Approval to Renew Site License Agreement - State of California, Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and Student Training Program with the Foundation for California Community Colleges at Chabot-Las Positas

Community College District, Las Positas College

Background: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College has a successful auto technology program. As a part of that program, the Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC) has operated the State of California's Bureau of Automotive Repair Smog Referee and Lane Technician Training Program on the campus since 2003. The program provides referees to hear consumer complaints and to negotiate reasonable results in those disputes and to train student technicians to perform necessary technical services in the State's Smog Check program. This agreement would continue the Bureau of Automotive Repair's Smog Referee and Student Technician Training Program, combining public service to the community and a training program for students enrolled at the College. In addition, the Foundation for California Community Colleges will pay \$1,100 per month as a licensing fee for the use of the facilities at the College. The Board of Trustees approved the original agreement for this program on April 15, 2003 under Agenda Item 4.7.b. The most recent prior approval was on August 20, 2019 under Agenda Item 4.6.

The effective date of this agreement is July 1, 2022. The term of the agreement is from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025.

District, Student Parent Support Programs (HUSD-SPSP), Chabot College

Background: Chabot College and Hayward Unified School District, Student Parent Support Programs (HUSD-SPSP) wish to continue an agreement allowing HUSD-SPSP to reimburse Chabot College for college-level courses in the instructional areas of anthropology, arts, business, counseling, early childhood education, ethnic studies, health, humanities, music, philosophy, protective services, psychology, sign language, sociology, and theater. Chabot College will provide credit courses to middle school students and HUSD parents with Second Chance, identifying students during the Fall 2022, Spring 2023 and Summer 2023 terms. HUSD-SPSP will utilize the Youth Engaged in Sports Hayward Grant, 21st Century ASSETs, and the 21st Century Community Learning Centers grants to cover the costs of these degree-applicable courses. This agreement will improve HUSD-SPSP students' connection with higher education and increase opportunities for middle school students and parents within Hayward Unified School District to attend college, including joining pathway cohorts currently in place or being developed at Chabot College.

The Board of Trustees previously approved the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Hayward Unified School District, Student Parent Support Programs for Chabot under item 4.9 July 21, 2020.

Approval of Community College League of California Open Purchase Order for

Library Materials, Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College recommends approval of the Community College League of California Open Purchase Order Form. Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College receives funds annually from the Measure A bond to acquire library materials. The Community College League of California negotiates the best consortia pricing for library resources on behalf of California community colleges. Examples of these resources are subscription databases, online magazines and journals, newspapers, eBooks, streaming videos and music, and conference proceedings.

The Community College League of California (League) is a nonprofit public benefit corporation whose voluntary membership consists of the state's 72 public community college districts. The League supports locally-elected trustees and community college CEOs in serving their students and communities by advocating on their behalf at the state and federal levels, providing continued professional development, and delivering services that use economies of scale to minimize cost. The League has a joint project with the Chief Council of Librarians to provide a Community College Library Consortium. The Chief Council of Librarians charges an annual fee for libraries to be a part of the consortium.

RESOLUTION NO. 18-2122

OPPOSITION TO AB1705 UNLESS AMENDED

WHEREAS, California Education Code 66010.4. (a) (1) defines the primary mission for the California community colleges as to "offer academic and vocational instruction at the lower division level for both younger and older students, including those persons returning to school";

WHEREAS, California Education Code 66010.4. (2) requires the California community colleges to offer instruction and courses to achieve all of the following:

- (A) The provision of remedial instruction for those in need of it and, in conjunction with the school districts, instruction in English as a second language, adult noncredit instruction, and support services which help students succeed at the postsecondary level are reaffirmed and supported as essential and important functions of the community colleges.
- (B) The provision of adult noncredit education curricula in areas defined as being in the State's interest is an essential and important function of the community colleges.
- (C) The provision of community services, courses and programs are authorized functions of the community colleges so long as their provision is compatible with an institution's ability to meet its obligations in its primary missions;

WHEREAS, California Education Code 66010.4. (3) expands the primary mission of the California community colleges "to advance California's economic growth and global competitiveness through education, training and services that contribute to continuous workforce improvement"; and

WHEREAS, the language of AB 1705 (Irwin, 2022) as of April 9, 2022 defines pre-transfer courses to include "basic skills," "remedial," and "college-level" including noncredit courses, and mandates that most students be placed and enrolled directly in transfer-level written communication and quantitative reasoning courses for programs that require any math or English courses;

WHEREAS, Whereas, preliminary research within our own district reveals that the implementation of AB705 caused a disproportionate impact on student success within already marginalized communities, threatening to widen equity gaps;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District Board of Trustees oppose AB1705 (Irwin, 2022) as of June 21, 2022 unless the following amendments are enacted to protect the mission and serve the students of the California community colleges:

Page 2 Res# 18-2122 June 21, 2022

Placement and enrollment of students in a transfer-level English or mathematics course should not prevent students from enrolling in a pre-transfer level English or mathematics course when a student determines a course fulfills their academic needs based on the desire to do any of the following:

- 1. Complete a certificate or Career Technical Education program with the industry recommended math and English requirements
- 2. Make up for learning loss from the COVID-19 global pandemic or any break in education
- 3. Build skills or re-skill
- 4. Fulfill a lifelong learning priority in written communication and quantitative reasoning courses.

It is the intent of the legislature to neither prohibit nor deny a student the opportunity to enroll in any pre-transfer level English or mathematics course based on students' rights to determine their educational goals and academic needs.
