals to on- and off-campus resources, and group support - to reduce recidivism and support students' reentry to the community.

The AB 109 Direct Services Contract will support the recruitment of 35-40 realigned students on Probation and provide comprehensive supports to these students pursuing higher education at Chabot College.

Funding for this project is in the amount of \$200,000 for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed agreement AB 109 Direct Services: Expanding Access and Supporting Success for Returning Citizens in Higher Education between County of Alameda and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College in the amount of \$200,000 for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the contract on behalf of the District.

<u>Background</u>: The June 30, 2019 annual audit report is being presented to the Board of Trustees for review and acceptance. This annual financial and compliance audit is required under Education Code 84040 and provides for an examination of the District's annual financial statements to assess their fairness and reliability.

The unmodified audit opinion rendered by Crowe LLP communicates that the District's financial statements, as presented within the audit report, present fairly the financial position of the District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2019. The management discussion and analysis section of the audit report, beginning on page 4, contains an executive summary of the results of operations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019.

Section 13e of the U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations, also requires that the audit report be made available by the State or local government for public inspection within thirty days after the receipt of the auditor's report.

# Subject: Approval of Agreement – INTELECOM Intelligent Telecommunications, Inc. ("INTELECOM"), Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background:</u> INTELECOM specializes in design, development and distribution of educational materials and solutions. INTELECOM works to develop an understanding of common needs and opportunities, and to offer solutions that individual colleges might not be able to afford but which colleges working collectively can benefit from.

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College would like to purchase from INTELECOM, in advance of the development, the rights to use the myVRC ("App"), designed and developed by the Company. The App is a digital platform and smartphone application, tested by the relevant groups and in compliance with applicable Federal and State Regulations, to be used for free by the current students of Las Positas College Veterans First Program. The App will enhance communication and build a learning community through various features such as myBuddies chat option. The College Administrative interface of the App will allow for linking to resources such as mental health and wellness resources as well as study and success tools. Furthermore, the INTELECOM will develop a strategic marketing plan for outreaching to current Las Positas College Student Veterans in order to increase retention, graduation and transfer rates. For payment, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College will pay a <u>one-time</u> advance purchase fee of \$3,600.00 to INTELECOM according to Schedule A of the enclosed Agreement.

Subject: Approval of Award of Contract with tBP/Architecture for Design and Engineering Services for the new Biological Sciences Phase 2 Project at Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> The District issued a request for qualifications (RFQ) B-18 on September 5, 2017, seeking qualified architectural and engineering firms for Measure A projects. Following established procurement procedures, a list of architectural and engineering service firms were established. Fifty-seven (57) A/E firms responded to the solicitation.

The District issued a request for proposal RFP B19/20-07 on September 23, 2019, seeking project specific proposals from the highest ranked firms from the established list of A/E firms. Nine (9) firms responded to the RFP, a six-person committee consisting of college faculty, staff and administrators scored and reviewed written proposals. The committee shortlisted to three (3) firms and were interviewed on November 4, 2019. Following the completion of the interviews, the committee recommends awarding the contract to tBP/Architecture of Walnut Creek, CA as the top rated firm for this RFP.

#### Subject: Approval of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – United Way Bay Area, District-Economic Development, Tri-Valley Career Center

Background: The Tri-Valley Career Center (TVCC) has again been selected to serve as a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) site to assist community members with free tax preparation and filing.

TVCC serves as the site host, coordinates the program, and recruits, trains and certifies volunteers to serve as tax preparers.
