Approval of Agreement between National University and Chabot-Las

Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background:</u> For the past two years, National University's (NU) leadership team has been in contact with the Administration of Justice Program Coordinator and the Public Safety Programs Manager at Las Positas College (LPC). Discussions took place around NU having the ability to offer their Bachelor Degree Program in Criminal Justice or Homeland Security and Emergency Management on our campus. By having them on campus, it provides a seamless transition for our current and former public safety students who wish to further their education after obtaining their Associate degree here at Las Positas College.

The purpose of the proposed agreement is to provide greater opportunities for our current and former Public Safety Students at LPC to pursue their goal of earning a bachelor's degree. Under this agreement students who have completed their lower-division community college transfer requirements or an associate's degree can apply them at National University upon transferring, thus allowing them to focus on their upper division requirements towards their bachelor degree.

Students who transfer from LPC to NU will receive a tuition rate that is 25% less than the University's standard tuition rate currently being charged at the time each University Course is offered. Students will also be eligible for the Associate Degree for Transfer Scholarship if they are enrolling at National University for the first time within 12 months of completing a Transferable Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate Degree for Transfer.

Although this agreement will provide a small revenue stream for the college, and there are no additional financial costs for LPC, the intent is to provide our diverse student population with options for continuing their higher education.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed agreement between National University and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

Analyses will include the following information: profile of the various transfer student populations and disaggregation's by student characteristics and transfer student type.

Workforce Program between the Alameda County Office of Education and the

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this MOU is to enable the Alameda County Office of Education ACOE and Chabot College to successfully implement the K12 Strong Workforce Program (SWP) Round 3 FLY Consortium, FLY Consortium 1, FLY Consortium 2 and FLY Consortium 3 Grants.

Chabot College will partner with ACOE to provide opportunities for dual enrollment classes; work as a consortium to develop high-quality K-14 CTE course sequences, programs, and pathways; work with ACOE P2CC staff to plan career exploration, college transition and Summer Bridge activities; and further develop work-based learning opportunities with Earn & Learn and industry partners.

In exchange for the support and services to be provided by Chabot College under the terms and conditions of this Agreement, ACOE shall pay Chabot College the amount of \$20,000.00 for Round 3, FLY Consortium 1, \$20,000.00 for FLY Consortium 2 and \$10,000.00 for FLY Consortium. Funding for the project is in the amount of \$50,000 effective the date of execution through June 30, 2022.

Approval of Aaron De La Cruz Mural Project, Chabot Las-Positas Community

College District, Las Positas College

Background: In 2007, funds from the sale of a District-owned property in Castro Valley, known as the "Nike site," were allocated by the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees to the Colleges and District Office for the purpose of acquiring public art. In December 2010, the Art on Campus Program and Committee was established at Chabot-Las Positas College District, Las Positas College. The committee did extensive research and work to identify possible locations on campus and select artwork to purchase utilizing these funds. In 2013 and 2014, the "Essence of Athletic Movement" banners and the Fletcher Benton "Folded Circle Ring and L" sculpture were the first two acquisitions that were purchased and installed by 2016.

After a hiatus, the Las Positas College Council re-started the Art on Campus Task Force in 2019. The Task Force convened and mapped out a plan to recommence the work, move forward additional acquisitions and projects, and build a sustained commitment to art at Las Positas College. The Task Force decided to focus on artwork of various size and scope, including a strong desire for one or more murals. Task Force members researched and identified several local Bay area muralists, reviewed their prior work, and decided to pursue Aaron De La Cruz for a commissioned mural. The Task Force also identified several possible locations for the mural.

Since then, the Task Force has vetted this selection through the Facilities and Sustainability Committee and Executive Facilities Committee, with approval received to move forward. Aaron De La Cruz has been contacted and enthusiastically expressed his interest in completing a mural project for Las Positas College. He is a grateful product of the California Community College system. After reviewing photos of the various possible locations, he identified Building 1600 as the best location for his work, and this choice was also approved by the Executive Facilities Committee. Appendix A provides a photograph of the proposed location, and Appendix B provides further specific details.

As Chair of the Art on Campus Task Force, the Dean of Arts and Humanities was requested to submit the mural project for Board of Trustees review and approval. Details regarding the artist, location, conceptual design, estimated timeline, prep and maintenance, cost, and funding source are attached in the Aaron De La Cruz LPC Mural Project Proposal. Examples of the artist's prior work are included in Appendix B to serve as representative of the type of final product the artist will deliver.

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Upon approval, the artist will commence the design phase for the mural, working with the Art on Campus Task Force. The Dean will also work closely with Maintenance and Operations and Campus Safety regarding the artist safely accessing the location and working on campus. The estimated cost for the mural project is not to exceed \$100,000 inclusive of the design, prep, installation, supplies and equipment. Appendix B provides further details regarding aspects that will contribute to the final cost.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approve the proposed Aaron De La Cruz Mural Project, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College for an amount not to exceed \$100,000. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor of Business Services to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

The League has a joint project with the Chief Council of Librarians to provide a Community College Library Consortium. The Chief Council of Librarians charges an annual fee for libraries to be a part of the consortium.

The open purchase order augmentation form is for the annual subscription to online library materials and online databases that provide access to magazines and journals, eBooks, streaming media, and other research content. This final augmentation form on open purchase order B210037 will total \$135,202 for invoices to be paid during FY 2020-21. Approval of Standard Contract No. 00591-22 with the County of Solano, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District-Economic Development

<u>Background:</u> Solano County's Health and Social Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development and Contract Education Department to provide training to people who work with the out of home children and youth of Solano County since 2003-04. The County has requested that we continue to provide training services for the 2021-22 fiscal year.

As with the prior contracts, we will be working closely with our partners, A Better Way, Aldea, Alternative Family Services and Seneca Center, to deliver training to their own staff as well as to other Solano County community-based agencies serving foster children. Additionally, the County's Child Welfare Services incorporates training for their staff as part of this contract. The contract is funded through Title IV-E federal funds, and the reimbursement is in the amount of \$502,680.

The contract states that Solano County will pay the District up to \$502,680 for training services provided and has a term of twelve months (July 1, 2021 to June 30,2022). The contract requires an in-kind match, which is the District's responsibility, which consists of the value of staffing, overhead and facilities costs.

Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, District-Economic Development

<u>Background:</u> On November 12, 2019, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's (CLPCCD) Board of Trustees approved that we serve as fiscal agent for the Strong Workforce Program (SWP) for the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO). The SWP was created to expand the availability of quality community college career technical education and workforce development courses, programs, pathways, credentials, certificates and degrees.

Since the original award, the CCCCO has revised its contract language for fiscal agreements and Standard Agreement No. C19-0029 has been created to replace the original Agreement (19-205-001), which was for the term of November 13, 2019 through December 31, 2020, in the amount of \$9,900,000. CONDEMNING THE RECENT SURGE IN HATE CRIMES TARGETING ASIAN AMERICANS

WHEREAS, twenty-three million Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPI) account for seven percent of the Nation's population in the United States; and over two million Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are working on the frontlines of this COVID—19 pandemic in health care, law enforcement, first responders, education, transportation, supermarkets, and other essential service industries; and

WHEREAS, in Alameda County, one of the first minority-majority counties in the nation, Asians have been the largest racial group since 2014, and currently make up 32 percent of the county's population and

WHEREAS, the recent rise of violence against Asian Americans is part of a larger history of violence against communities of color, we must work together to create community-centered solutions that stop the violence in all communities; and

WHEREAS, Chabot-Las Positas CCD recognizes that past statements at the federal level have played a role in furthering anti-Asian sentiments, including references to the COVID-19 pandemic by the geographic location of its origin; and

WHEREAS, such inflammatory rhetoric is inaccurate and stigmatizing and has put AAPI persons, families, communities, and businesses at risk; and

WHEREAS, these remarks tend to incite fear and xenophobia, and have exacerbated Racism against individuals of Asian ancestry by putting them at risk of retaliation; challenges to accessing resources and services; appearing in public; and expressing their identity; and

WHEREAS, Stop AAPI Hate—a hate-incident-reporting website launched by the Asian Pacific Policy and Planning Council and Chinese for Affirmative Action—has received over 3000 reported incidents of racism and discrimination targeting Asian Americans across the U.S., with over 700+ occurring in the Bay Area, including incidents of verbal harassment, shunning, acts of vandalism, and physical violent assault including death and

WHEREAS, despite a new Presidential Administration in office since January 2021, Asian Americans have continued to experience more horrific and senseless attacks particularly against elderly API individuals that have resulted in hospitalizations and death and

WHEREAS, while on April 20, 2021, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees passed a Resolution by unanimous vote "denouncing xenophobia and anti-Asian sentiment arising due to fears of the COVID-19 pandemic", incidents of hate crimes and acts of violence against the AAPI Community continue to increase at an alarming rate and

WHEREAS, Racism, discrimination, bigotry, violence, hate and oppression have no place at Chabot-Las Positas CCD or in our community and will not be tolerated and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees of the Chabot-Las Positas Community District vehemently denounces the violence against Asian American and Pacific Islanders and wishes to affirm its commitment to the well-being and safety of Asian American and Pacific Islander students and community members and ensure they know they are not alone and that they can speak out to help stop the spread of bigotry and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Chabot-Las Postias Community College District Board of Trustees reaffirms that Chabot- Las Positas Community College District is a community that values diversity, equity and inclusion; and further

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees stands with the Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) community and calls on all citizens and leaders to join us in condemning racist attacks against Asian Americans, in all forms; commit to helping end racism through educating our communities on the rich history and culture of Asian Americans; renew our commitment to speak out against such attacks; defend and protect those targeted; and seek out and punish those who commit hate crimes against AAPI members of our community.
