Chabot College applied for and was awarded The Foundation for California Community Colleges (Foundation) Nursing Education Investment Fund (NEIF) Grant, agreement number 00007833.

Funding supports the project titled "Building Patient Trust through Diversifying the Chabot Nursing Pipeline and Implementing Holistic Admissions Review". The project aims to diversify the Chabot nursing education pipeline by increasing the number of underrepresented (African American/Black and Latinx) students in the Chabot Registered Nursing program by: 1) revising the program admissions criteria to be more holistic; 2) offering discipline-specific DEIA professional development opportunities for faculty; and 3) providing pre-nursing coursework and support to increase enrollment and retention in the program.

Funding for this project is in the amount of \$216,000 for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2025.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

The California Early Childhood Mentor Program, developed at Chabot College in 1988, improves the quality of early care and education through mentorship to train and retain qualified staff. The program selects and provides advanced training to experienced Early Childhood Education teachers and directors who become mentors. Mentor teachers earn stipends to create classroom environments to train student teachers. While working to earn their degrees, student teachers earn community college or other credit for practicum study completed under mentor guidance. Director mentors work with current or aspiring directors to enhance their leadership.

The Board of Trustees previously approved this contract and accompanying subcontracts beginning April 16, 2013, and each year since, with Chabot College as the lead fiscal agent.

On August 17, 2021, the Board of Trustees approved the originally contracted amount not to exceed \$5,051,459.23 and authorized CLPCCD, Chabot College to subcontract with 104 California community colleges to satisfy the terms of the agreement. On September 13, 2022, the Board of Trustees approved an Amendment to the agreement, which applied to Fiscal Year 2022-23, with an increase of \$1,000,000.01, and allowed a one time roll-over of unexpended funds of \$136,412.44 for a total funding allotment of \$6,051.459.24. Due to Covid-19 and underspending in Fiscal Year 2021-22, the California Department of Social Service allowed the program to void the original amendment and roll-over unspent funds, in addition to a one million dollar increase.

This agreement is for the purpose of providing services related to the Child Care Block Grant (CCDBG) and the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) for the term of July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2026, in the amount of \$11,127,432.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

Submitted for funding through the annual appropriation process by Congressman Eric Swalwell, the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District has been awarded a U.S. Department of Education Improvement of Postsecondary Education Program grant (P116Z230025), to implement Year 3 objectives of the East Bay College Agile Network (EBCAN).

This funding deepens the committed partnership between California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) to further achieve systems transformation and increase transfer equity for students. Established in 2020, the EBCAN focuses on greater transfer agility by supporting students to find their best college path forward. EBCAN leads a culture shift across institutions by switching from an individualized institution approach, to a collaborative network crossing traditional institutional boundaries. CSUEB is the top transfer destination for Chabot College and Las Positas College students, and CLPCCD is the top transfer district to CSUEB.

The goals of EBCAN are to increase college completion rates, decrease the time to graduation, and narrow the equity gap by creating clearer student pathways to degrees at CSUEB and CLPCCD to ultimately achieve upward socio-economic mobility for all students.

The grant award is in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the performance period of June 1, 2023 - May 31, 2026. Funding will be distributed to support the goals across the three campuses and for centralized support from an evaluator and intersegmental consultant.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District houses its administrative computer systems at its Las Positas College data center. Over time, as cloud technologies have matured, colleges and universities have upgraded and migrated their systems to vendor-hosted facilities. Vendor-hosted facilities are often referred to as the cloud.

CLPCCD's central administrative system, Banner, and its supporting servers run on the Oracle database. In addition to database applications, Oracle Corporation (Oracle) now offers its own infrastructure (OCI) to support its customers' servers in the cloud. By using OCI, CLPCCD would gain the following benefits:

- Greater protection from power problems and environmental impacts through state-of-the-art data centers located across the United States
- Improved database management tools included with the OCI data center services that create staff efficiency
- Elimination of costs to support some on-premises hardware and software maintenance contracts
- The ability to dynamically size the administrative systems during peak use periods like student registration
- Enhanced security through encryption and more advanced data back-up programs
- The opportunity to upgrade server operating systems and programs

Oracle's OCI service is procured via a 3-year contract which can be extended via four additional one-year terms via written amendments as negotiated by the Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC). Professional services in support of the project implementation would be provided by a separate third party, if necessary.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

CurriQunet META is a web-based curriculum management system for the development, review, and approval of academic courses and programs. It is an integrative platform that provides colleges with improved alignment, coordination, and overall effectiveness of three vital areas of institutional work: curriculum, student learning outcomes assessment, and program review. The system offers a searchable platform for data inquiries and reporting that will allow users to access disaggregated student learning outcomes data for use in curriculum updates and development, program review, and institutional planning. By increasing the College's ability to record and access data across functions, curriQunet Meta will help the college achieve its goal to institutionalize equity in decision-making, assessment, and accountability, to build capacity to resolve inequities and to ensure equitable student outcomes.

Concurrently, Las Positas College does not have a specialized software platform for program review filing or reporting. CurriQunet Meta will not only provide a filing function for program review, but it will also allow program review reports to link directly to data from the curriculum and SLO functions, creating a more integrated and efficient program review process.

The system would also replace the much older CurricUNET (difference in spelling intentional) platform, used in the curriculum development process, and the eLumen platform, used for coordinating and recording assessment of student learning outcomes. The existing platforms have been in use for over a decade and are difficult to use proficiently and accurately.

As part of the accountability measures for the Measure A Bond Program, the management team for the programs has put into place a formal process for managing, tracking and presenting to the Board of Trustees all revisions to the Measure A individual project names, scopes and budgets. This process adheres to the accountability standards outlined by Proposition 39 and provides transparency in the evolution of the project list.

Additional criteria was added to the bond list revision process at the September 18, 2018 Board of Trustees meeting. These criteria identified an added layer of information and flagging to a bond list revision for those projects with substantive changes (a change to a single project in excess of \$5 million dollars, the cancellation of a project from the bond list, or the creation of a new project). In order to provide clarity for the Board of Trustees, the management team will identify bond list revisions containing substantive changes or non-substantive changes in the agenda text.

Measure A Bond List revision #13 contains substantive changes based on the criteria set forth above. The Bond List Revision is proposing the following changes:

Las Positas College has a new project being created per the following: 563933 Infrastructure Hillside Erosion with a budget of \$717,500. The project is created based upon a needed infrastructure upgrade and repair of the existing hillside slope drainage system at the east end of campus. Project funding is provided from project 563930 Infrastructure to better track expenditures to the specific project.

Other changes to budgets are to address budget savings and projected budget shortfalls of a non-substantive level on smaller projects across campus, particularly in the Campus Safety area.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

In an effort to expand the number of apprentices in California, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) is providing funding to encourage and support the creation of apprenticeship programs in industries outside the traditional construction trades, including the California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) New and Innovative Grant - Apprenticeship program. Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development and Contract Education (EDCE) department applied for this grant fund to support its new Automotive Technician apprenticeship through Chabot College.

The purpose of the grant is to establish an Automotive Technician apprenticeship program that will register 100-150 apprentices with the Division of Apprenticeship Standards during the grant term, targeting the Advanced Transportation & Logistics sector in the Bay Area region. The program sponsor is the Automotive Apprenticeship Group, which represents auto dealers' service departments.

CLPCCD was awarded the CAI grant in the amount of \$1,500,000.00, for the term of July 1, 2023 to December 31, 2026. Up to \$368,909 of the grant will be retained by the District for staff, benefits and administrative costs.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

At its September 20, 2022 meeting (Item 7.1), the CLPCCD Board of Trustees approved the U.S. Department of Labor's Apprenticeships Building America grant (#AP-38894-22-60-A-6), which had been awarded to the District in the amount of \$5,818,057. The grant is to be used to build upon and expand the apprenticeship program for the Communications Workers of America District 9 Apprenticeship and Training Trust Fund (CWA). This is a long-standing apprenticeship program through Chabot College, which is is administered by the Economic Development & Contract Education (EDCE) department.

This Subrecipient Agreement states that EDCE shall serve as the grant's fiscal agent. CWA will serve as the subrecipient of the funds, with the responsibility of administering the grant program services and operational plan laid out in the original grant documents. The total amount obligated to CWA from the grant is \$5,150,029.46, which includes half of the indirect cost allocation from the grant. CLPCCD will receive \$668,027.54 for grant management, travel and indirect costs.

This Subrecipient Agreement took an extended amount of time to develop and reach resolution due to revisions to the original contract required by the Department of Labor, the complexities of the grant and the attorneys recommended edits. The term of the program performance for this Subrecipient Agreement is from July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2026, the same as the Department of Labor's grant contract.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION -

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District's Economic Development and Contract Education Department has been chosen to serve as the Local Education Agency (LEA) for the Community Health Worker Apprenticeship Program, sponsored by the Alameda County Health Pipeline Partnership (Program Sponsor).

Instruction for the program will incorporate training onsite by the Program Sponsor, as well as on-campus Chabot College courses. Apprentices will earn a Community Health Worker Certificate of Achievement from Chabot College in addition to a Certificate of Completion from the California Department of Apprenticeship Standards.

The Agreement states that the Economic Development and Contract Education Department (EDCE) shall administer the Health Coach/Community Health Worker Apprenticeship Program for the purposes of providing oversight for Related and Supplemental Instruction (RSI) tracking and other services. The Agreement states that CLPCCD shall retain 17% of the RSI payment from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) for those classes that the Program Sponsor teaches, and 100% of the RSI payment for courses taught at Chabot College by District faculty. Any costs associated with this program that are not covered by RSI funding will be reimbursed by the Program Sponsor. This Agreement has an initial term of July 26, 2023, and end on June 30, 2025, with an option for an automatic annual renewal for up to a total of two (2) years.
