Subject: Approval of Amendment to Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to host a Regional Director at Chabot College between Rancho Santiago Community College District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District

<u>Background</u>: The strength of Chabot College's academic Business Discipline, which is one of the larger programs in the region, makes us an ideal host for a Regional Director in Business. While the position is charged with serving the region, our department benefits substantially from the market intelligence gathered by this person, both on the employer side and from understanding what other colleges are offering that is particularly successful.

Originally, the term of this grant was from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. This amendment is hereby revising this grant term to recognize a 6-month extension with the term of the grant adjusted to end on December 31, 2021. The original grant amount of \$200,000 covered the period from the grant commencement to September 30, 2021. To cover costs from October 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021 for grant close-out activities, WEDD will provide each grantee an additional \$50,000. Board approval is requested to accept the 6-month grant extension, to now run from July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2021 and an additional allocation of \$50,000 as directed by the California State Chancellor's Office.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the continuation of the Regional Director-Business grant award agreement for an additional \$50,000. It is further recommended the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, approve this agreement.

Approval of Standard Services Agreement - County of Mendocino, District-Economic Development

<u>Background</u>: Mendocino County's Health & Human Services Agency has contracted with the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District since 2011 to provide training to group home providers, foster family agencies and Health & Human Services Agency staff located in Mendocino County. Mendocino County's Health & Human Services Agency has requested that we provide these services again for the upcoming year. This year's Agreement is in the amount of \$1,500,000, and for the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022.

Under the terms of this Agreement, we will be subcontracting with three Mendocino County community-based agencies: First 5 Mendocino, Redwood Community Services, and Mendocino County Youth Project to deliver the training and provide consulting, as well as underwrite the cost of staff attending conferences and workshops related to caring for out-of-home children and youth. The contract requires in-kind match, which is the District's responsibility, which consists of the value of staffing, overhead and facilities costs.

<u>Recommended Action</u>: That the Board of Trustees approves the Standard Services Agreement -County of Mendocino, District-Economic Development, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, in the amount of \$1,500,000. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to execute the Agreement on behalf of the District.
