SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update

County Health Update: Alameda County has reported 83,298 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 821,866 doses of vaccine administered (last updated April 1, 2021). These figures represent an increase of 448 cases compared to last week as well as an increase of 138,947 doses of vaccine over the last week.

Effective March 31, 2021, Alameda County entered into Tier 3 status or Orange. In this status, most indoor lectures and student gatherings must be limited to 50% of room capacity or 200 people, whichever is less.

Our county's updated figures are:

- Adjusted number of new COVID-19 cases reported per day, per 100,000 residents. Most recently, Alameda County has reported **2.6** adjusted cases per day, per 100,000 residents.
- Overall test positivity rate. This percentage represents the number of COVID-19 tests that resulted in a positive test result. Most recently, Alameda County has reported a test positivity rate of **1.1%**.
- Lowest Healthy Places Index (HPI) test positivity rate. This percentage rate is a measure of different indicators that reflect geographic socioeconomic disadvantage. Most recently, Alameda County has reported a HPI test positivity rate of **1.9%**.
