## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

On May 6, 2026, the District sold two series of bonds: \$338,000,000 in Election of 2016 General Obligation Bonds, Series D ("Series D"), and \$195,320,000 in 2026 General Obligation Refunding Bonds ("2026 Refunding Bonds"). Both transactions are scheduled to close on May 19, 2026. Series D is the fourth and final series issued under the Measure A authorization approved by voters in November 2016. Proceeds will fund facilities projects at both Chabot and Las Positas Colleges. With this issuance, the Measure A authorization is fully exhausted, with no remaining authorization.

The 2026 Refunding Bonds refunded the District's outstanding 2016 General Obligation Refunding Bonds on a current basis, reducing debt service costs and lowering the Measure A tax rate for District taxpayers.

### **Summary of Results:**

In advance of the sale, both rating agencies affirmed the District's strong credit ratings: Moody's at "Aa2" and S&P at "AA," each with a stable outlook.

Both series priced favorably relative to the Good Faith Estimates presented to the Board on March 17, 2026 (Resolution No. 12-256):

- **Series D:** True interest cost of 4.1%, approximately 0.50% below estimate, generating an estimated \$31.7 million in debt service savings to taxpayers. Issuance costs came in below budget, directing additional proceeds to the District's Building Fund.
- **2026 Refunding Bonds:** True interest cost of 2.9%, approximately 0.50% below estimate. The refunding produced approximately \$25.1 million in gross savings and net present value savings of 8.30%, well above the 3% market threshold for an economically beneficial refunding. The District issued approximately \$14.7 million less than the authorized not-to-exceed amount.

Both series drew robust investor demand and were oversubscribed, including participation from new institutional investors that expanded the District's investor base.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College endeavors to renew a Memorandum of Understanding with the Dublin Unified School District for 2026 to establish the High School Supplemental and Credit Recovery Program. The program allows Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, Las Positas College to provide Dublin Unified School District high school students with access to non-college credit bearing LPC community college courses (Geometry and Tutoring) during the summer term which provides supplemental and credit recovery for high school students. The District may claim apportionment for these courses.

This program began in 2025 after it was approved by the Board as Item 4.1 on February 15, 2022, and is being renewed for a second cycle due to its success. This term of this agreement is from June 1, 2026, to December 31, 2026, and shall automatically renew each year on January 1, for a total period not to exceed three (3) additional one-year terms (January 1 - December 31, 2027; January 1 - December 31, 2028; January 1 - December 31, 2029).

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

Chabot College was awarded the National Science Foundation Improving Undergraduate STEM Education (IUSE): Innovation in Two-Year College STEM Education Grant in support of the Undergraduate Research Experiences in Imaging and Analysis for Geology and Engineering Project, approved during the October 15, 2024 Board meeting as Item 4.5. Funding from this grant will support summer research internships at the University of California, Santa Cruz (UCSC) for Chabot students, using advanced Scanning Electron Microscopy (SEM) facilities and mentorship from UCSC faculty, researchers, and laboratory personnel. The internships will be paid from the above mentioned Board approved grant, as that grant included \$11,500 budgeted to fund student internships. UCSC will host up to eight students annually during the summer of the grant project, with research that is student-initiated and student-driven, supported by Chabot College and UCSC collaborators, and followed by fall-semester analysis and conference preparation.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) solidifies this process and partnership between Chabot College Geology and Engineering ("Chabot") and The Regents of the University of California, on behalf of its Santa Cruz campus ("UCSC").

This MOU shall become effective on June 1, 2026 and remain in effect through August 31, 2027, unless terminated or modified by mutual written consent.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

The purpose of this Amended Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to establish a collaborative agreement for the 2026–2027 academic year to establish a partnership for the purpose of increasing the number of Black Indigenous People of Color (BIPOC) early educators in San Francisco. This agreement outlines the terms for student eligibility, enrollment processes, residency determination, and apportionment reporting in compliance with California Community College Chancellor’s Office guidelines. The MOU is intended to promote student access, enrollment continuity, and efficient use of district resources while supporting timely degree and certificate completion. The fiscal impact of this agreement is estimated at \$126,000. This MOU shall become effective upon the date of execution by both parties and shall continue through June 30, 2027.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION -**

On April 28, 2026, Chabot College convened a special meeting of the President's Council pursuant to Board Policy and Administrative Procedure 6620 to consider the future naming status of the campus space currently known as "Cesar Chavez Plaza." Consistent with the district's established naming and renaming process, the Council served as the representative committee contemplated under AP 6620, with participation from faculty, classified professionals, students, administration, and bargaining unit leadership.

The discussion was prompted by recent allegations involving Cesar Chavez that have surfaced in the media and are the subject of ongoing legal proceedings, raising concerns regarding the district's continued association with the current name. Chancellor Gerhard reviewed the provisions of AP 6620, including the authority to remove or rename a facility, ground, or space when continued association with a name may damage the district's reputation or goodwill in the community. The Chancellor also clarified that AP 6620 applies in this case: its definition of "donor" extends beyond financial contributors to any individual whose recognized contributions were of significant value to the college and community.

Following the discussion, a motion to remove the name was made and seconded. The voting members of the President's Council took a roll-call vote and unanimously approved the recommendation to remove the name "Cesar Chavez Plaza." In doing so, the Council emphasized the importance of preserving the original intent behind the name, recognition of the farmworker movement and Chabot College's Latinx community, and recommended that a replacement name be developed through a separate, constituency-driven process and returned to the Board of Trustees at a later date.
