

BP 4230 GRADING AND ACADEMIC RECORD SYMBOLS

Reference:

Title 5 Section 55023

Courses shall be graded using the grading system established by Title 5.

The grading system shall be published in college catalogs and made available to students.

NOTE: *The language in current CLPCCD Policies 5211, 5231, and 5232 is shown as struck as some of the language is not up-to-date (C/NC is now P/NP, Title 5 Section 55758 was repealed, etc.). Because of its detail, the language from these policies is reflected in new AP 4230 titled Grading and Academic Record Symbols.*

❖ **From the current CLPCCD Policy 5211 titled Academic Grade Point Average**

The Academic Grade Point Average is an index of the quality of a student's work.

To enable the calculation of grade point average, eligibility for honors and recognition, and other scholastic status, letter grades are converted to numerical form using the following grade point equivalents:

Grade	Meaning	Grade	Value
A	Excellent	4	grade points per unit
B	Above Average	3	grade points per unit
C	Average	2	grade points per unit
D	Barely Passing	1	grade point per unit
F	Failure	0	grade points — units attempted with no units earned
CR	Credit	0	grade points - units earned with no units attempted
NC	No Credit	0	grade points — no units earned and no units attempted
I	Incomplete	0	grade points — no units earned and no units attempted

IP ——— In Progress ——— 0 ——— grade points

The grade point average (G.P.A.) is calculated by dividing total grade points by total units attempted:

$$\text{G.P.A.} = \frac{\text{Total Grade Points}}{\text{Total Units Attempted}}$$

Example:

History 1 — 3 units x 3 grade points (B) = 9 grade points
Math 55 — 5 units x 2 grade points (C) = 10 grade points
P.E. 1 — ½ unit x 4 grade points (A) = 2 grade points

TOTAL: — 8½ units ——— 21 Total Grade Points

$$\text{G.P.A.} = \frac{21}{8.5} = 2.5 \text{ or C}$$

❖ From the current CLPCCD Policy 5231 titled Administrative Symbols "IP", "RD", "I", and "MW"

1. Administrative Symbol "IP" - Mastery Learning Courses

The Administrative symbol "IP" is established to indicate coursework "in progress." Its use is limited to mastery learning courses. It may be used only for a student who is making satisfactory progress toward the completion of a course but who has not completed all of the modules by the end of the semester or session.

The symbol "IP" is not a grade; therefore, it has no value in calculating unit credit, grade point average, or grade point balance. Only one symbol "IP" may be received by a student for any one mastery learning class; therefore, the class must be completed within two academic terms (semester or session).

2. Administrative Symbol "RD" - Report Delayed

The administrative symbol "RD" may be assigned by the Registrar only. It is to be used only when there is a delay in reporting the grade of a student due to circumstances beyond the control of the student. It is a temporary notation to be replaced by a permanent grade/symbol, as soon as possible.

"RD" shall not be used in calculating grade point averages.

3. Administrative Symbol "I" - Incomplete

Incomplete academic work for unforeseeable emergency and justifiable reasons at the end of the term may result in an "I" symbol being entered by the instructor

~~on the student's permanent record. The following documentation shall be maintained in writing by the Registrar:~~

- ~~a. The condition(s) stated by the instructor for removal of the "I."~~
- ~~b. The letter grade to be assigned when the stipulated work has been completed or the letter grade to be assigned if the work has not been completed within the designated time limit.~~

~~The "I" shall be made up by the end of the term or semester following the date it was granted. The student may petition to extend this deadline date because of extenuating circumstances, but it will require the approval of the Vice President of Student Services or designee, and the instructor of record.~~

~~The "I" symbol shall not be used in calculating units attempted nor for grade points.~~

4. ~~Administrative Symbol "MW" - Military Withdrawal~~

~~The Military Withdrawal ("MW") symbol is part of the Academic Record Symbols and Grade Point Average regulations to assist students who are members of an active or reserve military service, and who receive orders compelling withdrawal from courses. The "MW" symbol shall not be used in calculating units attempted for grade points or progress. There shall not be any charge for Military Withdrawal, and a full refund of enrollment fees shall be made for all class(es) from which the student must withdraw.~~

❖ From the current CLPCCD Policy 5232 titled Military Withdrawal

NOTE: Title 5 Section 55758 was repealed.

~~Pursuant to Section 55758 of Title 5, Part VI of the California Code of Regulations - Academic Record Symbols and Grade Point Average, Chabot-Las Positas College students' academic records shall be expanded to include the symbol "MW" - Military Withdrawal.~~

NOTE: The first sentence is duplicative of item #4 in Policy 5231.

~~The "MW" shall be assigned only for students who are members of an active or reserve military service, and who receive orders compelling a withdrawal from courses. Upon verification of such orders, this symbol shall be assigned at any time after the No Grade Of Record (NGR) period - end of second week of classes.~~

~~The "MW" shall not be counted in progress probation and dismissal calculations.~~

~~"W's" incurred during the period of January 2, 1991 and April 1, 1991 which meet the criteria of "MW" shall be changed from "W" to "MW."~~

~~Upon petition of a student who receives an order compelling a withdrawal from courses, the District shall refund the entire enrollment fee unless academic credit is awarded.~~

NOTE: The **red ink** signifies language that is **legally required** and recommended by the Policy and Procedure Service and its legal counsel. The language in **black ink** is from the current Chabot-Las Positas CCD Policy 5211 titled Academic Grade Point Average adopted on March 19, 1996, current Chabot-Las Positas CCD Policy 5231 titled Administrative Symbols "IP", "RD", "I", and "MW" adopted on March 19, 1996, and current Chabot-Las Positas CCD Policy 5232 titled Military Withdrawal adopted on March 19, 1996. § 55023. Academic Record Symbols and Grade Point Average.

(a) Except as provided in subdivisions (b) and (c), grades from a grading system shall be averaged on the basis of the point equivalencies to determine a student's grade point average using only the following evaluative symbols:

Symbol..Definition	Grade Point
A.....Excellent	4
B.....Good	3
C.....Satisfactory	2
D.....Less than satisfactory	1
F.....Failing	0
P.....Passing (At least satisfactory - units awarded not counted in GPA. Has the same meaning as "CR" as that symbol was defined prior to June 30, 2007.)	

NP.....No Pass (Less than satisfactory, or failing - units not counted in GPA. NP has the same meaning as "NC" as that symbol was defined prior to June 30, 2007.)

(b) The governing board of a community college district may use "plus" and "minus" designations in combination with letter grades, except that the grade of C minus shall not be used. If pluses and minuses are used, the grade point value of a plus shall be computed by adding 0.3 to the value assigned to the letter grade with which it is combined, and the grade point value of a minus shall be computed by subtracting 0.3 from the value assigned to the letter grade with which it is combined, except that no grade point value shall be less than 0 or greater than 4.0.

(c) Regardless of whether the governing board elects to use plus and minus grading, it may provide for the use of the "FW" grade symbol to indicate that a student has both ceased participating in a course some time after the last day to officially withdraw from the course without having achieved a final passing grade, and that the student has not received district authorization to withdraw from the course under extenuating circumstances. The "FW" symbol may not be used if a student has qualified for and been granted military withdrawal. If "FW" is used, its grade point value shall be zero (0).

(d) The governing board of each community college district shall publish the point equivalencies for the grades used in subdivision (a), or, subdivisions (a) and (b) (if pluses and minuses are used) in the catalog or catalogs of each college in the district as a part of

its grading policies. In the event the governing board chooses to use the "FW" described in subdivision (c), it shall be included in the grading system and point equivalencies published in the catalog.

(e) The governing board of each community college district may authorize the use, under controls and conditions specified below, of only the following nonevaluative symbols:

Symbol..Definition

Incomplete: Incomplete academic work for unforeseeable, emergency and justifiable reasons at the end of the term may result in an "I" symbol being entered in the student's record. The condition for the removal of the "I" shall be stated by the instructor in a written record. This record shall contain the conditions for the removal of the "I" and the grade assigned in lieu of its removal.

This record must be given to the student with a copy on file with the registrar until the "I" is made up or the time limit has passed. A final grade shall be assigned when the work stipulated has been completed and evaluated, or when the time limit for completing the work has passed. The "I" may be made up no later than one year following the end of the term in which it was assigned. The "I" symbol shall not be used in calculating units attempted nor for grade points. The governing board shall provide a process whereby a student may petition for a time extension due to unusual circumstances.

IP.....In Progress: The "IP" symbol shall be used only in those course which extend beyond the normal end of an academic term. It indicates that work is "in progress," but that assignment of an evaluative symbol (grade) must await its completion.

The "IP" symbol shall remain on the student's permanent record in order to satisfy enrollment documentation.

The appropriate evaluative symbol (grade) and unit credit shall be assigned and appear on the student's permanent record for the term in which the course is completed. The "IP" shall not be used in calculating grade point averages. If a student enrolled in an "open-entry, open-exit" course is assigned an "IP" at the end of a term and does not re-enroll in that course during the subsequent term, the appropriate faculty will assign an evaluative symbol (grade) in accordance with subdivision (a) or (a) and (b) if plus and minus grading is used) to be recorded on the student's permanent record for the course.

RD.....Report Delayed: The "RD" symbol may be assigned by the registrar only. It is to be used when there is a delay in reporting the grade of a student due to circumstances beyond the control of the student. It is a temporary notation to be replaced by a permanent symbol as soon as possible. "RD" shall not be used in calculating grade point averages.

W.....Withdrawal: The "W" symbol may be used to denote withdrawal in accordance with the requirements of section 55024.

MW.....Military Withdrawal: The "MW" symbol may be used to denote military withdrawal in accordance with section 55024.

(f) In calculating students' degree-applicable grade point averages, grades earned in nondegree-applicable credit courses shall not be included.
