#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

The purpose of this College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership Agreement is to provide high school students in San Lorenzo Unified an opportunity to earn early college credit at Chabot College while enrolled in high school. The intent is to offer provisions of AB 288 and AB 30 (Ed Code 76004) for high school students “who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education”.

The goals are:

1. to develop seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer
2. improve high school graduation rates
3. assist high school pupils to achieve college and career readiness
4. to serve “underachieving students”, those from groups underrepresented in postsecondary education, those who are seeking advanced studies while in high school, and those seeking a career technical education credential or certificate.

These students who earn college credit are more likely to earn high school diplomas, to enroll in community college and four-year colleges, to attend post-secondary education on a full-time basis, and to complete degrees in those institutions than students without these experiences.

To make the purchase of the required computer systems, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. ## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College recommends approval of the purchase of Drager Training Equipment for the Fire Services (FST) Training Programs.

The Drager training equipment supports career technology programs, particularly for the Fire Service Technology (FST) Training Program, and is used as an educational and training resource. The Drager training equipment is configured with two 40 ft. burn containers side-by-side and a 20 ft. burn container installed perpendicularly at the entry point of the burn chamber. This layout forms a hallway entry into a double-wide burn chamber for more advanced and dynamic scenarios. The only way to learn how to fight a fire is to actually fight fires with real smoke, real heat, and real flames. The Drager training equipment gives firefighters the opportunity to gain experience attacking fires in an interior hallway simulating a house, hotel, office building, or similar structure. The Drager training equipment is designed to enhance the training capabilities of fire academies and fire agencies. This will provide the ability of the fire academy to teach academy students to recognize and understand real fire behavior and learn techniques to control fire conditions and extinguish interior Class A fires in a controlled, repeatable setting. The Drager training equipment is intended to augment the capabilities of the new training tower that is currently being built on campus. The Drager training equipment provides relevant, realistic, current, and advanced hands-on training opportunities that attract and increase student interest and participation. This improves student retention within the programs.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

The District will complete the construction of the Academic Support and Office building (B2100) at Las Positas College in 2023. ## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

As part of the accountability measures for the Measure A Bond Program, the management team for the programs has put into place a formal process for managing, tracking and presenting to the Board of Trustees all revisions to the Measure A individual project names, scopes and budgets. This process adheres to the accountability standards outlined by Proposition 39 and provides transparency in the evolution of the project list.

For several years, Contra Costa County's Employment and Human Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development and Contract Education Department to provide training to people who work with the out-of-home children and youth of Contra Costa County. The County has requested that we continue to provide training services for the 2023-24 and 2024-25 fiscal years.

As with the prior contracts, we will be working closely with our partners Alternative Family Services and Seneca Center to deliver training to their own staff, as well as to other Contra Costa County community-based agencies serving foster children. Additionally, the County's Child Welfare Services incorporates training for their staff and resource families as part of this contract.

The Agreement states that Contra Costa County will pay the District up to \$375,000 for training services provided each year, for a total two-year contract of \$750,000. This Agreement has a term of July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2025.

Solano County’s Health and Social Services Department has contracted with Chabot-Las Positas Community College District’s Economic Development and Contract Education Department to provide training to people who work with the out-of-home children and youth of Solano County since 2003-04. The County has requested that we continue to provide training services for the 2023-24 fiscal year.

As with the prior contracts, we will be working closely with our partners, A Better Way, Aldea, Alternative Family Services and Seneca Family of Agencies, to deliver training to their own staff as well as to other Solano County community-based agencies serving foster children. Additionally, the County’s Child Welfare Services incorporates training for their staff as part of this contract. The contract is funded through Title IV-E federal funds, and the reimbursement is in the amount of \$639,560.

The contract states that Solano County will pay the District up to \$639,560, for training services provided and has a term of twelve months (July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024). The contract requires an in-kind match, which is the District’s responsibility, which consists of the value of staffing, overhead and facilities costs.
