Approval of Amendment to the Agreement with the California Department of Social Services and the California Early Childhood Mentor Program and

Associated Subcontracts with the Community Colleges, Chabot College

<u>Background:</u> The California Early Childhood Mentor Program was developed at Chabot College in 1988 with the support of private foundations. The program relocated to City College of San Francisco in 2001 and moved back to Chabot College on August 1, 2013. The program improves the quality of early care and education through mentorship to train and retain qualified staff.

The program selects and provides advanced training to experienced Early Childhood Education teachers and directors who become mentors. Mentor teachers earn stipends for using their classroom as an environment to train student teachers. Student teachers on their way to degrees earn community college or other credit for practicum study completed under Mentor guidance. Director mentors work with current or aspiring directors to enhance their leadership.

The Board of Trustees has previously approved this contract and accompanying subcontracts beginning April 16, 2013 and each year since with Chabot College as the lead fiscal agent.

This amendment agreement is being executed as of March 15, 2022 for the agreement term of July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023. On August 17, 2021 the Board of Trustees approved the originally contracted amount not to exceed \$5,051,459.23 and authorized CLPCCD, Chabot College to subcontract with 104 California community colleges to satisfy the terms of the agreement. The Amendment provides an additional \$1,000,000.00 for a total amount of \$6,051,459.23 allowing for the resumption of eliminated activities in the 2021-2023 original agreement.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Amendment to the Agreement with the California Department of Social Services for the California Early Childhood Mentor Program, and Associated Subcontracts with Community Colleges, Chabot College for the agreement term of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023, in the amount of \$3,025,729.62, per agreement year. Acceptance of Grant Award - California College Pathways Fund and Chabot-Las

Positas Community College District, Chabot College's Foster Youth Dual

Enrollment Program

Background: The Chabot College's Foster Youth Dual Enrollment Program Grant builds upon the college's existing Guardian Scholars Program supporting current and former foster youth. The grant continues a pilot project to establish a clear pathway for foster youth dual/concurrent enrollment from high school to college. Through near-peer support (student assistants), academic counseling, and refinement to the welcome/onboarding process, the goal is to increase the number of students who are or were in foster care who successfully enroll in and complete a dual/concurrent enrollment course offered through Chabot College. This pilot intends to serve 25 students over the grant period and establish best practices, processes, and procedures that can be used beyond the life of the pilot.

By supporting students early in the pathway, the pilot aims to: begin bridging the gap between the overall college dual/concurrent enrollment rate and the foster youth dual/concurrent enrollment rate; support students to successfully pass dual concurrent enrollment courses; and support students to enroll in higher education.

Funding for the project is in the amount of \$100,000 for the period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2023, effective March 16, 2022.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees accepts the Grant Award - California College Pathways Fund and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College's Foster Youth Dual Enrollment Program in the amount of \$100,000 for the period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2023. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Vice Chancellor, Business Services, to accept the grant award on behalf of the District.

Approval of Affiliation Agreement between Oak Valley Hospital District and Chabot-Las

Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Las Positas College requires students in the Emergency Medical Training-Paramedic (EMT-P) program to successfully complete field internships.

The purpose of this agreement is to establish the respective responsibilities and duties of Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College and Oak Valley Hospital District while students are participating in field internship programs. Oak Valley Hospital will provide field internships for the purpose of training students enrolled in the Las Positas College EMT-P program, and training will be under the supervision of an experienced Oak Valley Hospital District employee who shall be selected in accordance with the Las Positas College EMT-P program at no cost to the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College.

The agreement will commence on March 16, 2022. This agreement shall be for a term of twenty-four (24) months. The agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed Affiliation Agreement between Oak Valley Hospital District and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College for the term commencing March 16, 2022 through March 15, 2024. Approval of Agreement between Project Heartbeat, LLC and Chabot-Las Positas

Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background:</u> The purpose of this Agreement between Project Heartbeat LLC and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College is supplemental to the Instructional Services Agreement approved by the Board of Trustees on August 21, 2021. This Consortium Agreement establishes a six-member Board of Directors and organizational roles to guide the paramedic education program for which Las Positas Colleges serves as the Local Education Agency.

Whereas, both parties desire to jointly establish a consortium that will permit the sponsorship of a paramedic educational program in accordance with the Standards and Guidelines for the Accreditation of Educational Programs in the Emergency Medical Services Professions ("Standards") of the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP), this agreement establishes joint responsibilities for a six-member Board of Directors, three representatives from the Project Heartbeat LLC entity, and three representatives from Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

This agreement will be effective March 15, 2022 through March 15, 2025 and will automatically renew every three years unless either party gives written notice for termination of this agreement.

Approval of Colleges Futures Foundation Sub-Award Agreement for Program Pathways Mapper between Trustees of the California State University, Sponsored Programs Administration, and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District

Background: The Trustees of the California State University, Sponsored Programs Administration wishes to grant a sub-award of Colleges Futures Foundation funding, to the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District to develop mapped transfer pathways. The mapped pathways will clarify the course sequence and requirements for particular degrees from beginning to end. This project supports digitizing degree maps across and between CLPCCD and CSUEB to benefit increased student transfer success, Associate Degree for Transfer awards, and Baccalaureate degree completion. The proposed sub-award is \$12,000.

Approval of Award of contract with WTC Consulting, Inc., for

Districtwide Technology Strategic Planning services.

<u>Background</u>: The District issued a request for qualifications RFQ No. 21/22-08 on January 24, 2022, seeking qualified technology planning firms for the development of three distinct but integrated technology plans to guide the district and colleges in the procurement, deployment and effective use of technology. Following established procurement procedures, four technology planning service firms provided responses to RFQ No. 21/22-08.

An eight-person committee of faculty, staff and administrators were convened to review responses. A list of passing firms was created and WTC Consulting was selected based on experience, expertise and thoroughness of their response.

Contract Proposal Fee

\$ 176,000

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approve the proposed award of the Districtwide Technology Strategic Planning services agreement to WTC Consulting in the amount not to exceed \$176,000.00 which includes basic services and reimbursable expenses. <u>Background</u>: As part of the accountability measures for the Measure A Bond Program, the management team for the programs has put into place a formal process for managing, tracking and presenting to the Board of Trustees all revisions to the Measure B and Measure A individual project names, scopes and budgets. Additional criteria added to the bond list revision process at the September 18, 2018 Board of Trustees meeting.
