



Student/Employee Protocol for COVID-19 Reporting and Return

	<p>Quarantine and Isolation Requirements:</p> <p>Under certain conditions, the time recommended by CDC and CDPH for quarantine has been reduced to 0-5 days.</p>

<p>Information needed for completion of Case Response Form:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Individual name and contact information (phone/email) 2) Date of onset of symptoms/positive test or close contact 3) Last date individual was on campus for in-person activities 4) Individuals' vaccination status (primary/boosted/unvaccinated) 	<p>Test positive for COVID-19 (Isolation)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regardless of vaccination status 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay home and test ASAP • Self-Isolate until result is known, and if test is positive, continue to isolate and contact your medical provider for advice or treatment. • Notify dean/supervisor 	<p>AB685 COVID-19 Outbreak: A COVID-19 outbreak is defined as at least three COVID-19 cases among workers at the same worksite/building within a 14-day period.</p> <p>Fully Vaccinated and Boosted: Individuals are considered in this category when they have received the primary series of any WHO approved vaccine series and are 14-days beyond the primary series and have received a recommended booster shot (6 months after for Moderna or Pfizer, and 2 months after J&J) A person is considered boosted and up-to-date right after getting their booster dose.</p>
<p>Symptoms of COVID-19 include: cough, fever, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.</p>	<p>Have a Close Contact to Someone with COVID-19 AND</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Are fully vaccinated, including "BOOSTER" if eligible 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No Quarantine • Test on day 5 (if positive follow isolation instructions) • Mask around others for 10 days • If symptoms develop at any time, stay home, self-isolate, test, and reach out to dean/supervisor 	<p>Vaccinated and Booster Eligible but not yet Boosted: Individuals are considered in this category when they have received the primary series of any WHO approved vaccine and are 5 months beyond the Pfizer or Moderna and 2 months beyond the J&J vaccine but HAVE NOT received a booster dose.</p>
<p>Quarantine: Separates and restricts the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick.</p>	<p>Have a Close Contact to Someone with COVID-19 (Quarantine) AND</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have primary vaccination(s) and are eligible for but do not have a "BOOSTER" 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quarantine for 3-5 days and test no earlier than day 3 (if positive follow isolation instructions) • Return as soon as test result is available and negative • Mask around others for 10 days • If symptoms develop at any time, stay home, self-isolate, test, and reach out to dean/supervisor 	<p>Vaccinated but not yet Booster Eligible: Individuals are considered in this category when they have received the primary series of any WHO approved vaccine and are not yet 5 months beyond the Pfizer or Moderna and 2 months beyond the J&J vaccine primary series.</p>
<p>Isolation: Separates sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick.</p>	<p>Have a Close Contact to Someone with COVID-19 (Quarantine) AND</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Are unvaccinated OR less than 14 days after primary vaccination series OR recovered from COVID-19 within 90 days and unvaccinated 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quarantine for 5 days and test no earlier than Day 5 (if positive follow isolation instructions) • Return on Day 6 if test result is available and negative • Mask around others for 10 days • If symptoms develop at any time, stay home, self-isolate, test, and reach out to dean/supervisor 	<p>Infectious Period: for an individual who develop symptoms. The infectious period ends when the following criteria are met: 10 days have passed since the symptoms first appeared, AND at least 24-hours have passed with no fever, AND other symptoms have improved.</p>
