<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this agreement is to establish a contract with Revolution Foods to provide daily meals to the Chabot College Early Childhood Development (ECD) Laboratory School that comply with the nutrition standards established by the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) beginning November 1, 2022.

In this contract Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College agrees to pay \$3.90 per lunch, per child, per day to Revolution Foods. All meals will include entree and beverage that adheres to the menu patterns for the CACFP. Vended meals will be provided daily for the period of November 1, 2022 to October 31, 2023, with the exception of holidays and other school closures.

<u>Background</u>: The purpose of this MOU is to reflect the partnership between Chabot College, Alameda County Sheriff's Office (ACSO), and Five Keys Schools and Programs (Five Keys). This collaboration aims to meet the educational needs of inmates at Santa Rita Jail by making college-level courses accessible, including CSU/US transferable, general education courses, and degree/certificate courses.

This MOU further establishes the operational framework for Chabot College to offer college courses to the inmates housed in Santa Rita Jail run by the ACSO. Five Keys currently operates all educational programming in the jail and will provide logistical support to ensure the smooth operations of Chabot College classes.

Approval of Agreement for Support of Fresh Success Employment & Training Activities between the Foundation for California Community Colleges (FCCC) and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Chabot College

<u>Background</u>: CalFresh is a Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) to assist households to purchase nutritious food. CalFresh recipients can meet the federal requirement to maintain their CalFresh benefits by choosing to participate in a CalFresh Employment & Training (CFET) program. The emphasis of the services is to support students with their educational goals of completing a certificate/degree and becoming economically self-sufficient. In an effort to increase access and remove barriers for a student-recipient, educational expenses will be covered to include, but not limited to: books, transportation, and workplace required attire and equipment.

For the past three years, the CFET program was operated by the Alameda County Social Services Agency and a third party like Chabot College was contracted to conduct the educational and training activities (December 15, 2020, Board Item 4.4). After 3 years of operating the CFET successfully, the FCCC will now work with the California Department of Social Services to provide Chabot College with the funding, fiscal management, technical support and accountability for the CalFresh Employment & Training (CFET) program (Fresh Success).

The maximum federal reimbursement amount is \$114,452.79 for the term of October 1, 2022 – September 30, 2023.

Approval of Agreement – Subrecipient Commitment for California Learning Labs Social Tools to Support Collaborative and Inclusive Learning in Biology:

Communities of Practice Agreement with University of California, Berkeley (UCB) and Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College would like to set up a subrecipient commitment with UCB to complete work on the California Learning Labs Social Tools to Support Collaborative and Inclusive Learning in Biology: Communities of Practice. The grant will scale a previous seed grant (June 16, 2020, Board Item 4.5) that determined how online tools can be leveraged to provide a collaborative learning experience for students in general biology courses across the California public system of higher education. Providing a collaborative learning environment outside of the classroom will provide a space for students to externalize new information, build knowledge, develop their sense of belonging, and build critical study skills, thus reducing achievement gaps for minoritized students.

Funding will support collaborative work amongst California Community Colleges, California State University, and University of California faculty involved in general biology courses. Assessment will include surveys, semi-structured interviews, and focus groups of students and participating faculty. Funding will be used to support the LPC faculty members that will be working the project as a team member at a partner institution.

The agreement will be for the period September 15, 2022 through June 30, 2024.

Funding Source: \$85,000 through the California Learning Labs Grant awarded to UCB will support LPC's engagement in the project over two years.

Approval of Amendment to the Agreement with the California Department of Social Services and the California Early Childhood Mentor Program and Associated Subcontracts with the Community Colleges, Chabot College

Background: The California Early Childhood Mentor Program, developed at Chabot College in 1988, improves the quality of early care and education through mentorship to train and retain qualified staff. The program selects and provides advanced training to experienced Early Childhood Education teachers and directors who become mentors. Mentor teachers earn stipends to create classroom environments to train student teachers. Student teachers on their way to degrees earn community college or other credit for practicum study completed under Mentor guidance. Director mentors work with current or aspiring directors to enhance their leadership.

The Board of Trustees previously approved this contract and accompanying subcontracts beginning April 16, 2013, and each year since, with Chabot College as the lead fiscal agent.

On August 17, 2021, the Board of Trustees approved the originally contracted amount of not to exceed \$5,051,459.23 and authorized CLPCCD, Chabot College to subcontract with 104 California community colleges to satisfy the terms of the agreement. On March 15, 2022 the Board of Trustees approved an Amendment to the agreement, which provided an additional \$1,000,000.00 for a total amount of \$6,051,459.23, allowing for the resumption of eliminated activities in the 2021-2023 original agreement.

This amendment agreement is for the agreement term of July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023. The Amendment applies to Fiscal Year 2022-23 with an increase of \$1,136,412.44 for a total funding allotment of \$3,662,141.94. Due to Covid-19 and underspending in Fiscal Year 2021-22, the California Department of Social Service allowed the program to void the original amendment and roll-over unspent funds, in addition to a one million dollar increase.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Trustees approves the Amendment to the Agreement with the California Department of Social Services for the California Early Childhood Mentor Program, and Associated Subcontracts with Community Colleges, Chabot College for the agreement term of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023, in the amount of \$3,662,141.94 per agreement year. It is further recommended that the Board authorizes the Vice Chancellor of Business Services to execute the Agreement and Associated Subcontracts with Community Colleges on behalf of the District.

Community College District, Economic Development

<u>Background</u>: Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Department of Economic Development and Contract Education (EDCE) has been awarded a grant by the U.S. Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration (DOL/ETA) to serve as the fiscal agent for an Apprenticeship USA Grant. The grant is in partnership with the Communications Workers of America District 9 (CWA-D9), one of our apprenticeship program sponsors, and was created to address the statewide need for telecommunication fiber technicians and bring equitable high-speed broadband service to all Californians.

Under this grant, CWA-D9 will create three new apprenticeship hubs located in Northern, Southern and Central California (in addition to ours, located in San Jose), to train telecommunication fiber technicians. The program anticipates recruiting 150 new apprentices who will be part of Chabot College's Communications Workers apprenticeship program, over the course of the 4-year grant.

The award is in the amount of \$5,818,057, of which \$568,456, will be retained by the District for administrative fees. The term of the Agreement is July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2026.
