SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update

County Health Update: Alameda County has reported 80,873 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 417,330 doses of vaccine administered (last updated March 3, 2021).

<u>Our county remains in the purple or 1st tier status</u>. For comparison purposes, Napa, Santa Clara, San Mateo and San Francisco counties have all moved to the red tier. Our case numbers need to continue trending down before we are able to move to the red tier.

Our county's updated figures are:

- Adjusted number of new COVID-19 cases reported per day, per 100,000 residents. Most recently, Alameda County has reported **6.3** adjusted cases per day, per 100,000 residents.
- Overall test positivity rate. This percentage represents the number of COVID-19 tests that resulted in a positive test result. Most recently, Alameda County has reported a test positivity rate of 2.4%.
- Lowest Healthy Places Index (HPI) test positivity rate. This percentage rate is a measure of different indicators that reflect geographic socioeconomic disadvantage. Most recently, Alameda County has reported a HPI test positivity rate of 3.7%.

Using the state's model below, these numbers would place our county in Tier 2, or in red. Should these figures remain constant this next week, or even improve, it is probable that the county will make this determination next Tuesday.
