SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update

County Health Update: Alameda County has reported 81,658 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 498,227 doses of vaccine administered (last updated March 11, 2021). These figures represent an increase of 785 cases compared to last week as well as an increase of 80,897 doses of vaccine over the last week. It is also important to note a significant milestone reached last week. Last week was the first time that the number of second doses administered, 140,235, exceeded the number of COVID-19 cases reported in Alameda County.

Effective Wednesday, March 10th, Alameda County is in tier 2, or Red. This is an improvement compared to last week when the county was in tier 1, or Purple.

Our county's updated figures are:

- Adjusted number of new COVID-19 cases reported per day, per 100,000 residents. Most recently, Alameda County has reported **4.8** adjusted cases per day, per 100,000 residents.
- Overall test positivity rate. This percentage represents the number of COVID-19 tests that resulted in a positive test result. Most recently, Alameda County has reported a test positivity rate of **1.8**%.
- Lowest Healthy Places Index (HPI) test positivity rate. This percentage rate is a measure of different indicators that reflect geographic socioeconomic disadvantage. Most recently, Alameda County has reported a HPI test positivity rate of **2.6**%.
